WE WELCOME Rev. Dr. Gayle Hansen Browne to our worship today! Dr. Browne is a spiritual director, writer, conference speaker, and Episcopal priest with a Doctor of Theology degree (ThD) from Kairos University, Northwind Theological Seminary. Her M.A. in Theology is from the Episcopal School of Theology, University of the South. She has served Episcopal churches in both the Diocese of East Tennessee and the Diocese of Southern Ohio, as rector, vicar, and sometimes priest associate. Dr. Browne has recently authored *Wild Geese Rising: Living Prayer as Moment-by-Moment Contemplative Action.* She grew up in Shreveport, where she graduated from St. Vincent's Academy, and currently lives in Knoxville, Tennessee. Having retired from active clergy status in 2016, Dr. Browne currently serves part-time as Priest Associate for Liturgy at St. Luke's Episcopal Church, an historically black church in inner-city Knoxville.
