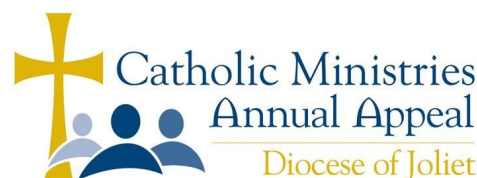

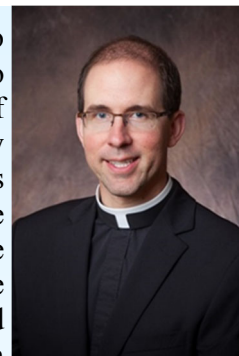
Pre-Baptism Meeting

TRANSITIONAL HOUSING MINISTRY

HELP NEEDED

The Transitional Housing Ministry is one of the many Ministries of the Christian Service Commission here at St. Elizabeth Seton that enable the parish community to put into practice the social justice teachings of the Catholic Church. It is a outreach ministry, in partnership with Bridge Communities, designed to assist homeless families in DuPage County transition from homelessness to independence. It has been a vibrant, successful Ministry here at St. Elizabeth Seton for over 25 years, and we would like to continue successfully transitioning families in DuPage County from homelessness to independence in the years to come.

Currently, with the dedication of 6 volunteers, we are mentoring two families, both of which are making progress toward reaching their goal of providing a better life for their families. However, there is an ever increasing need to provide help to those who are finding themselves facing homelessness. Recently Bridge Communities has reached out to us to see if we would consider mentoring more families. But in order to do this we need help. ***WE NEED MENTORS***

Mentors play an integral part of each family's success. It is a role that is both challenging, and yet extremely rewarding. Our current, and past mentors are grateful for the experiences gained through working with their families. We pair 3 mentors for each family. Mentoring consists of weekly meetings with our guest families. Goals, budgeting, and other concerns are discussed at these meetings.

Bridge Communities, provides case managers, training and ongoing support for all mentors. The training is comprehensive, insightful and very interesting. In addition, all mentors need to complete the Protecting God's Children Program that is required by the Diocese of Joliet for all those who work with children.

Please pray and consider becoming a part of this Ministry. It is in responding to the needs of our neighbors and working for social justice that we show our love for the Lord.

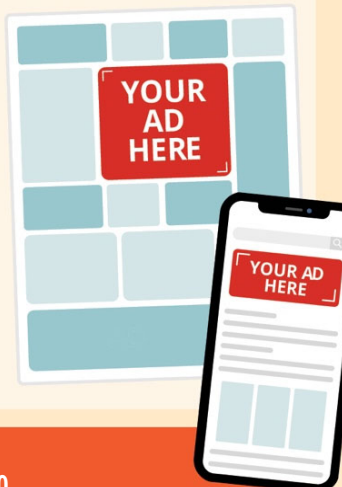

Each year from September 1 to October 4, our Christian family unites for the worldwide celebration of prayer and action to protect our common home. It is a special season when we celebrate God as our Creator and acknowledge Creation as the divine continuing act that calls us to love and care for the gift of all that is created. We rejoice in this opportunity to safeguard our common home and all beings who share it. This year, the theme for the season of creation is "Peace with Creation."

**We begin with the World Day of Prayer

**And end with the Feast of St. Francis, beloved by
many as the patron saint of ecology,
on October 4th.**

The Biblical text for this year is Isaiah 33. The prophet Isaiah pictured the desolated Creation without peace because of the lack of justice and the broken relationship between God and humankind. This description of devastated cities and wastelands eloquently stresses the fact that human destructive behaviors have a negative impact on the Earth. There is still hope for a peaceful Earth, a more beautiful Earth.

To hope does not mean to stand still and quiet, but to act, pray, change and reconcile with Creation and our Creator in unity.

What will you do as an action during this Season of Creation?

