Pastor's Message

Parish Announcements

29th Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year C 2025

"We all experience moments of fatigue and discouragement, especially when our prayer seems ineffective. But Jesus assures us: unlike the dishonest judge, God quickly hears His children, though this does not mean He does so in the time and way we would like. Prayer is not a magic wand. It helps us to maintain our faith in God, to entrust ourselves to Him even when we do not understand His will," said Pope Francis during a general audience in 2016.

To understand today's Gospel and the words of Pope Francis, we must return to the beginning of the story that Jesus shared with his apostles. In the story told by Jesus, we have two people: a judge who fears neither God nor man, and a widow, a helpless woman destined for continuous defeat.

Who is the judge? In his actions, he is unjust, insensitive, and wicked. The judge is God, although it is difficult to understand. It is God the Father, whom we often consider unjust because we do not receive what we want, or because the things we ask for come too late. In our daily lives, we are tempted to accuse God of our failures, unsuccessful ideas, and difficult life events. We then see God as an unjust judge. But Jesus says, "My Father will give you everything you ask for, but ask with faith." Faith is the key to true prayer. The other person in today's pericope is the widow. Despite the reputation of the judge, she comes to him. She asks for help: "Defend me!" The widow is a picture of the Church, a community of people who pray and seek a deeper relationship with God. "Seek first the Kingdom of God," Jesus said. In his call, he wants to tell us that prayer is the most important reality in a person's life. To pray is to breathe God and to remain in His presence. To pray is to gaze upon the face of God, contemplating His Love for all creation. To pray is to completely surrender our lives to God, so that we may want what God wants and not want what God does not want. A teacher gathered his students and asked, "Where does prayer begin?" The first student answered, "From a need." The second, "From great joy. When I rejoice, my soul flees from the cramped shell of my fears and worries and soars high to God." The third declared, "From silence. When everything within me becomes silent, then God can speak." The teacher concluded, "You have all answered correctly. But remember, prayer begins with God Himself. He starts it, not us" (Bruno Ferrero).


Welcome
