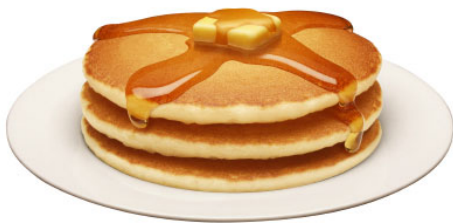

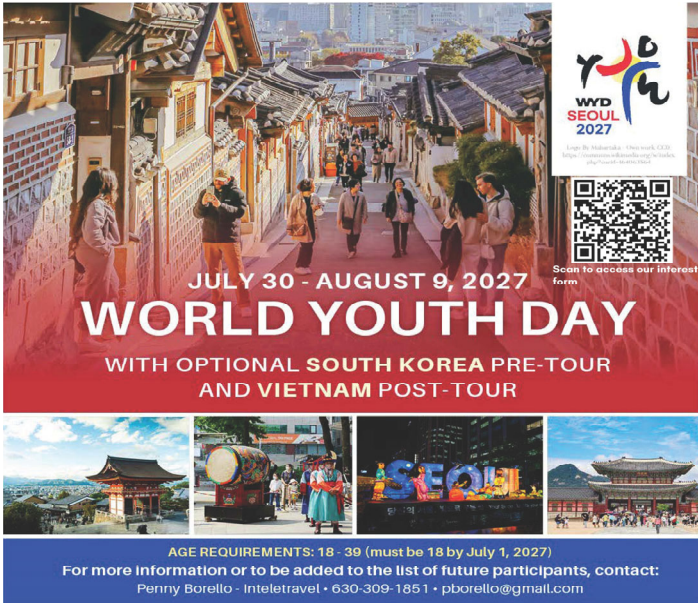

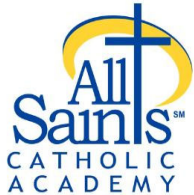

## The Last 4 Petitions of the Our Father Prayer

Several weeks ago we looked at the first 3 petitions of the **Our Father**. After we have asked God to draw us to Him, we then pray the last 4 petitions for needs of our life, both body and soul:

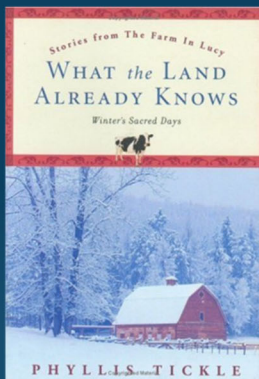
**Give us this day our daily bread:** Give “us” our daily bread. God wants us to work together for justice so that all people’s needs are met. We not only hunger for bread but also for a home, clothing, to be safe. But these are only our physical hungers. We also are hungry for God, for His Word, for His love, for the Bread of Life that is Jesus’ living presence which feeds our souls and keeps us on a path to Heaven.

**Forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us:** We ask God to forgive our sins. However, this forgiveness is tied to the next petition, as we forgive those who trespass against us. Jesus taught us that we must forgive each other in order to receive God’s forgiveness for our sins. Why? Because when we choose not to forgive someone, we close our hearts to God’s mercy because of our unwillingness to forgive.

**Lead us not into temptation:** The original Greek verb “lead” meant “do not allow us to enter into or do not let us yield to.” We are asking God to protect us from temptation and for God’s grace to take away thoughts or impulses that might lead us to sin.

**Deliver us from evil:** We pray for strength to win the battle against Satan, the Evil One, the angel who opposes God. We know that the devil does exist and that his plan is to lead us away from God. God’s power is always greater than the Evil One. We have nothing to fear from Satan as long as we stay in God’s grace. Jesus defeated the Evil One on the Cross!

## Gospel Meditation

### Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

When I was 22, I went on a pilgrimage to Rome for the Jubilee Year of 2000. I was traveling light with just a backpack, one blue shirt and black pants, little money, and no Italian. I had a few close friends and one goal: to reach the Eternal City. Despite the challenges and deprivations, I felt alive in a way I had never known before.

When do you feel most alive? I'd wager it's not when you're most comfortable or surrounded by stuff. Rather, it's when your life is aimed at something great; when you're on a meaningful and challenging journey with good friends.

That's the image the Magi give us in today's Gospel. They set out from the East not with certainty, but with hope. They study the signs, discipline their attention, and journey together, offering the best they have when they find the newborn King.

The Church gives us their story at the start of the year to reawaken something in us. We are not meant to drift. We're meant to journey as pilgrims. The Jubilee Year of 2025 may have ended, but our pilgrimage has not. Like the magi, the closer we get to Christ, the more alive we become.

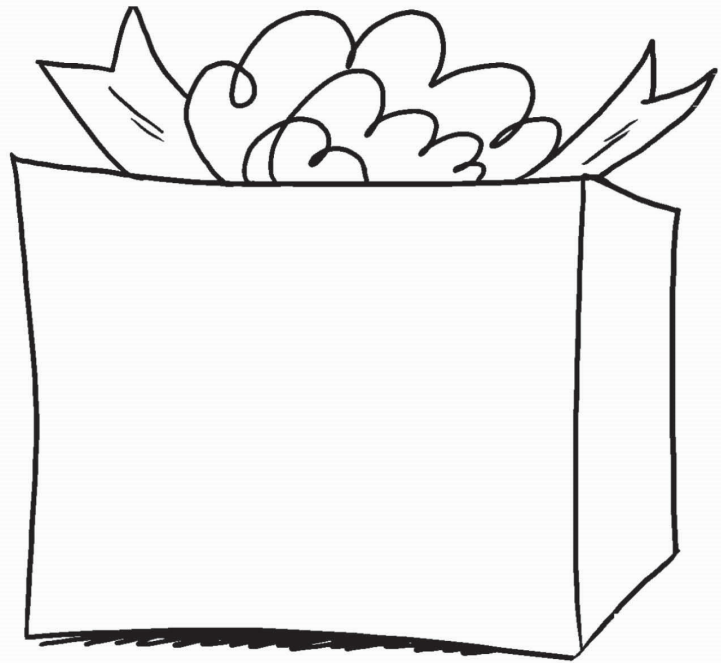
### Sharing the Gospel

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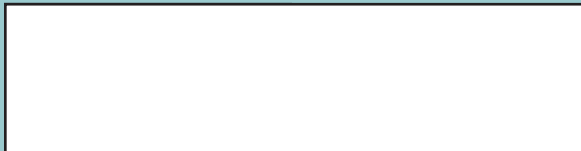
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
