# Holy Week 2026



## Come and Celebrate the Most Important Days of the Year

On the evening of Holy Thursday, Lent comes to an end, and we enter into the Three Days that are the center of our year: The Easter Triduum

*On these Three Days, the Church is at its best.* In song, scripture, and ritual, we proclaim the heart of what we believe and celebrate throughout the year. We gather often - at church, at home - during the Triduum to reflect on the central reality of our faith: the death and resurrection of Jesus. During these Three Days, Christians renew their vows and new Christians are initiated. These are the “high holy days” of Christianity.

*Begin plans now to celebrate with our community these most significant days.*

## The Mass of Chrism



On Monday of Holy Week, Bishop Dennis Spies will bless the Holy Oils at a liturgy in our Cathedral in Joliet. There are three types of oil that will be blessed. The Oil of Catechumens is used for Baptism. The Oil of the Sick is used when celebrating the Anointing of the Sick. The Holy Chrism is used when celebrating Baptism, Confirmation and Holy Orders. Chrism is also used for the blessing of Church walls and altars at their dedication. Each parish from our Diocese will receive their sacred oils from this Mass and they will be presented to our parish at the evening Mass of the Lord’s Supper on Holy Thursday. Throughout the year, we will use them for the celebration of the Sacraments. They are kept on display in the Ambry by the Baptismal font.

## Holy Thursday - April 2

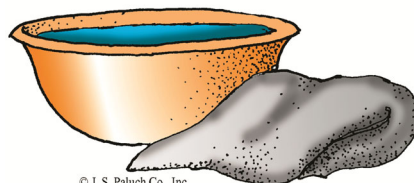
Morning Prayer - 8:15 A.M.

Adoration of the Eucharist in the Chapel will end at 6:00 P.M.

Evening Mass of the Lord’s Supper - 7:00 P.M.

Holy Thursday evening brings an end to Lent, as we enter the Triduum. In the Gospel reading John tells us that Jesus washed the feet of his disciples, and told them, “as I have done, so you must do.” The feet of twelve parishioners will be washed as a symbol of our service to one another. This ritualistic action of washing the feet is called *Mandatum*, and has been part of our heritage since the early church.

At the conclusion of the Liturgy, the Blessed Sacrament will be taken in procession to the “place of repose” for private adoration in the Day Chapel. Drawing upon the Old Testament imagery of the Arc of the Covenant, the Eucharist will be reposed in the tabernacle. Our building will be open until midnight. We strongly encourage you to stop in for a few moments of quiet prayer. At 11:45 P.M., a night prayer service will be held. As Holy Thursday ends, the Eucharist will then be placed in reserve in a non-public place. The church is stripped of all decoration in preparation for the Celebration of the Passion on Good Friday.



## Good Friday - April 3

### Easter Fast

Good Friday is a day of fast and abstinence. Because Lent is over, it is not a Lenten Fast but rather considered an Easter Fast. All are encouraged to keep this fast also on Holy Saturday. Although not required on Holy Saturday, keeping the fast is a way of continuing to prepare for Easter.

### Morning Prayer - 8:15 A.M.

Morning Prayer at 8:15 A.M. marks the beginning of our commemoration of the Lord's Passion. This is the only day of the year when Mass is not celebrated. At morning prayer, we will pray psalms and prayers that remind us of the Lord's great deeds for us.

### Stations of the Cross - 3:00 P.M.

The Knights of Columbus will lead our parish in the Stations. We recall through this journey the passion and death of Jesus. At the conclusion of the service, all will be invited to venerate the cross.



### The Commemoration of the Passion - 7:00 P.M.

The Commemoration of the Passion includes the readings of the Passion, offering of intercessory prayers and the Solemn Veneration of the Cross. Holy Communion that was consecrated on Holy Thursday will be distributed. Please bring the whole family and friends and join us for the Passion and Veneration of the Cross.

## Holy Saturday - April 4

### Morning Prayer - 8:15 A.M.

### Food Blessing - 1:00 P.M.

The tradition of blessing food is a beautiful way of celebrating the joy of Easter. We bless the foods that we have been fasting from during the days of Lent. On Easter Sunday, this blessed food is shared to celebrate the Lord's New Life.

### Easter Vigil - 7:30 P.M.

On Saturday evening, we will celebrate the Easter Vigil. In the darkness, we will assemble with a bonfire to light the paschal candle and process to the Worship Space. This holy night is the most solemn memorial of the entire year. It is our remembrance of the central mystery of redemption, Christ's saving death and glorious resurrection.

