Gaetz Outreach

Request received from Neall Stevens:

he Outreach Committee received a request from Neall Stevens to provide \$5,000 from the Harold Perry Fund to a home for orphan children in Africa run by a woman named Evelyn Makasi. There is no formal society or organization. Over the last few years the Outreach Committee has recommended the distribution of funds from the Harold Perry fund to both

local and international organizations, but in each case there was a recognized society, charitable or non-profit organization with transparent methods of communicating the use of funds received. Although the Outreach Committee recognizes the need to support organizations that provide aid to those in need, including orphans and those living in poverty. However, we are hesitant to recommend the distribution of funds to an individual and would appreciate the Board clarifying whether this would be appropriate within the context of Church policies.

If the Board approves the distribution of funds to an individual for the purpose of providing support to those in need, the Committee is requesting a special one-time donation from the Harold Perry fund in the amount of \$5,000 to be distributed to Evelyn Makasi. The Committee will work with Neall to get more specific information as to how the transfer of funds would be accomplished.

Background information received from Neal Stevens:

Due to my health care background and desire to do some volunteer work in a foreign country, my wife and I went to South Africa to check out possibilities in relation to the HIV/AIDS crisis, and South Africa having the biggest problem. We returned to South Africa in 2009 where I spent a month working with an organization providing a full range of services to individuals with HIV/AIDS.. Subsequent visits were made with the last one being in 2012 at which time I encountered Evelyn and her home of safety for children. She had begun as a result of taking care of her grandchildren and realized the need due to deaths as a result of HIV/AIDS and other issues.

At that time she was funded for 12 children by the government and had about 30 in her care. I saw three or four sea cans that had been converted into accommodation and divided into rooms. In the equivalent of an average sized bedroom in Canada, I saw three bunk beds (each one being 3 levels) and in another with cribs for small children there would be 8 cribs.

Despite this the children were all happy, clean and obviously well cared for. So I felt there was a need to provide further assistance and some additional living space. I talked to Beverley Biggs and she volunteered to work with me to try and raise funds. Evelin had found a prefab building that a lab wanted removed that could be dismantled and moved to her location and rebuilt for the equivalent of \$ 7000.00 canadian. Through donations from people in the church and, I believe it was \$ 1,000.00 from the Harold Perry World Outreach fund the necessary funds were available. (pictures attached).

When the building was finished Evelyn asked the children what they should call it and the response was Canada Rooms, because the funds had come from Canada. Evelyn has always advised people that Gaetz United Church in Red Deer Alberta had funded the rooms.

Over the years I have chosen to go without a tax receipt and send funds raised from the sale of my handmade lace directly to Evelyn and always receive a detailed list of how the funds were spent. I think, as a result of my encouragement Evelyn made contacts with a person in Rotary who would bring visitors to Cape Town to her safe home and this resulted in funding from people in Switzerland, Germany etc..I received an email from Evelyn indicating that the Canada Rooms needed some repairs and she was getting some help from people in and wondered if I could help. I looked at what had not been funded at that time and determine it would be about \$ 5000'00 and when I heard Leila's service and the idea of doing something from people in Africa, I forwarded a copy of the email from Evelyn to her thinking this would be a possible opportunity to walk the walk and not just talk the talk. I could forward a copy to you if desired.

I could go on for pages about the wonderful work being done by Evelyn and how the local social services and police rely on her when they encounter a child in need but I won't. However, I would be willing to talk to the committee if desired.

CWR Regional Rep's Report

CWR Annual Meeting was held in May . Myself, Rhondda Gower, Roxanne Williams and Rev. Leila Currie represented Gaetz Memorial United Church.

THEME: Flourishing Where Living Water Flows. In an ever-changing world, uncertainty can be a constant. rustration and fear dominate, leaving many focused solely on immediate survival. But what if we dared to look up, dream bigger, and imagine a different future?

A few notes of the many words that were shared in the 4 days of this event. . .

