

# Pastor's Message

27th Sunday in Ordinary Time, 2025

Holy Scripture is filled with, among other things, many requests made throughout history by people called to live communion with God. Let us look at Abraham and his request for a son. Then, through the chosen people, for example, Moses, who intercedes for the people and asks for food and water in the desert. Then, the prophets, who are the "face of God," meaning they speak with God and present to Him requests related to freedom, blessing, and the protection of the chosen people. This brings us quickly to the time of Jesus and the Gospel. Jesus' public life is also filled with many requests: for example, requests for healing, the expulsion of demons, requests for bread, prayer - "Lord, teach us to pray," the apostles asked. And today we come to another moment in Jesus' life and the request addressed to him by the apostles: "Lord, grant us deeper faith, increase it in us." This is a very interesting request, but also necessary - because from it stems the meaning of human life and our entire history on earth.

Today, in the first reading, we hear words about sorrow and difficult life conditions from the lips of a righteous man. How can we believe in God and trust Him when we experience injustice firsthand and when we see injustice affecting others? What we hear in response to the righteous man's complaint is God saying, "Be patient; evil will be punished and destroyed." This is God's response, but also His promise to humanity. The second reading is from Saint Paul, who says, "Remain faithful to your faith in God, proclaim the truth, and remain faithful to your calling. Various things will happen and various people will surround you, but you remain faithful to me."

and the words of the apostles' request: "Lord, people praying and the security of the increase our faith!" We remember much earlier the event on the lake, when a huge storm arose during the night. The apostles are in the boat with Jesus. Jesus sleeps, and they are terrified, their hearts full of fear that He is about to perish. They wake Jesus, and He calms the storms and says to them, "O you of little faith..." and this situation repeated several times, you are still people of little faith. What is most interesting today is that the apostles are aware of their littleness of faith; they know this, and that is why they ask: increase our faith. They know that only Jesus can meet their need.

Therefore, as we participate in the Eucharist, let us remember to ask Jesus, as the apostles did: Lord, increase my faith for daily life, for my responsibilities, for the upbringing of my children, for being good at home, at work, wherever You send me...


