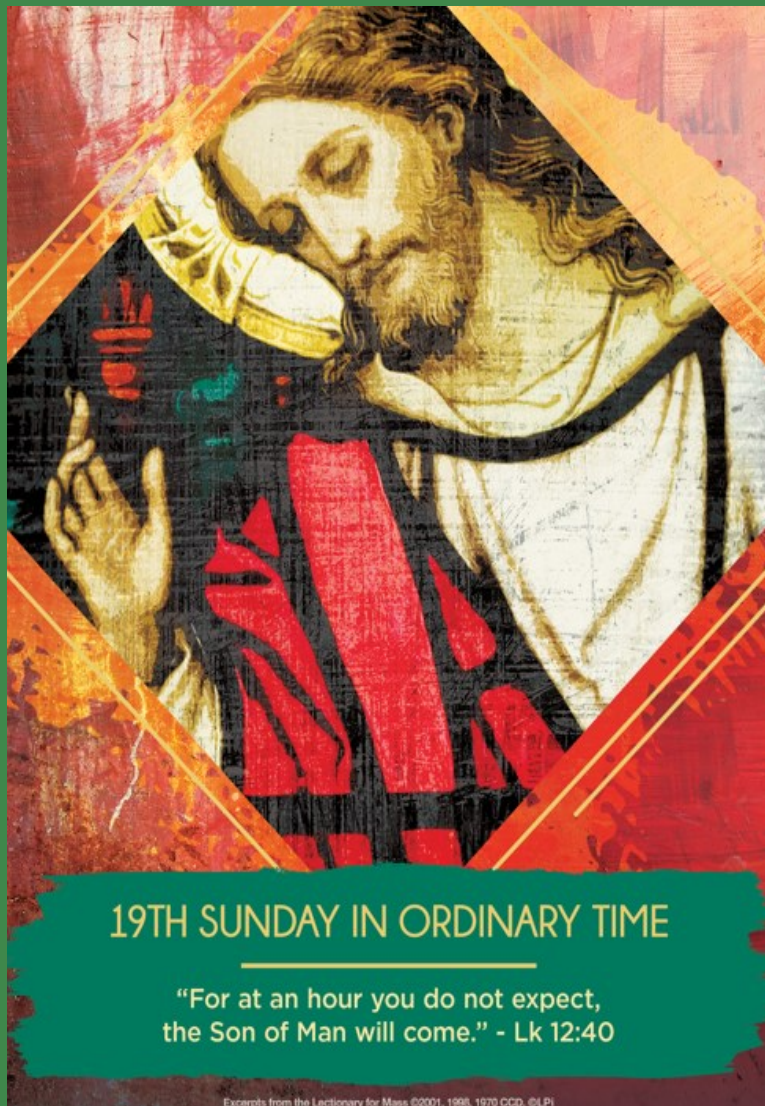

Jubilee 2025 - "Pilgrims of Hope": A meaningful way to participate in the Jubilee Year of Hope is by making a pilgrimage, which is different from a vacation. A pilgrimage is to a sacred place and involves stepping out of the normal routine with the goal of coming closer to God. Making a pilgrimage reminds us that in our everyday lives we are pilgrims on a journey to heaven, and therefore, our desire is to grow in our relationship with Jesus Christ with whom we hope to spend eternity. Take this opportunity to receive an abundance of God's grace by making a pilgrimage. The following locations have been set aside as places of pilgrimage:

- The Cathedral of Saint Joseph the Workman - La Crosse
- The Shrine of Our Lady of Guadalupe - La Crosse
- Sacred Heart of Jesus Church - Eau Claire

Liturgy & Life

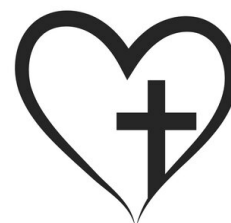
We continue making our way through Ordinary Time. We are moving toward the time we call Advent which is the beginning of the liturgical year in Catholic Tradition. Again we hear many parables during this season of the year when Jesus uses many stories to help people during his time and us now to understand what Jesus feels we should know.

Jesus tells his followers that wherever their treasure is, there will be their heart. It is stated that the servant who is ready for the Lord to enter his home will be rewarded. Jesus so wants us to know that with the God that Jesus reveals, we can be confident in the love God has for us. When we come to know the love God has for us, we can love others as we should. We can love as God loves.

We actually have three short parables in the gospel of Luke. We hear of the master who returns from a wedding feast and finds his servants waiting and ready to open the door at the first knock. Now the master is ready to wait on his servants. We also learn that we need to be vigilant so that a robber does not break in. We are also challenged to share what we have with others. Our riches are not ours to keep, but rather to share what we have with one another. We are put in charge of what we have been given as the steward is put in charge. We are not to treat others cruelly. If we do not understand, we could be judged more harshly because much has been revealed. Jesus concludes with the words, "Much will be required of the person entrusted with much, and still more will be demanded of the person entrusted with more." According to Sr. Ephrem Hollermann the parables are about "prioritizing, preparing and responding in discipleship."

As we grow in our relationship with God through Jesus Christ, we will find that much is demanded from us. We are to be vigilant for God breaking into our lives. We are to be willing to share what we have with others. We are to realize that life is not in our control, but God will guide us as we learn of suffering and hardship. We will experience uncertainty but we can be certain that in being faithful to God we will be granted the knowledge of faith, hope and love as God continues to walk with us.
