A MESSAGE FROM YOUR EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

SCRIPTURE

Peace I leave with you, my peace I give unto you: not as the world giveth, give I unto you. Let not your heart be troubled, neither let it be afraid. John 14:27 KJV

OPENING THOUGHTS

Peace is not the absence of problems—it is the confidence that Jesus is present in every one of them. His peace grows deeper with every year we walk with Him.

One of the greatest blessings we can experience in every season of life is the peace of God. As we grow older, life often brings new challenges. Health may not be what it once was. PRAYER

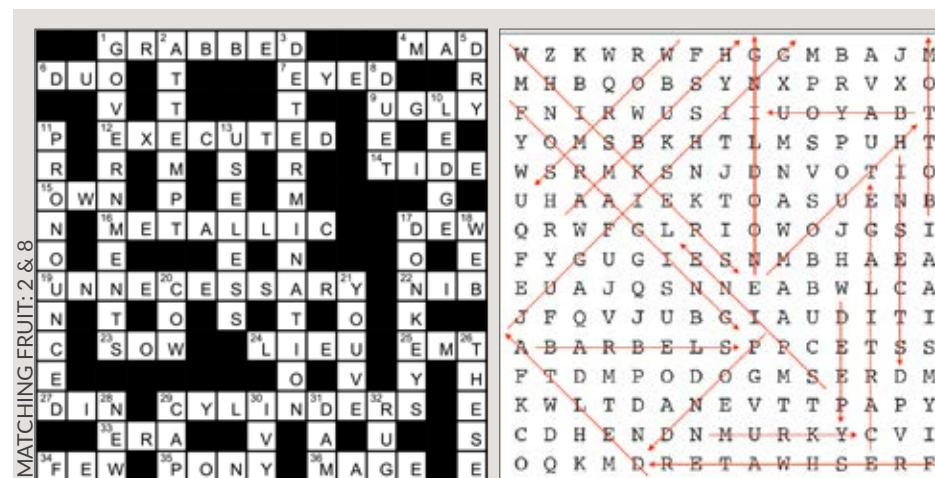
Heavenly Father,

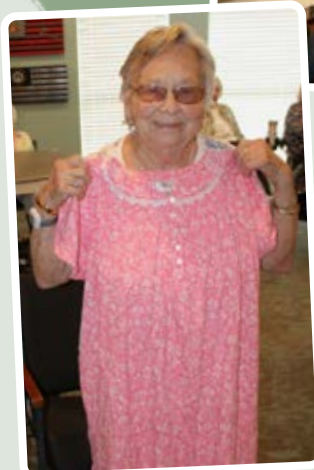

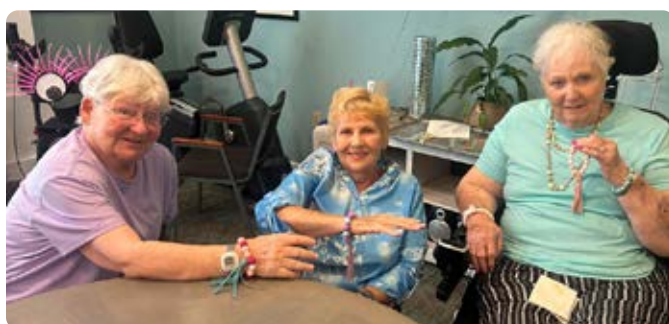
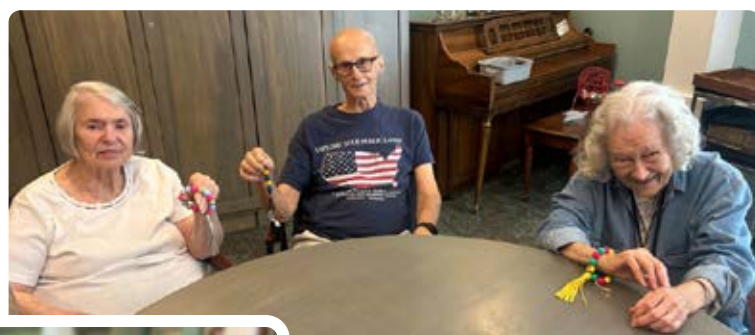

MEET *Diane Minshew* *Faith, Lasting Bonds & the Beauty of Unplanned Paths*

When you ask Diane Minshew about her career, she doesn't just talk about teaching-she talks about answering a calling.

