Hello to everyone at St. Anthony of Padua Parish! My wife Susie and I are thrilled to join your parish family and want to thank you for the warm welcome we have already received.

A little about us: I grew up on the north side of Kenosha, attended Kenosha schools, and have lived in the area most of my life, except for time spent in Germany with my dad and in Texas and Florida during my military service. I am an Air Force veteran, having served as an airplane mechanic for several years. After the military, I built and managed several local businesses and auto dealerships.

I am a convert to Catholicism from my family's Evangelical Christian roots. With a deep interest in theology, I jumped right into the deep end—teaching first graders!
