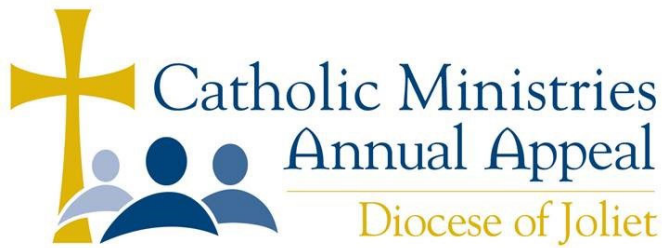

LENTEN REGULATIONS AND THE EASTER TRIDUUM

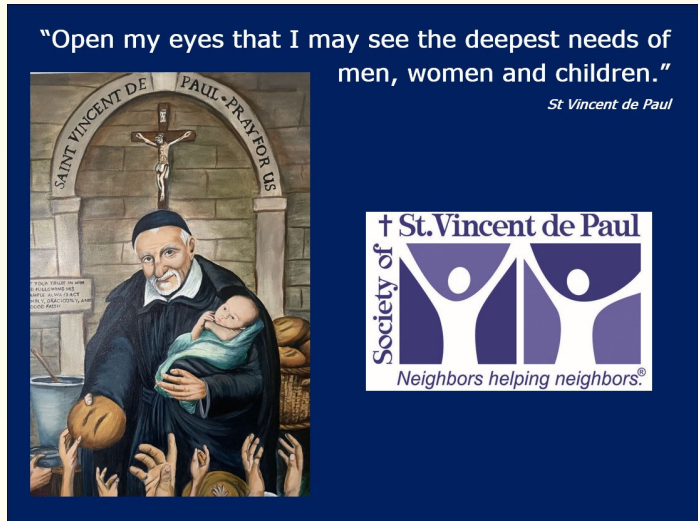
1. Everyone 14 years of age or over is bound to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent.
2. Everyone 18 years of age and under 59 years of age is bound to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.
3. On these two days of fast and abstinence, only one full meatless meal is allowed. Two other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted on these two days, but liquids, including milk and fruit juices are allowed. When health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige.
4. To disregard completely the law of fast and abstinence is seriously sinful.
5. Lent is the principal season of penance in the Christian year. All of the faithful are strongly urged to develop and follow a program of voluntary self-denial (in addition to following the Lenten regulations), serious prayer, and a performance of works of charity and mercy.

SHOP-SES

SHOP-SES IS FREE MONEY FOR OUR PARISH

SHOP-SES is a pre-paid card program in which the parish can purchase store gift cards at a discount. By selling the cards at face value, the parish can generate additional funds without costing the parishioners additional money. Cards are used as cash at the various stores. All you need to do is purchase them prior to making your regular purchases. A list of cards immediately available can be found on the parish website <https://www.sesnaperville.org/shop-ses>.

Last year SHOP-SES generated over **\$2,450** for the parish. Since SHOP-SES started in January 2011, the program has generated over **\$70,000** for the parish. This happened \$1.00 at a time by parishioners using the SHOP-SES program.

Friday, February 20 at 6:00 pm in Church

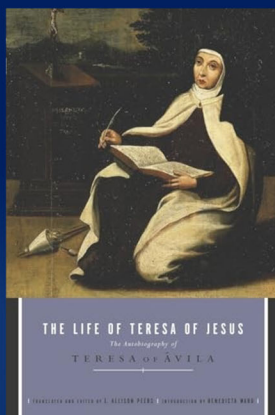


Please join us for a family friendly presentation of the Stations of the Cross. **The reflection for each Station of the Cross is presented through the eyes of children who might have been present during Jesus' crucifixion.** There also is a slide presentation to help younger children visualize the reflections that are spoken. Deacon Gerard will lead us in prayer while our teens in family faith formation share the reflections, as we walk to each of the 14 Stations that hang on the walls in church. (You may also remain seated.)

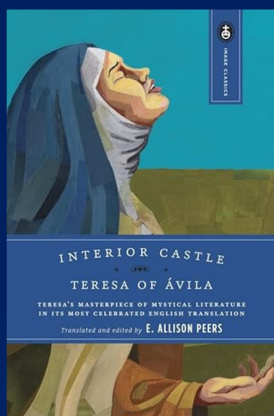
The Stations of the Cross is a powerful way to introduce children to the story of Jesus' Passion (His suffering and death), breaking it down into discrete pieces that kids can understand. As we pray, we enter into the mystery of Jesus' gift of Himself to us. This form of prayer involves our senses, our thoughts and our emotions. As we pray from station to station, listening to the story of Jesus' journey, we experience Jesus' tremendous love for us. This leads us to reflect on how we can embrace this love of Jesus and bring it into the world.

One of the blessings of praying the Stations of the Cross is a profound gratitude for Jesus' unconditional, self-sacrificing love. Our gratitude leads to overflowing generosity and a desire to love others as we are loved.

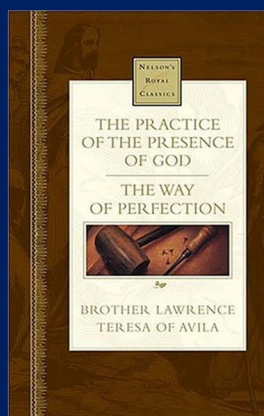
