Pastor's Message

XXXIII Ordinary Sunday 2025

Today's readings refer to the future. We are curious about what lies ahead of us, what our life will be like, what will happen in a few days, months, or years. What can I count on, what can I expect? Curiosity and uncertainty lie ahead of us. Because on the one hand we want to know and hope for good news, and on the other we feel fear and paralysis, because this future before us may have tragic consequences. Today Jesus invites us to a place from which the temple can be seen, he invites us to reflect and to read and understand the truth about the world and about man. Jesus stands before the Temple. His disciples marvel at its splendor. This temple, once destroyed by the Babylonian army and rebuilt after the return from exile, was enlarged and beautified by Herod the Great. It is the only temple of the true God and it is beautiful. The picturesque image of the temple is interrupted by Jesus, who tells his disciples that it will ultimately be destroyed. Nothing will remain of it. Such a terrifying prophecy worried the listeners. They wanted to know the signs of the beginning of such a misfortune. Jesus, however, changes the course of his speech. He says that the signs that will appear will become food for false prophets and false messiahs who will announce the tragic end. Jesus was not wrong about the temple of Jerusalem; in 70 AD, it was destroyed and burned by the Roman army of Titus, not a stone left upon a stone. This news delivered by Jesus is shocking and contradicts everything the Jews believed in. This temple is a sign of the unity of God's people throughout history — generations came and went, yet they still worshipped God in the same temple.

In this fragment, the Lord Jesus also speaks about another temple, which is you and I — if we are baptized and if we care about having God's life within us. Jesus said, "not a hair of your head will perish." Now let's compare this last promise, that not a hair of your head will perish, with His prediction that during persecution "some of you they will put to death." How to understand these words? What was Jesus thinking when he said them?

The answer is simple: Let's hold on tightly to our Savior. Then nothing essentially bad will happen to us, even if we were to die. The temple that we are, thanks to the grace of our Savior, is eternal after all and not subject to death.