Some important points to keep in mind for this drive:

- ♦ **Items we can accept:** bagged or boxed clean clothing (gently used to well-worn, but no hangers), shoes, baby clothing, linens, blankets, throw pillows, tablecloths, curtains, small rugs, towels, books with no broken binding or missing pages, cookware, dishes, glasses, utensils, pictures, lamps with no halogen bulbs, small household items, working countertop appliances, toys, and sporting goods (except skis, larger exercise equipment, bowling balls). Please place breakable items in boxes with packing such as newspaper.
- ♦ **Items we cannot accept are:** chemicals, TVs, monitors, drapes, drapery rods, blinds, baby equipment, baby furniture, textbooks, encyclopedias, magazines, carpeting, mattresses, box springs, and larger household items. Anything with mildew, mold or musty odors.
- ♦ **Please follow the designated drop-off lane.** Please open the trunk when a volunteer approaches your vehicle or have doors unlocked for volunteer to open. Volunteers will remove the bags and hand you a tax receipt if desired.

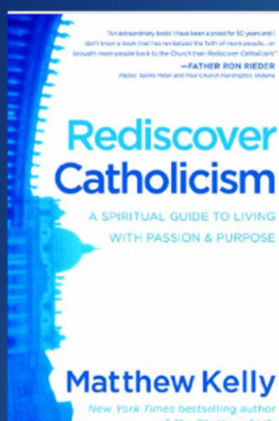
What is the Greatest Prayer in the World?

The greatest prayer in the world is the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. It is the offering of the Son of God to the Father in the Eucharist. The holy Mass is the perfect prayer of adoration, thanksgiving, praise and petition to the heavenly Father. **St. John Vianney said**, “Put all the good works in the world against one Holy Mass; they will be as a grain of sand beside a mountain.” **St. Gregory the Great said**, “The heavens open and multitudes of angels come to assist in the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass.” The Mass gives us a glimpse into heaven.



The Mass is also at the core of our Family Faith Formation journey and our lives as Catholics. God knew that we would need to encounter His living Word, receive His living body and be supported by our family of God every week so He gave us 3rd commandment, “Keep Holy the Sabbath.” The Mass is the source of our Catholic faith, where we receive God’s mercy, grace and strength.

When you sit down with your family for dinner tonight, ask if you can serve the food. You may surprise your parents and get some pretty big smiles from them.

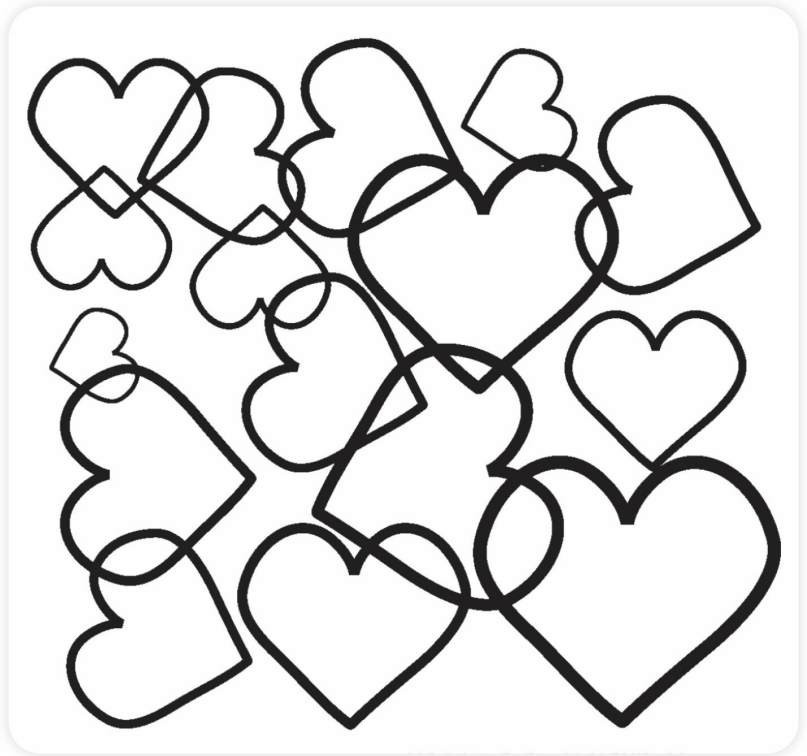
Sharing the Gospel

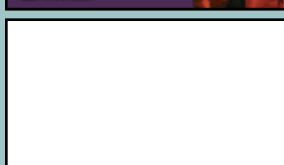


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
