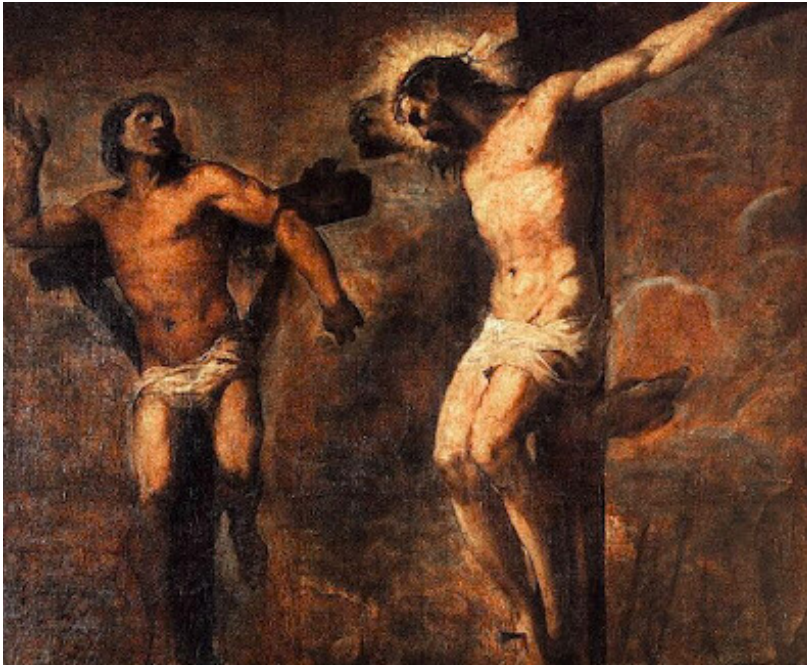

Solemnity of Christ the King 2025

"When they crucified Jesus, the people stood watching. And the members of the Sanhedrin scoffed..."

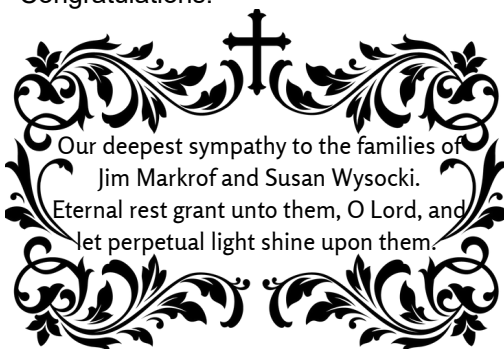
What does everyday life teach us? What models are presented to us, what values are used by today's world, and thus today's kingdoms on earth? What really is kingship, and what does it mean to be in the Kingdom of God? Are there differences between these kingdoms? Yes, there are. Today we encounter emphasis on the self: take all you can, look after yourself, it doesn't matter what others think, you should be well off and benefit from everything! Furthermore, the kingdom of the world says, it doesn't matter if he's guilty or not, the most important thing is to criticize, judge, pass sentence; after all, it's important for you, you will feel better, and the accused is someone else's problem, don't worry about it. Wayne Dyer [Note: this might be the intended name instead of "Wayne Jesses"] suggests only you matter. And what do we hear about the truth today? Truth – we remember Jesus' conversation with Pontius Pilate – what is truth? In fact, is this truth present in the world today, and if so, to what extent is it truth, a grey area, or even darkness? It is worth reflecting today on this topic: where is my kingdom, how am I building it, do I want to be in it? The Kingdom of God is very different from the kingdom of this world (where much evil, violence, lack of authorities, disregard, lack of consequences, and inauthentic love, etc. dominate). What were the Jews expecting, whom were they waiting for, who was their King supposed to be? They expected someone who would perfectly observe the provisions of the law, who would act and think just like them. A political king who would free them from the Roman occupation and reign over Israel forever. What surprise must have seized Jesus' disciples when Jesus had the opportunity to call for a fight for freedom, for liberation from the Roman occupation, but he did not do so.

Instead, he allowed himself to be nailed to the cross. Jesus understands the word Kingdom and kingship differently? The disciples had problems understanding this, and we today also have similar problems. Kingship is associated with prestige, power, splendor. Jesus showed that "to reign" means something completely different. And he showed this in the Upper Room, when he knelt before the disciples and washed their feet. Then came Calvary and death on the cross. Here he fulfilled the will of the Father, but above all, he showed us what it means to reign – it means to love to the end. He did it for me. Each Eucharist is an encounter with Jesus – the King, who asks a simple question: "Do you love Me – Jesus?" I came to serve you, to embrace you with My love and lead you to the Father's house, where you will be happy for eternity. It is worth asking ourselves today if Jesus is my king? Do I want a king who suffered but loved to the end and who triumphed through the resurrection? Does he meet my criteria and expectations, because the most important thing for Him is to love and serve.

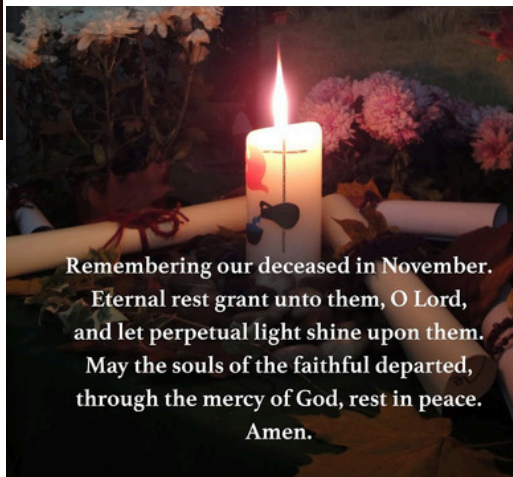
