“The Heart of Christ”

Dear SES Friends,

*St. Vincent de Paul was born in 1581 in France and ordained a priest in 1600 to help support his family. He initially planned to devote his ministry to serving the wealthy. However, one day he was called to hear the last confession of a peasant who was near death, and St. Vincent’s life was completely **transformed**. Moved by the suffering he witnessed, Vincent resolved to dedicate his life to serving the poor.*


*Nearly two hundred years later, in 1853, Frederic Ozanam - then a student and professor at the Sorbonne in Paris, was struck by the poverty surrounding him. When someone challenged him saying: **“you are always talking about the poor but never doing anything for them”**, Frederic decided to take action. He gathered six of his friends, and together they founded the Society of St. Vincent de Paul, adopting St. Vincent de Paul as their patron and supreme model for combining charity with social action. The Society quickly spread throughout the world and arrived in the United States in 1845.*

Fast forward about 165 years when I began my service as a member of the SES St. Vincent de Paul Conference. I was invited to attend what I thought was an informational meeting but in reality it was an induction meeting. Suddenly I was the newest Vincentian! I knew that one of the primary objectives of the Society was to provide service to those in need, but I had no idea that such need existed right within our parish boundaries.

*My team’s first three cases dealt with neighbors’ electricity being shut off due to unpaid bills. The reconnection fee alone was \$150 for each neighbor, on top of their delinquent payments. Through our first fundraiser, so generously supported by our parish, we were able to help those neighbors return to light and warmth. That first act of compassion has set the tone through all these years! To this day our Parish community has continued to support our work with great faith and generosity. Through your support, you are also serving the poor who are so close to **the Heart of Christ**.*

The Gift We Didn't Expect Catholic Cares Ministry



Adoration Chapel and **LENT**

When we imagine parenthood, we often picture milestones and celebrations. For some families, those expectations change when a child is born with or later diagnosed with a disability. The news can bring fear, grief, and uncertainty. Yet, in time, many families discover something deeper - a profound encounter with God's grace.

In the Gospel of John (9: 1-3), when asked why a man was born blind, Jesus answers, *"It is so that the works of God might be made visible through him."* These words remind us that every child is intentionally created by God. No life is a mistake. Each person reflects His image and carries infinite dignity.

Raising a child with disabilities requires patience, resilience, and trust. There may be therapies, challenges at school, or moments of isolation. But there are also extraordinary joys: a hard-won milestone, a new word spoken after months of effort, a smile that lights up the room. These moments become reminders that God is present in the small and the ordinary.

Children with disabilities teach us what truly matters. Human worth is not measured by productivity or independence, but by love. The church affirms that those who experience suffering are united in a special way with Christ, revealing that strength is found in weakness.

As a parish community, we are called to reflect Christ's welcome. A smile, patience during Mass, and inclusion in religious education can make a world of difference. Every child belongs in the Church. Every family deserves to feel at home.

What may feel like an unexpected path often becomes a sacred calling. Through these children, the works of God are indeed made visible - teaching all of us how to love more deeply and trust more fully.

How Is Your Conversation With God?




Very few things are a greater aid to prayer than scripture. All scripture is the inspired Word of God written down by human authors. The Holy Spirit, the Spirit of Truth, moved the human authors to write those things that are necessary for us to know for our salvation, and therefore scripture is without error—it is a revelation from God, and makes God present among us. When we meditate on the Gospels, we get to know Jesus in a particular way.



Praying with scripture is different from analyzing scripture. Praying with scripture is entering into a dialogue with God. **This means having a conversation with Him where we take turns listening and talking.** God speaks to us in His Word. And we must listen. God Himself is in the sacred scripture. When we read the Bible, we are not reading a piece of information or history or literature. It is an encounter with God Himself! God is truth, and He is all knowing. Since He knows our hearts even better than we do, God will communicate to us through His Word exactly what we need at any given moment! This is one reason why we don't stop reading the Bible once we have read it. We read it throughout our lives! It is the Living Word of God.

One way to pray with scripture is to go to a quiet place, select a short passage or verse, and read it slowly and deliberately. Read it more than once. **Ask yourself: what does the scripture passage say to me?** How can I apply it to my own life? If you're reading from the Gospels, ask yourself: What does the scripture passage tell me about Jesus. How should Jesus's words change how I live my life? Sometimes you will sense that God is speaking directly to you through His Living Word. **This gives us encouragement and at other times it might awaken our conscience.**


Sharing the Gospel


