Pastor's Message



Parish Announcements

Holy Family Sunday 2025

Today's liturgy presents us with the Holy Family: Jesus, Mary, and Joseph. In the Gospel, we observe two fragments from the account of Jesus' childhood according to Saint Matthew: the flight to Egypt—when Herod decided to find the newborn King of Israel and kill Him—and the Holy Family's return to the land of Israel, to Mary's town, Nazareth. In this passage, St. Matthew shows us both the drama unfolding over Jesus' life and the reality of everyday existence and duties. Everything is fulfilled according to the prophecies announced centuries ago. Egypt, by contrast, becomes a place of refuge and life for the Messiah. From there, as we hear, God calls Him to return to the land of Israel. This calling is meant to lead to the redemption of the chosen people, as well as the pagan world.

Let us look at the situation the Holy Family found themselves in. "Go to Egypt," Joseph heard, "protect the child and His mother." What would you do now if God told you: "Tonight you must leave for Europe with your family to save them"? Or perhaps a family is too much—what would you do if God asked you this individually? Would you leave your own home, your homeland? Surely, such a decision and an actual departure would face great difficulties.

The question arises: does this Gospel fragment still say something to me? I ask because our lives are secured by so many things that it would be difficult to make such an immediate decision. The message conveyed in today's Gospel is difficult but also very simple: are you able to trust God and place your life and your family's life in His hands? Regardless of what dark clouds are gathering over you, your family, or your marriage?

From the beginning, nothing seemed to go smoothly: Mary is with child, and Joseph intends to dismiss her. They must go to Bethlehem to be enrolled—Mary is about to give birth. There is no room in Bethlehem. They go to a nearby cave. Herod is hunting for Jesus' life. In the middle of the night, they must set off for Egypt. This is a constant starting from scratch. However, we can look at it differently: it is a constant starting... from God.

Let us reflect for a moment: how many times has God called me to change, to do something for someone or for myself? How many times did He want the best for me? What was my answer? It didn't add up on my calculator or match my plans. Yet, whenever I listened to You, O God, I learned Your wisdom!

Today, your heart may be filled with fear of the unknown, of what awaits: bad news from a doctor, job insecurity, poor relationships at work, at home, in the family, or in marriage. Look at the Holy Family; see how they trusted God.

He will be visiting Medugorje, the site where visionaries first claimed to see the Blessed Mother in 1981. There will be time for meditation, praying and Mass. Solemnity of Mary, the Mother of God

January 1st Holy Day of Obligation

Masses at 10:00 am & 5:30 pm

The Solemnity of Mary, the Mother of God celebrates Mary's special place in God's plan. It honors her as the mother of Jesus, who is both fully human and fully God. This feast reminds us that through her yes, God entered our world to bring love, mercy, and peace.

This day invites us to reflect on the deep connection between Mary and her Son. Her trust in God shows the beauty of faith and obedience. She cared for Jesus with a mother's love, guiding Him in His early years. Her example encourages us to welcome God's work in our own lives with the same openness.

The Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord

The Epiphany marks the arrival of visitors, identified in Scripture as the magi, to the place where Jesus was born. Although we know virtually nothing about them, we do know they brought three gifts:

Gold — a symbol of wealth and power, identifies the recipient as a king.

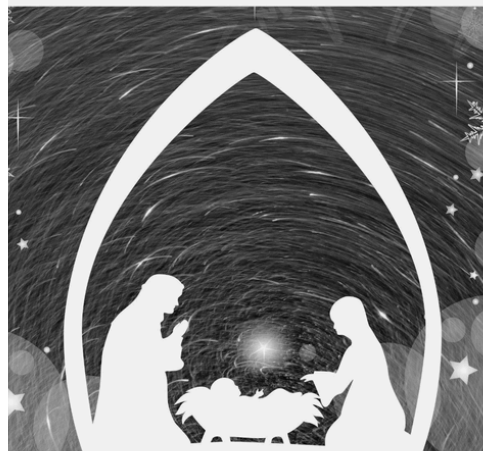
Frankincense — the crystalized resinous sap of a tree used as incense and as an offering, is symbolic of prayer.

Myrrh — another resinous tree sap, was used in healing liniments and as an embalming ointment. Myrrh is an odd gift for a child—so, even at the beginning of Jesus' life on earth, this gift foreshadows his death.

Epiphany kits will be available at all entrances of the church on January 3rd and 4th. Please take one and bless your home together as a family.
