FY 19-20 HIGHLIGHTS



- We convened a sold-out CHANGEMAKERS Conference in October 2019, our 19th such event, with Dan Pallotta as our keynote speaker. He was so popular that we brought him back in the fall of 2020 to conduct three virtual online events with more than 300 participants.
- We hired a full-time CEO, Ann Coffey (who had been serving as Interim CEO) and added a Senior Director of Strategic Communications and Marketing, Garrison Cox.
- Once the pandemic hit in March 2020, we pivoted quickly to move all our trainings online. We had more than 2,000 people participate in 26 webinars, many of them free.
- We provided free online resources to help nonprofits secure Payroll Protection Program funding.



FY 19-20 HIGHLIGHTS



- We adopted a new strategic plan that will guide our growth and efforts in the coming years.
- We partnered with MindEdge Learning, LLC, founded in 1998 by Harvard and MIT educators, so we can offer more than 100 highquality, fee-paid, self-paced online professional development courses.
- In the fall of 2020, we launched an ambitious Community Activation Network (CAN), which aspires to be a network of people and organizations whose goal is to create and nurture a thriving nonprofit / social impact ecosystem marked by inclusion, co-creation, and interdependence.
- We launched a Facebook Groups page, Nonprofit Community Connection Facebook Group, to let nonprofits in Greater Louisville and Southern Indiana share questions and successes.



FY 19-20 HIGHLIGHTS



- We have elevated our support of and commitment to diversity, equity, and inclusion (DE&I). We are working with an outside consultant on a three-year plan including organizational assessment and DE&I training for the board and staff.
- We laid the foundation to launch a new Nonprofit Leaders Advancing Racial Equity program for CEOs from local nonprofits.
- We partnered with nonprofit consultants Ashley | Rountree to launch the CNPE School of Fundraising and Engagement, which will begin operating in early 2021.



CONSULTING FOR FY 2019–2020

CNPE Consulting Services provides consulting services primarily in the areas of board governance, strategic planning, organizational development, revenue generation and fundraising, and day-to-day operational functions.

The services it provides include meeting and retreat planning and facilitation, organizational and board assessments, and informational presentations as well as multi-meeting, multi-faceted, extended engagements.

In FY 2019-2020, Consulting Services provided services to 35 organizations, including assisting 11 organizations with strategic planning and another dozen with board governance assistance.

It also provided free consulting to some 40 organizations on a range of topics. In addition, Consulting Services assisted, free of charge, 13 EDs and CEOs as they navigated the challenges of the COVID-19 pandemic.
