Contestants showcased their commitment to community service by presenting their involvement with various causes. The event, with its red-carpet theme, was aptly titled "Lights! Camera! Crowns!" and hosted by the well-known **Matt Liffreing**. The afternoon featured the seven contestants in an opening number dance and three phases of competition. After the judges' deliberations, Miss Huntington Beach 2025, Nicole Allyson Vogt, handed the crown to the new queen, Gabrielle Samiy. A delightful reception followed the coronation, featuring live music by **Jacob Melvoin**.

**Queen Gabrielle Samiy** will be pursuing a degree in business finance at California State University, Fullerton. She aspires to teach business at the college level while also coaching and mentoring women in sports and entrepreneurship. Gabrielle has a rich athletic background, having played basketball at both the community college and National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA) levels, earning numerous accolades. A passionate advocate for civic engagement, she campaigned for the Huntington Beach City Council in 2022 and continues to encourage young people to volunteer and get involved in their communities.

**Princess Annaleah LaParne** is a senior at Huntington Beach High School, where she is a member of the Water Polo and Swim Team. An Eagle Scout and a Girl Scout Ambassador, she recently received the prestigious Gold Award for her water safety project aimed at keeping children safe around swimming pools.

**Princess Lilliana Mindel**, a sophomore at UCLA, is a proud Regents Scholar studying voice with the aspiration to be a full-time opera singer. She made headlines in 2024 as the 1st Place winner of the Schmidt Vocal Arts National High School Competition, representing California. Lilliana also earned recognition as a Grand Prize Finalist in The Music Center's 2023 Spotlight Competition.