A resident of Renaissance Marquis for the past three months, Diane has spent a lifetime making a difference in the lives of others. Her journey began after graduating from Berry College in 1968. The following year, she accepted her first teaching position at East Rome High School, where she taught mathematics.

It was during those early years that an opportunity through her church, South Broad Baptist Church, would change the course of her life. Diane enrolled in an American Sign Language class sponsored by the church and soon found herself interpreting for church services. The more she learned, the more she felt drawn to the deaf community. Communicating in sign language, she discovered a passion she never expected and a sense of purpose that changed her life.

Inspired by these experiences, Diane returned to college and earned her master's degree in teaching students with hearing impairments. She planned to continue teaching math at East Rome, but sometimes life offers surprises and opens doors that we never see coming; and they steer us exactly where we're meant

to be. When Diane went to sign her contract for the next school year, the paperwork couldn't be found and she was asked to return the following morning. That evening, she received a phone call from the Georgia School for the Deaf, offering her a teaching position

For Diane, this was no coincidence. "I felt it was a God-given opportunity to work in the field He had called me to," she reflects. She accepted the offer, and from 1972 until her retirement in 2004, Diane devoted 32 years to the Georgia School for the Deaf. Those years were filled with both challenges and rewards. Teaching students with hearing impairments required patience, love and understanding, but the relationships Diane built made every day worthwhile.

Many of those bonds remain strong even now. Diane still keeps in touch with several former students, a testament of the lasting impact she had and the special bonds they shared.

Now enjoying retirement at Renaissance Marquis, Diane continues to inspire those around her with her warmth, humility, and unwavering faith. Her story is a reminder that sometimes the most meaningful paths are the ones we never plan—and that a heart willing to serve can change lives in ways that last a lifetime.

We are delighted to welcome Diane to Renaissance Marquis and are honored to share her remarkable story.

