


EXTRAORDINARY MINISTER TRAINING SESSION

Lenten Giving Project

St. Elizabeth Seton SVdP Conference

“We are more than just a Truck!”

You now know that the SES St. Vincent de Paul Conference has been active for sixteen years! But did you know that SES SVdP Conference members are known as “Vincentians” and have been called as volunteer parishioners to love and support our neighbors in need? Or did you know that Vincentians are required to take on-going training in order to conduct face-to-face interviews and provide compassionate support in what is known as a “Home Visit”?

The Home Visit includes several components including beginning and ending **Prayer**; assurances that any information shared remains **Confidential**; Teams of three must meet with the neighbor for **Safety**; **Humility**; and **Compassionate Listening** without judgement while providing encouragement.

These visits take place in a setting, usually the neighbor’s home, which offers a level of comfort and dignity for the neighbor seeking assistance. Vincentians gather relevant financial expenses and obtain permission to speak on the neighbor’s behalf with landlords, credit unions, and utility providers, to name a few.

The results of Home Visits often lead to providing emergency financial assistance such as preventing evictions or homelessness, car payments to allow continued employment, payment for utilities that may be 1-2 months behind, or gift cards for gas or food. There are also intangible results such as this new neighbor **transforming** the Vincentian while also **becoming transformed**.

Did you know?

You can reduce your Federal Income Tax bill by making a charitable contribution to St. Elizabeth Seton from your IRA via a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD).

A few things:

1. You must be over age 70½ at the time of the distribution.
2. You are NOT required to itemize your deductions to obtain the tax benefit.
3. QCD can count towards your annual Required Minimum Distribution (RMD).

The rules for QCD's are very complex, and you should consult with your tax advisor as soon as possible in order to maximize your tax benefit.

2. Download the **ListenWIFI** app to your Smartphone through the Apple Store or Google Play Store.

4. Make sure you're wearing earbuds or have your Smartphone connected to your hearing aids and set the volume to a comfortable level.

Sticking to health and fitness goals during the winter can be challenging .

I can do all things through him who strengthens.
- Philippians 4:13

Here's a few ideas to keep it simple and fun. You are worth it.

- Partner with a friend and keep each other accountable. Even a 20 minute walk is beneficial. Plus, the days are getting longer, so there are a few more minutes and opportunities to step out.
- Do just 1–2 exercises per muscle group and 1–2 sets per exercise. Do this for up to 15 minutes at a time, in 3-5 sessions per week.
- Take the stairs!
- Make it purposeful! Walk, carry a bag and gloves and pick up trash. Taking care of the environment and your surroundings elevates the activity .
- Housework counts! Some days, there won't be time to workout because there's chores to be done. Vacuuming can burn 100-200 calories/hour. Laundry 50-100/hour and mopping up to 200/hour.
- Get the family involved and have fun while staying active.
- Exergaming (digital games that involve physical activity) such as Just Dance, Ring Fit adventure (Nintendo switch), Knockout Home Fitness, Wii games, or Pokémon Go.
- YouTube - so many options such as Pilates, stretching or Zumba
- For a low tech option, there are board games the whole family can enjoy such as Movez, Throw Throw Burrito and old school Twister.
- Include rest days. They're important for recovery and preventing injury and help muscles repair and grow.
- Nutrition - not restriction. Eat whole foods, grains, fiber, stay hydrated . This will energize and fuel you for the day and the next workout.