Signs of Flourishing:

- Taking on water & sinking. Finally realizing we have to start bailing.
 - Intentional about 1st 3rd Ministry
 - Intentional where and how we are prioritizing and supporting CoF's that are willing to embrace local mission and denominational presence
 - Intentional work that needs to happen ... will have a chance to have our best days ahead of us.
- Our denomination ... the gift of the past few decades of our 'humbling as a Church' = that we've looked at our shadow and better understand where we have gone wrong and willing to and engaged with repenting and = in the very best place a Church could be in the world today.
- A way to be Christian that is health giving to the world.
- Clusters meeting and generating collaborative action.
- Number of younger clergy and younger people in our presence!
- People on a panel considering Ministry.
- Thank you to volunteers and staff for the great work the Region is doing.

What about where something is preventing flourishing?:

- Asking what's wrong with us is unproductive, especially when it leads to shaming ourselves. Instead asking what is right with us and appreciating and developing that.
- Aging of our congregations and lack of cognitive robustness to do the kind of thinking that's needed.
- We aren't 100% sure of the priorities for getting on the lifeboats. How we are going to actualize the resources we have (limited). Conversations are taken seriously... don't yet trust how folks are going to access and need to trust and pray that God will reveal.
- Effective Leadership a lot of retirements and lack of clergy.

Talking about our lives and where we are going... How do we measure success?

- Continue to use markers that were made for the post-baby boom Church. Old markers of success are not helpful for flourishing... they put us in the shame spiral. Where are the areas we are flourishing? Do we love and take care of one another? Are we there for each other when we need? Good relationships? Good relationships with organizations in your community? In many communities... only left of Centre voice theologically. Do we know how important that is in smaller communities ... where young people can know "maybe that United Church might accept me as I am. Need to change our standards of measurements so we can celebrate our good work.
- Knowing and growing our strengths in our own context.
- Open the door to our community with our gift of openness. Honour who we are and where God has got us to! Service to community and beyond the walls of our buildings. Our Heart and our Core we are an evangelical Church. WE are called to share the good news of the Gospel... that is expansive and true to all people... no matter how they identify, who they love, or where they are from. All means all. No one is outside.
- Signs of what God is doing among you.
- It really matters what someone experiences when they are in the midst of your community.
 - How many affirming ministries in CWR? = 20/85 Ministries

- How many affirming ministries in the United Church of Canada? = 370 = 12%
- Social Justice persona or reputation... any in my area? = about 1/3 of the time... an affirming ministry within 15 minutes. Other 88%... = no idea what their experience is going to be like.
- o Challenge and invitation... if someone was in your community was asking is there a safe place for me to go? Stamp of affirming says so much. Our community commits to being...
- Thank you for your support and for affirming that this work matters.

May our strangely warmed hearts....continue to take these principles of good news matter to the World. 100 years ago – what could have gotten in the way and it didn't. Aware of our roadblocks but not letting them

get in the way of our next 100 years.

We face big challenges ... and have faced big challenges through all the difficulties of the past.

May the grace and Love of God move us into our flourishing future.

When you've been a builder... as many of you are = you have a lot on your shoulders. You want that legacy to last. We built the Church... It is the Church of Jesus Christ. God builds the Church. We are the Church of Jesus Christ. ... will not fail.

TOWARD 2035 = work to give us all something to aim for. If you look at the rock on the mountain bike trail... you hit the rock. A path forward where we can look beyond the barriers and obstacles and We need something to look for about the future that we want, the future that we would be bold enough to name as that which God may be calling us to.

Faithful, adaptive and spirit led... assuring we are around for a long time to come.

What kind of Church do we want to be in 2035... Guide our own strategic discussions.

How shall the United Church respond to this moment where we find ourselves? We need something that gives us PRODUCTIVE HOPE.

The United Church continues to be called to faithful witness to the God of abundant Love, the Christ risen amon us, and the lively Spirit who works in us and others.

AND the context that there are significantly fewer people worshiping in, volunteering in, giving to and participating in United Church Ministries at every level. In many board meetings all across the Church there is anxiety, exhaustion, fear, uncertainty about what the future will bring. Our national picture (through data submitted annually) is indeed sobering.

NOT: the past was better and we are trying to regain what was... = SEEKING TO LIVE DEEPLY INTO THE CALL OF THE UNITED CHURCH... deep burning within us to live and embody the Gospel in our places. A recharting. Inspired, Resilient Communities of Disciples.
