First Christian Church Board Meeting February 11, 2024

John Scovill called the meeting to order and opened with prayer. The minutes of the January 2024 board meeting were reviewed. John called for a motion to approve the minutes. Traci Ridge made the motion, Matt Powe seconded, and the motion carried.

Traci reviewed the January 2024 financial reports. We had total receipts of \$14,139.81, including \$83.81 in interest. The checking account at Community National Bank has a balance of \$85,184.97, and the CD has a balance of \$50,000.00. The Edward Jones investment account has a balance of \$35,389.01, and the building maintenance account has a balance of \$12,104.99. We have total assets of \$182,678.97. John called for a motion to approve the financial report. Sherrie Riebel made the motion, Skylar Starke seconded, and the motion carried.

John then called for committee reports.

Heather Mentzer, worship committee, asked if the church would again act as a drop off location for Operation Shoebox. This was approved unanimously.

Skylar Starke, membership committee, had nothing new to report.

Denise Mentzer, memorial committee, asked about the concrete sidewalk from the building to the pavilion. Joe Riebel will check with Otis Babcock about contacting someone to do this.

Donna Kaehr, Christian education committee, had nothing new to report.

Helen Uitts, church school super, reported that we had average attendance in January 2024 of 31 for Sunday school and 79 for worship services.

Dave Donovan and Bill Hobbs, property & facilities committee, reported that the leak in the mechanical room has been fixed for the moment. There is a pipe that was installed vertically that should have been installed horizontally during construction of the building, according to Jim Valentine who came out to do the repair. It was suggested that we find out how much it would cost to reinstall the pipe in question correctly. Bill also reported that the kitchen drawer has been repaired. It was reported that a baseboard has come off in the kitchen, so Bill will take a look at it.

Judy McGraw, church clerk, had no changes in church membership to report.

#### **Unfinished Business:**

John Scovill said that replacing the church secretary's computer is on hold for the moment. He is waiting on information about the various programs currently installed on the existing computer to determine the specs for the replacement computer.

Pastor Kenyon reported that the new playground equipment was purchased and has been delivered. We are just waiting on the weather to improve before starting to take out the old equipment and set up the new equipment.

Pastor Kenyon also reported that the installation of the spray insulation at the parsonage has been postponed due to cracks in the foundation drawing moisture. The cracks will have to be sealed first, as the spray installation will not stick unless the foundation walls are dry.

#### New Business:

Pastor Kenyon reported that the downstairs toilet in the parsonage developed a leak. It has been replaced with a new toilet. In the meantime, the City of Iola utility office called inquiring about a possible leak, as they noticed a huge increase in the water usage which would amount to about a \$1,700.00 water bill. Craig Mentzer made a motion to approve paying the expenses for the new toilet and the increased water bill. Helen seconded the motion, and the motion carried. Pastor asked Traci to contact the city to find out how much we owed on the water bill, so we could get that paid.

Matt reported that the double entry doors on the west side were still having issues. There was some discussion on possible solutions.

Betty Cunningham brought to the board's attention that the piano in the sanctuary has some issues that are becoming more problematic and will only worsen with time. She said that Dr. Jeffery Anderson came recommended by the gentleman who tunes the piano as someone who was qualified to make the necessary repairs. He is available for approximately two weeks in March. The estimated cost of the repairs is \$1,500.00. Traci made a motion to have the repairs made, Donna K. seconded, and the motion carried.

Pastor Kenyon reported that the church secretary, Tricia Goebel, lost her other job and was requesting to work more hours at the church. He recommended a maximum of 20 hours per week. There was some discussion by various members present that at least three fourths of that time be spent in the office during normal business hours throughout the work week. Pastor Kenyon will speak with Tricia and a schedule will be determined.

There being no other new business to discuss, John called for a motion to adjourn the meeting. Helen made the motion, and Skylar seconded. Pastor Kenyon led the closing prayer, and the meeting was adjourned.