Because of the length and time of this service, we do not encourage families with infants or small children to attend.

## Catholics Care

Life with a disability is often misunderstood. In a world that prizes productivity, independence, and achievement, adults with disabilities can be overlooked or underestimated. Yet within the life of the Church, we are reminded of a deeper truth: every person is created in the image and likeness of God (Genesis 1:27). Human dignity does not depend on ability, efficiency, or independence. It is inherent, sacred, and unchanging.

Adults with disabilities enrich our parish communities in countless ways. They witness to perseverance, trust, and the beauty of relationships built on patience and love. Their presence calls us to slow down, to notice, to listen more carefully. They remind us that worth is not earned but given by God.

The Church affirms this clearly. The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops teaches that persons with disabilities are not only recipients of pastoral care but full participants in the Body of Christ. They have the right to the sacraments, to catechesis, to friendship, to service, and to leadership within the community according to their gifts.

True inclusion goes beyond accessibility ramps and seating accommodations—though those are important. It means greeting one another by name. It means making room in ministries, Bible studies, choirs, and service projects. It means recognizing the gifts each person brings, whether visible or hidden.

As a parish, we are called to be a family. In a family, we do not measure value by ability. We accompany one another. We celebrate strengths. We carry burdens together.

May we continue to grow as a community where every adult—regardless of physical, intellectual, or developmental ability—knows they belong, are needed, and are deeply loved by Christ.

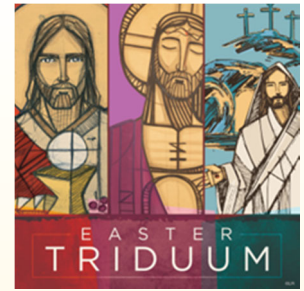

The word **HOLY** means “to set apart.” Throughout the year, we keep every Sunday holy—a day “set apart” for God. **Now we are setting apart an entire week for God!**

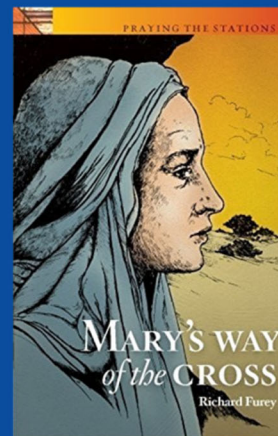
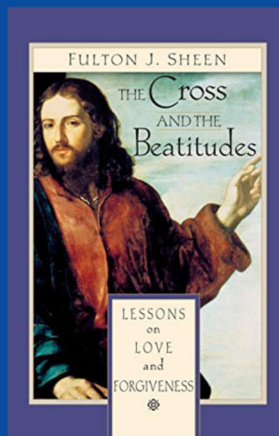
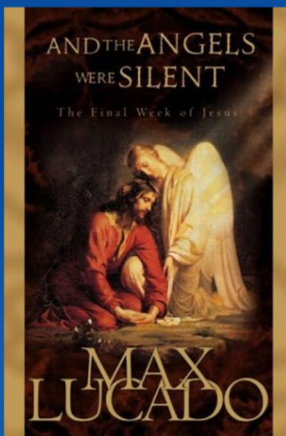
Holy Week is a time “set apart” from the rest of the calendar so we can participate in the suffering, Death, and Resurrection of Jesus Christ. Holy Week begins on **Palm Sunday** and reaches its climax on the **Paschal Triduum** which means “the three days.” What are those 3 holy days? Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Holy Saturday.

The Triduum, one continuous Liturgy that begins on Holy Thursday and ends on Holy Saturday at the Easter Vigil, tells “**Our Christian Story of Salvation.**” And we don’t watch this story on a screen, **we participate** in the story through prayer, petition, sorrow, and praise. We are part of the action.

**This year Holy Week falls during Spring Break so it will take effort and planning to keep our eyes focused on Jesus.** If you are travelling visit <https://masstimes.org/> to find a church nearby to attend the Triduum Liturgies. If you are in town, the times of the liturgies at St. Elizabeth Seton are listed in this bulletin, please participate with your family.

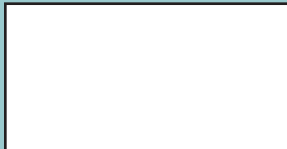
