Be Ready So You Don't Have to Get Ready

Many people are grieving the loss of loved ones. The sobering words of James 4:14 "Whereas you do not know what will happen tomorrow. For what is your life? It is even a vapor that appears for a little time and then vanishes away, reminds us that human life is short and unpredictable.

There is an urgency in sharing the Gospel of Jesus Christ with loved ones. God brings certain individuals and experiences into our lives as reminders that our existence exceeds our earthly journey. Because we know that physical death is not the final chapter, but a gateway to eternal life. The assurance of eternal life is a central aspect of our Christian faith, as highlighted in John 3:16-17, "For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have everlasting life. For God did not send His Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world through Him might be saved."

The death of Jesus Christ, Son of God, fulfills the promise of everlasting life for all believers. It is critical to share with those we love that their eternal destiny hinges on their response to Jesus. In John 14:6 Jesus says, "I am the way, the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through Me." The choice to accept or reject Jesus Christ as Savior will determine whether they spend eternity in God's presence or face eternal separation and torment in Hell. This truth underscores the significance of encouraging others to seek God.

When Jesus returns, His arrival will not be a human planned event, a day of festivity, or a gathering at the

Church to hear Him speak. Instead, it will be a day of judgment for those who rejected God—A period defined by individual accountability and lasting consequences. "In a moment, in the twinkling of an eye, at the last trumpet. For the trumpet will sound, and the dead will be raised imperishable, and we shall be changed. For this perishable body must put on the imperishable, and this mortal body must put on immortality." (1 Corinthians 15:52-53).

Are you still preparing, or just a work in progress? Will you hear God's trumpet, or be left seeking mercy and forgiveness? Yes, it is better to be ready, so you don't have to get ready. Act ethically, communicate respectfully, and share your experiences to motivate others. Always stay ready!

Matthew 24:44 "Therefore you also be ready, for the Son of Man is coming at an hour you do not expect." When God calls, it will happen in the blink of an eye.



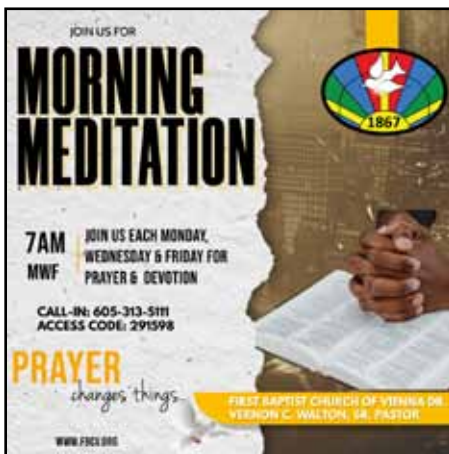
