Stage to Impress; Creamy Pumpkin Simple Tips to Pasta

Ingredients:

1 lb. penne pasta

1 Tbsp. olive oil

3-4 minced sage leaves

3-4 minced garlic cloves

15 oz. pumpkin puree

½ tsp. salt

½ tsp. black pepper

1/8 tsp. ground nutmeg

½ c. whole milk

Grated parmesan and/or

crème fraiche (optional)

Cook the penne pasta in salted water according to the package's instructions. Reserve one cup of the pasta water; drain the rest and set pasta aside. In a large skillet over medium heat, warm the olive oil and add garlic and sage. Cook for approximately one minute. Add the pumpkin puree, salt, pepper, and nutmeg, then continue cooking for two to three more minutes. Add the milk and stir until creamy. Toss the pasta with the sauce and add ½ cup of the reserved pasta water. Continue adding water while stirring until the sauce is glossy and clings to the pasta. Sprinkle with grated Parmesan cheese and/or a dollop of crème fraiche and enjoy!
