A Message From our Pastor

My dear Sisters and Brothers,

Change is inevitable. I sometimes hear the phrase, "the only constant is change." We have experienced it in our lives, and we experience it in our church as well.

However, change can lead to renewal and reinvigoration. We are in an exciting time in the life of the Church. The Jubilee of Hope that began in December continues into the new year with a focus on our own pilgrimages and living a life of hope. We just concluded a special focus on the Eucharist with the Eucharistic Revival and we renewed by the election of Pope Leo XIV just a few months ago.

When I think of all of these events coming together, I think of the preface of the Eucharistic Prayer when the priest says, "Lift up your hearts," and the people respond, "We lift them up to the Lord." Finance Report

Dear Fellow Parishioners,

On behalf of the Finance Council and with a grateful heart, I thank you for the monetary and spiritual sacrifices you make to our St. Michael parish community. We can minister in so many ways – in our community and around the globe – because of your commitment to the spirit that exists here at St. Michael.

Our combined parish and school were able to complete this fiscal year with net gains in our assets over the previous year, all while improving our campus, supporting our staff, and contributing to many charitable works. Our Council's monthly work is often unseen, much like important upkeep to our building. This year we replaced the roof over the gathering space, replaced one of the chillers, renovated the gymnasium bathrooms, sealed all parking lots and driveways, purchased new equipment for the school kitchen, and installed the beautiful mosaics in the lower Chapel and Blessed Virgin prayer space. Some of these were completed with the proceeds of designated gifts from parishioners and the School Advisory Board; others were completed with the availability of funds from the general offertory. Regardless of the source, we accept the responsibility to care for these dollars and our worship areas, our school, and our grounds, and we are so thankful.

We have renewed our focus this year in community outreach, recognizing the needs of all those around us and importantly understanding the changing needs of our brothers and sisters at other parishes. Whether through our weekly food ministry or direct donations to gospel driven causes – needy children, the hungry, the underhoused – we accomplish this in your name and in the name of St. Michael parish.

We are grateful to our staff — over 70 strong in our parish and school — who daily deliver good news to all who encounter God's presence in all we do at St. Michael. Their gifts and professionalism create such a welcoming environment, allowing us to increase our outreach every year and to convey to everyone we touch how warm and caring St. Michael is.

We are grateful for those who, in a special way, remember St. Michael as part of their estate or long-term financial planning. These extraordinary gifts provide opportunities for expanded programming, environment enhancement, and student scholarships. We are mindful and grateful for all you do to ensure our St. Michael community remains a special spiritual home for each of us and for generations to come.

And for all that you do for our parish - for your generosity, for your sacrifices, for your prayers, for your love of St. Michael – thank you.

Projects and Initiatives

Each year, the Finance Council, in collaboration with Fr. Benson, the Parish Staff and Parish Pastoral Council, conducts an annual review to determine which capital projects should be undertaken. These projects are not normally funded by operating revenue, but by savings,

designated contributions, reserved funds, and through the efforts of the School Advisory Board (SAB). In evaluating projects, we look at the maintenance that is necessary to support our aging facilities as well as initiatives that support our ministries.

Since our last report to you St. Michael's carried out the following capital projects:

- Installed new Mosaics in the Chapel and at Marian Statute
- Replaced Air Conditioning for the Gym, Vesting Sacristy and Gathering Space
- Completed Gym restroom renovation
- Upgrades to school cafeteria equipment
- Crack Fill and Seal Parish parking lots and School Playground

In the current year, the capital projects include:

- Build outdoor learning center and pavilion complete by August 17
- Reupholster church pews and kneelers Complete by Advent
- Replace Labyrinth surface. Complete before Dec I
- Upgrade classroom furniture 1st & 2nd Grade rooms
- ♦ Replace aging school communications systems and emergency alert capability in church and school*
- ♦ Other security improvements to the campus video surveillance and impact barriers*









Liturgical Ministries

As members of the Church – the People of God – we answer our Baptismal call to ministry in various ways. Whatever our response, our meaning of ministry involves far more than "doing things for people."

Rather, ministry is a mutual giving of self to one another – a caring enough about others to give them our personal presence, with deliberation and purpose, with a deep sense of faith and commitment, and to do this in the name of Jesus Christ.

Eucharistic Ministers

Purpose: To share the Body and Blood of Christ with the People of

God - the Body of Christ.

