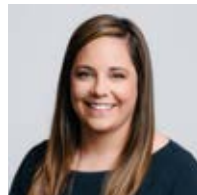

### HANDS THAT BUILT A LEGACY: MEET CARL HONECKER

Carl Honecker's story is one of craftsmanship, curiosity, and quiet dedication. Born on January 25, 1936, in the small town of Mountainside, New Jersey, Carl grew up as the youngest of four children in a lively household where family ties and the smell of fresh-cut lumber seemed to fill the air.

His father, Hermann, was a master carpenter who built houses from the ground up—a skill he patiently shared with his sons on weekends and throughout long summer days.

Those early lessons in plumbing, electricity, and woodworking gave Carl a foundation of practical knowledge and resourcefulness that would shape the rest of his life. After graduating from Jonathan Dayton Regional High School, Carl's curiosity and determination led him to Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute in Troy, New York, where he earned his degree in Mechanical Engineering in 1957.

Carl's career took him to the heart of New York City as a project manager for J.O. Ross Engineering, and

later as engineering manager at Kleissler Company. He even returned to his home state, lending his expertise as a consultant for the State of New Jersey. Along the way, he served his country in the U.S. Navy, attending Officer Candidate School in Newport, Rhode Island. Stationed in Yokosuka, Japan and living in Negishi Heights, Carl led a unit responsible for target drone services for the 7th Fleet—a role that required steady leadership and precise attention to detail.

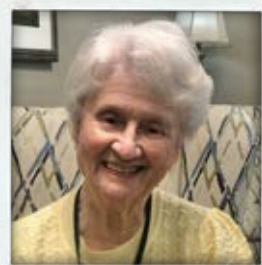
But the work that may have meant the most to Carl is the work he did for family. Throughout his life, he found joy in woodworking, furniture refinishing, and crafting handmade dollhouses, tiny tables, and toys for his four children, seven grandchildren, and seven great-grandchildren. Each piece was more than a project; it was a gift, a way of connecting generations and passing down the tradition of creating something lasting with your own hands.

Since arriving at Renaissance in April 2024, Carl's warmth and his quietly generous spirit have become part of the community's fabric. His story—one built on skill, service, and a love for family—continues to inspire those around him, reminding us all of the value in building, fixing, and crafting a life filled with care.

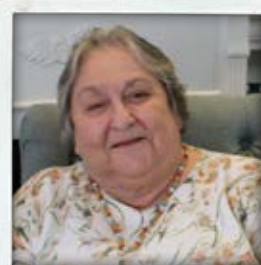

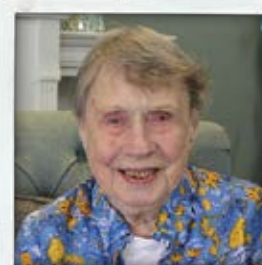

### CHAPLAIN'S CORNER

**Scripture:** Mark 2:1-12 (Jesus heals the paralytic lowered through the roof)

**Story:** A crowd packed the house where Jesus was teaching. Four friends, desperate to get their paralyzed companion

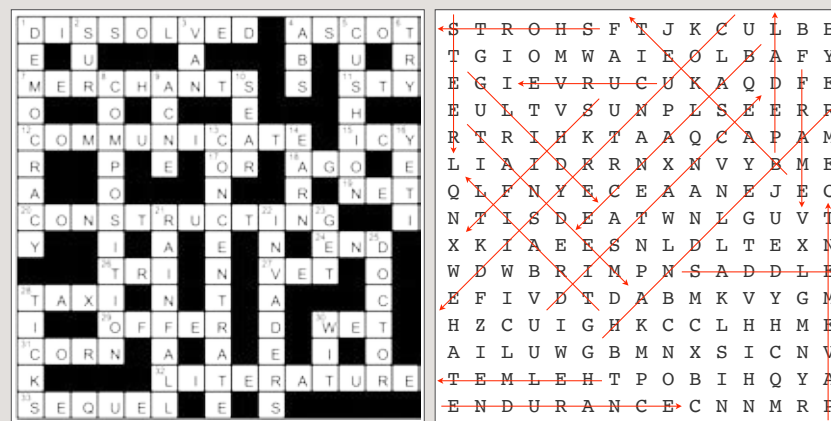
to Jesus, tore up the roof and lowered him on a mat right in front of Jesus. Seeing their faith, Jesus first pronounced the man's sins forgiven—provoking religious critics—and then healed his body, commanding him to rise, take his mat, and go home. The crowd was amazed and glorified God.

**Reflection:** This story highlights three truths: faith that risks embarrassment and effort, the power of community to carry burdens, and Jesus' authority to forgive and heal. The friends' boldness opened a pathway for restoration; their faith was active, practical, and costly. Jesus addresses the deeper need (sin and reconciliation) and then restores physical wholeness—both matter to Him.

- Are you waiting for Jesus but stuck outside the crowded house? Consider who can help carry you—ask, accept help, and let others act on your behalf.
- Be the friend who takes the initiative: pray, show up, remove obstacles, and persist until help reaches the person in need.
- Practical step this week: identify one person you can practically help (transport, a meal, childcare, a phone call of encouragement) and do it without waiting to be asked.

**Prayer:** Lord Jesus, give us faith that acts, friends who bear burdens, and boldness to bring others to You. Heal what needs healing—spirit, heart, and body—and help us be Your hands and feet. Amen.
