Blessing of Wreath on the First Sunday of Advent Father: Our help is in the name of the Lord.

All 147

All: Who made heaven and earth.
Father: Let us pray. O God, by whose word all things are sanctified, pour

forth Thy blessing upon this wreath, and grant that we who use it may prepare our hearts for the coming of Christ and may receive abundant graces from Thee. Through Christ Our Lord.

All: Amen.

(Priest or head of house sprinkles wreath with holy water.)

<u>Devotions for 1st Week of Advent</u> (Youngest child lights one purple candle; each evening candles are lit before reciting prayer at dinnertime.)

Father: Let us pray. Stir up Thy might, we beg Thee, O Lord, and come, so that we may escape through Thy protection and be saved by Thy help from the dangers that threaten us because of our sins. Who lives and reigns for ever and ever.

All: Amen.

(Sing one verse of hymn: O Come, O Come, Emmanuel.)

<u>Devotions for 2nd Week of Advent</u> (Oldest child lights two purple candles.) Father: Let us pray. O Lord, stir up our hearts that we may prepare for Thy only begotten Son, that through His coming we may be made worthy to serve thee with pure souls. Through the same Christ our Lord.

All: Amen.

(Sing two verses of hymn.)

<u>Devotions for 3rd Week of Advent</u> (Mother lights 2 purple & 1 rose candle.) Father: Let us pray. We humbly beg Thee, O Lord, to listen to our prayers; and by the grace of Thy coming bring light into our darkened minds. Who lives and reigns for ever and ever.

All: Amen.

(Sing three verses of hymn.)

Devotions for 4th Week of Advent (Father lights all four candles.)

Father: Let us pray. Stir up Thy might, we pray Thee, O Lord, and come; rescue us through Thy great strength so that salvation, which has been

hindered by our sins, may be hastened by the grace of Thy gentle mercy. Who lives and reigns for ever and ever.
All: Amen.

(Sing all four verses of hymn.)

At the end of Advent, candles may be changed to white, and ribbons and tiny Christmas balls added to decorate the wreath. Renew greens if necessary; keep wreath until the Feast of epiphany.

The Archdiocese taxes each of its parishes in three-ways, the Annual Appeal, the Parish Assessment and the School Assessment.

The Annual Appeal runs on a calendar year. The two assessments run on the fiscal year (July-June). The tax for all these is based on a parish's income two years back at 8% for the Annual Appeal, 11.6% for the Parish Assessment and 1.6% for the School Assessment. Also, beginning this year, the diocese will roll the Georgia Bulletin cost into the Annual Appeal. Every registered household will receive this publication (whether you like it or not), and the parish will pay for this based upon its number of parishioners.

Going into 2026, SFdS's Appeal debt is \$58,975.50 which includes its Bulletin cost debt of \$4,275.50. Currently, we still owe the diocese \$40,707 for Appeal 2025. So far only 19 donors, 4%, of our registered households, have contributed to this debt relief. At the end of the year, any shortfall will be taken from our savings.

May I encourage you to help pay-off this debt. Any money given this account will not be taxed and up to 25% of money given over this amount will return to the parish (anything over this amount will go into our endowment fund.) Also, the more parishioners who participate in this venture, the more the archdiocese will see SFdS as an asset and not a liability. This will be helpful in going forward with any future capital campaign.