Responsibilities: Eucharistic Ministers must have an understanding, love and reverence for the Eucharist, and for those with whom and to whom they minister. Eucharistic Ministers are responsible for being present, well-prepared, and familiar with procedures when scheduled to minister.

Requirements: To be a Eucharistic Minister, one must be at least 16 years of age, Baptized and Confirmed, in full communion with the

Catholic Church, participating in the Sacramental life of the Church, a registered member of St. Michael Parish, and must feel a calling to this ministry. Participation in the entire Formation Workshop is required, along with events offered for the updating and enrichment of this ministry.

Time Commitment: In addition to the initial formation (see below), there is a commitment of time in prayer and preparation before ministering. Frequency of scheduling is contingent upon the choice of Mass times.

Formation: Participation in an initial formation workshop is required, regardless of prior experience as a Eucharistic Minister. The present workshop consists of a four-hour workshop on one day. Participation in ongoing formation, such as Ministry Evenings, is expected.

Goals and Purpose: To provide the liturgy and other prayer experiences throughout the year online via our website and social media for those who are sick, homebound, or unable to attend in-person.

Responsibilities: Volunteers help produce the 4:00 pm Saturday Vigil Mass live stream, along with other prayer experiences throughout the year. Some experience with technology recommended, but not necessary. Training is provided. Youth and adult volunteers welcome.

Purpose: To effectively proclaim the living Word of God to the people

of this parish community.

Responsibilities: Lectors proclaim the Word of God at Masses and on other occasions such as Prayer Services, Communal Reconciliation Services, etc. Lectors are responsible for being present and well-prepared when scheduled to read.

Requirements: A Lector must be a practicing Catholic, in communion with the Church, a person of faith and good character, who takes his or her faith life seriously. A Lector needs to be a registered member of the parish and one who feels a calling to this ministry. Lectors need to exhibit a love and respect for the Word of God and the community, and be willing to expend the time necessary in prayer and preparation for this ministry. Participation in an initial formation workshop is required, regardless of prior experience as a Lector. The workshop consists of two meetings of three hours each. Participation in ongoing formation, such as Ministry Evenings, is expected.

Time Commitment: In addition to the initial formation, there is a commitment of time in prayer and preparation each time a Lector is scheduled to read. Frequency of scheduling is contingent upon choice of Mass times.

Purpose: As the liturgical seasons change, the worship space is transformed to reflect and enhance that particular season or celebration.

Responsibilities: Joining with the members of the Liturgy Committee to help to prepare the worship space for a season or particular celebration.

Requirements: This ministry is for anyone who would like to assist with liturgical preparation, but who does not wish to be a full member of the Liturgy Committee.

Time Commitment: The time commitment is a few hours, usually on a Saturday morning, several times during the year.

Goal: To create an atmosphere in which the worshipping assembly can experience God, so that a feeling of real celebration will be present in every liturgy and also to enable and encourage members of the parish to recognize and grow in the ministries to which they have been called by Baptism. St. Michael's Liturgy Committee is deeply rooted in the tenets of the Second Vatican Council and respectful of the liturgical reforms that emanated from it. Liturgical Planning and Preparation – general planning for the seasons and specific planning for individual celebrations. These include not only Masses, but also Evening Prayer, Morning Prayer, Communal Reconciliation services, any liturgical celebrations.

Liturgical Catechesis – providing information so that the people of the parish understand what is taking place and the reasons for it. Offering liturgical catechesis by allowing the people to experience good liturgy, well planned and well implemented.

Liturgical Evaluation – an ongoing process of determining the needs of the worshipping community and the effects of the celebrations that have been prepared.

Environment and Art – planning and arranging the liturgical environment for seasonal and special celebrations. We primarily use natural materials for enhancement of the worship space (plants, flowers, wood, rock, fabrics, etc.)

Preparation of Liturgical Ministers – planning and implementing workshops to form those who wish to be liturgical ministers and to enrich those presently serving in these ministries.

Qualifications: Membership on the Liturgy Committee requires: I.) A basic knowledge of liturgical principles, which can be acquired through reading and study, and a willingness to continue learning. 2.) An interest in and a love for good liturgy. 3.) A desire to help bring about good community worship in the parish.