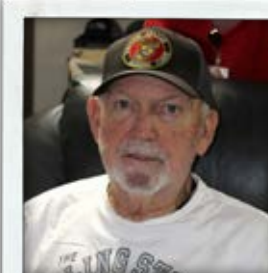

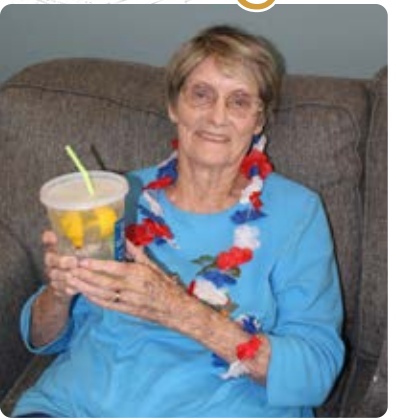

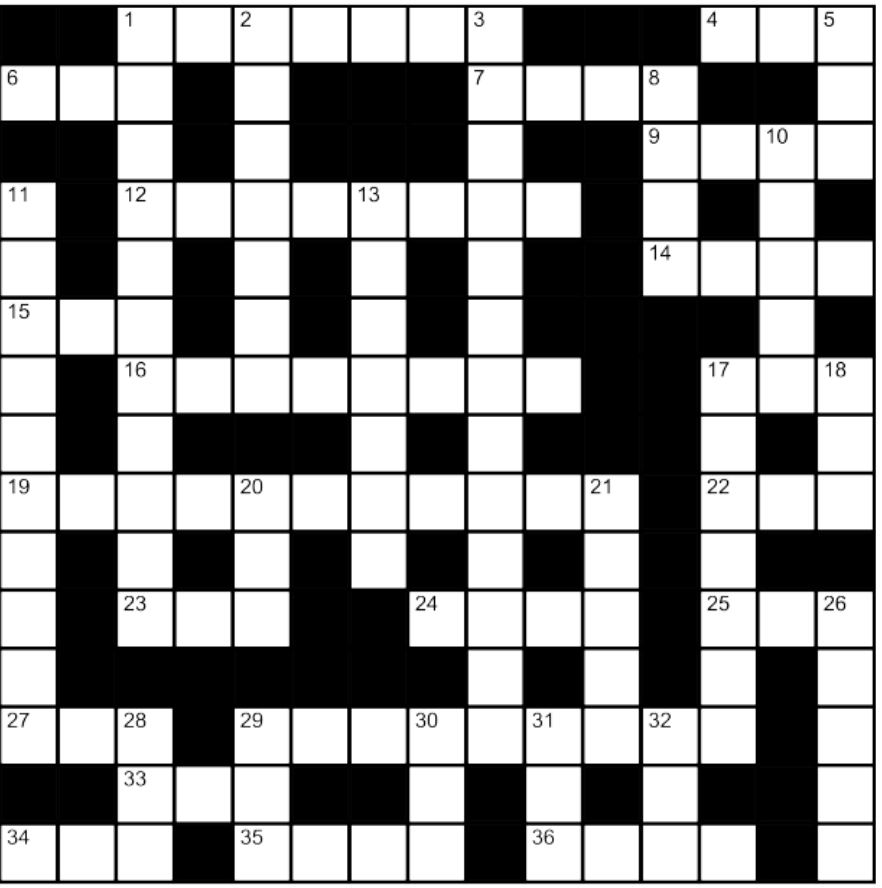

We are excited to recognize Nicki House as our Extra Mile Winner for August 2026.

Nicki's nomination comes from a chorus of voices—her supervisor, another manager, a coworker, and several residents—all united in their praise for her. It's clear to everyone who crosses her path that Nicki embodies the spirit of service and care that defines our community.

Skylan Cole, Housekeeping Director, describes Nicki as "a dedicated hard worker. Anytime something needs to be done, she does it and never complains." Skylan shared an example that sums up Nicki's approach: when she noticed a resident's carpet needed cleaning, she brought her own shampooer from home and took care of it herself. Marketing Director Cyndi Brannon remembers a Saturday move-in when Nicki went out to her car and brought back her personal tool kit to help a family assemble furniture—just one more way she goes above and beyond for residents and their loved ones. Coworker Amber Liles recalls Nicki inviting a resident to join her for lunch in the Dining Room, using her own break time simply to make someone smile. Amber adds, "She always goes the Extra Mile." And residents Betty Simon, Judy Boyers, and Linda Smith echoed the same sentiment: "Nicki is always looking for ways to go above and beyond to help you, puts away clothes,

washes dirty dishes, dusts pictures & blinds. When she sees a need, she attends to it."

Nicki was born here in Rome, Georgia, and grew up in Rockmart and Cedartown. She attended Cedartown High School and is married with three living children—Kelsey, Justin, and Karamia—and two children, Elijah and Rylee, who she keeps close in her heart.

Though she's only been part of our Renaissance team for four months, Nicki has already made a lasting impression in the Housekeeping Department. When asked how working in an aging community has affected her, Nicki says, "Yes, it opens your eyes so much to how important life is, and I've made some amazing friends with the residents and employees." She cherishes time with her own family, and her favorite memories include her wedding day, the births of her children, and the day her middle child received his transplants.

Nicki explains, "I love greeting residents each day and feeling like I'm making a difference and hearing about each of their lives. My life passion would be to always bring happiness to others, also to be willing to help wherever I can. Working with the residents is the highlight of the day, just to be able to make sure their rooms stay clean. My husband and kids are my biggest encouragers. I'm a very positive person and like to help others feel good about themselves."

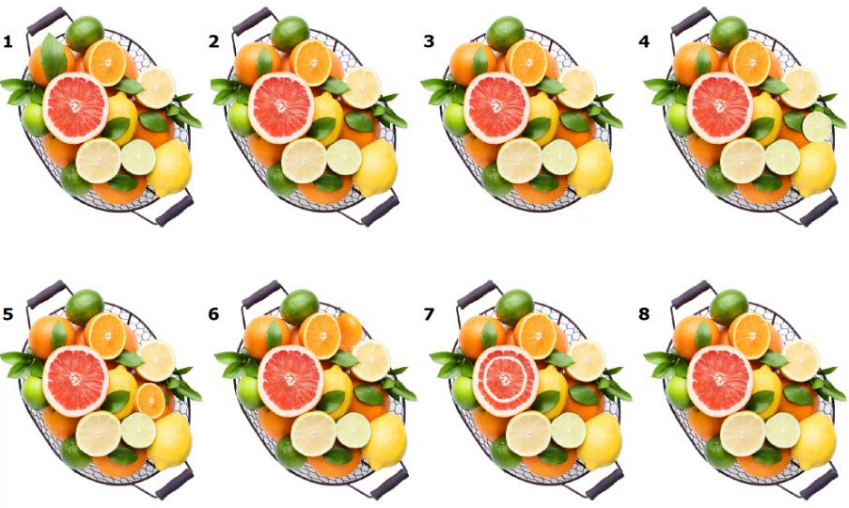
