RESPONDING TO GOD'S WORD

†AFFIRMATION OF FAITH - The Nicene Creed

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father; through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven, was incarnate of the Holy Spirit and Virgin Mary and became truly human. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death, and was buried. WORSHIP NOTES

WE WELCOME FRIENDS AND VISITORS. This church is for anyone who wants to be counted as a disciple of Jesus Christ, and who wants to be included in its worship and work. Thank you for signing your name and address on the attendance sheet.

WE WARMLY WELCOME CHILDREN as a vital part of our worshiping community! We understand that every family is different, and we strive to support each one in the way that fits them best. Children are always welcome to remain in the sanctuary during worship, and we offer worship bags and children's Bibles to help engage them in meaningful ways. Worship Center, a Montessori-based approach to worship, is available for 4-year-olds -1st graders following the Time with Children. Childcare is offered in the CE building when needed. In addition, a comfort room is located on the same floor as the sanctuary, equipped with a speaker so you can listen to the service while caring for your child.

CONFESSIONAL BANNERS visually represent key theological statements from the Book of Confessions, a foundational document of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.). Each banner symbolizes a specific confession, capturing its historical context and theological themes through color, imagery, and design. This morning's banner for the Nicene Creed features a green triangle and three symbols with it – as a sign of the doctrine of the Trinity, a hand reaching down – representing God, the Father, the Chi Rho Monogram – the first two letters of the Greek word for Christ, the dove – a symbol for the Holy Spirit, and crowns – for the rule and glory of God. The Nicene Creed was created by an ecumenical council called together by Emperor Constantine, the first Christian emperor. The cross/sword represent Constantine and the doctrine of Christ because Christ is central in the Creed. Each week we will highlight a different banner and theological statement.