Membership: The Liturgy Committee heartily welcomes new members. Please consider joining us if you have a desire to continue to learn about liturgy and liturgical principles, and if you personally love liturgy that is prayerful and life-giving and want to share your time and talent to help bring about good communal worship at the parish. Call Trevor or Sr. Carolyn.

Time Commitment: Committee meetings are held once or twice a month (September through May) depending on the season and needs. The committee is responsible for setting the various liturgical environments throughout the year. assist as they are able (usually on Saturdays) so actual time commitment varies.

The Ministry of Hospitality is the first liturgical ministry that people encounter upon arriving for Mass. This is a ministry of welcome, of helping to make people feel at ease, comfortable and an important part of the community. Greeters and Ushers help to create an atmosphere of hospitality by welcoming people warmly. They contribute significantly not only to the welcome and comfort of the people, but also to their safety. Ushers also attend to various functions throughout the liturgy to meet the needs of members of the community, and to help assure that many of the elements of the liturgy flow smoothly.

Qualifications: Requirements for this ministry include a strong sense of community and a desire to give of oneself to help enable each person celebrate liturgy to the fullest.

Time commitment: Usually an hour and a half on weekends. Also, Ministers of Hospitality are expected to participate in any meetings scheduled for them, as well as in gatherings for ongoing spiritual renewal and formation. **Formation:** Upon learning of your interest, we will contact you regarding a formation class.

Lay Leaders of Prayer

In recent years, members of the laity have been called more frequently to lead their communities in prayer. The church's understanding of the role of the laity recognizes that, by virtue of Baptism, all Christians share in the royal priesthood of Jesus Christ. It is because of this that a lay person may be called forth to lead the community in prayer in those instances not specifically reserved for the ordained.

In the Diocese of Youngstown, Leaders of Prayer are commissioned by Bishop Bonnar after a comprehensive eight-week formation course. They then may lead in the following acts of worship: Liturgy of the Hours (Morning and Evening Prayer), Liturgy of the Word (with or without Holy Communion), Rites from the *Order of Christian Funerals* such as Vigil for the Deceased and Rite of Committal, Devotional Services (such as Stations of the Cross), and Sunday Celebrations in the Absence of a Priest. Participation in the formation course is at the invitation of the Pastor.

Responsibilities: Altar Servers assist the Presider at Mass and are responsible for carrying the cross and candles in the procession, handling the sacred vessels for the altar, and assisting in other duties during the Mass to aid the priest or deacon. Altar Servers may volunteer to assist the presider at weddings and funerals.

Time Commitment: Altar servers are scheduled to serve once every several weeks at the weekend Masses on a rotating schedule. Altar servers also serve on Holy days, funerals, weddings and other liturgical events that are scheduled. Must arrive 20 minutes before the scheduled Mass.

Training: Servers, beginning in the third grade, and only after receiving First Holy Communion, can be trained via training sessions and by shadowing experienced servers during Mass. Youth, adults and families are welcome to be trained.



Diocesan policy requires that children be active in religious education, either through St Michael School or through the Families Growing in Faith programs, for two years, and that parents participate with students in the Sacramental preparation program. Special arrangements can be made for older children or children with special needs on a case by case basis. It is expected that families seeking Sacraments are active, practicing Catholics who are attending Mass regularly and that families will continue to be active in Faith Formation programs after the second-grade year. **Requirements:** Parents are required to attend three (3) parent meetings and the family Rite of Enrollment at a Sunday liturgy in preparation for the celebration of the Sacraments. Other than the first meeting, all sessions will be for parents and their second graders. First Reconciliation will be completed in an evening family service in the winter. First Communions will be scheduled at designated weekend masses in the spring, according to family preference.

For a Catholic, Confirmation is a Sacrament of Initiation - the beginning of accepting new responsibilities in the Catholic Church. The other two Sacraments of Initiation are Baptism and Eucharist. Although it is the last Sacrament of Initiation to be celebrated, Confirmation does not mark the end of a person's formal religious education; rather it is the beginning of a deeper belief, a fuller involvement, and a stronger service to the Church. It is Diocesan policy that the celebration of the Sacrament of Confirmation for our young people be held during the eighth grade year of school. A separate preparation program for all eighth graders is also required by the Diocese of Youngstown along with being enrolled in St. Michael's School or the Parish School of Religion. Those who have not been active in any religious education program and who wish to be Confirmed in the eighth grade will be assisted in catching up on some of the formation they have missed.
