Message from Fr. Scott

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

As we present our financial report for the past fiscal year, I want to thank you for your generosity, participation, and continued care for St. Elizabeth Seton Parish. Behind every number are parishioners who believe in our parish and share in its spiritual mission.

Your generosity made many accomplishments possible. Donations completely covered the cost of our new hymnals, while new cost-saving initiatives reduced utility, supply, and service expenses. Our Lenten Giving Project raised more than \$30,000 for the St. Vincent de Paul Society, and Share Christmas provided 852 gifts for children in need. These efforts reflect the generous heart of our parish and our desire to recognize and serve Christ in others.

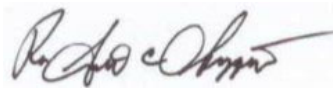
We also faced more than \$93,000 in necessary and higher-than-anticipated expenses. These included \$13,700 for elevator repairs, \$13,000 for church roof repairs, \$6,500 for boiler repairs, \$20,000 for window replacements in the rectory and lower level, and approximately \$40,000 for snow removal.

Looking ahead, a professional assessment found our parking lots to be in fair-to-poor condition, with comprehensive rehabilitation projected to cost nearly \$500,000. Our parking lot campaign has already raised more than \$125,000 in only a few months - an encouraging beginning toward this significant need. We must also address water infiltration around the church's aging windows, including failed glass units, deteriorated sealant, flashing concerns, and localized roofing and siding repairs.

At the Bishop's request, our parish will also continue its support of All Saints Catholic Academy. Together with the tuition assistance we provide to parish families, our support of the school will total nearly \$60,000 next year.

Thank you not only for your financial generosity, but also for your prayers, volunteer service, and faithful participation in our worship and ministries. May God continue to bless you and guide us as we care for the parish and mission entrusted to us.

Born Peter John Sheen on May 8, 1895, to farmer Newt Sheen and his wife, Delia, in El Paso, Illinois, **Archbishop Fulton J. Sheen will be beatified on Thursday, September 24, 2026 in St. Louis. You might ask, "Who is Fulton Sheen?"**

Father Fulton Sheen taught theology and philosophy, for 23 years at Catholic University of America, where he honed his skills as a scholar, orator and evangelist. **His talents as a brilliant preacher were quickly recognized.** In 1926, he was invited to record a series of Lenten sermons on a New York radio station. Four years later, the young priest was asked to fill-in for two weeks on *The Catholic Hour* radio program. The audience response was so positive that he was asked to continue as a weekly speaker on the show.



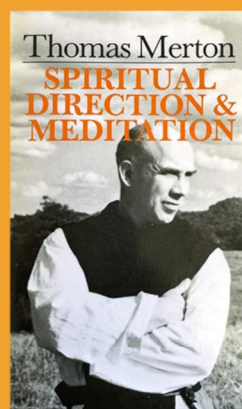
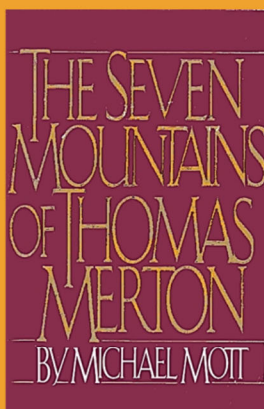
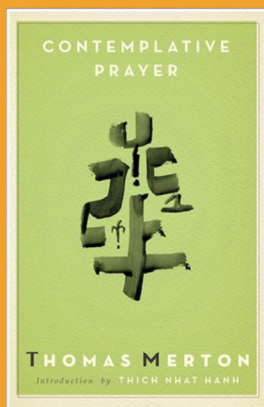
From 1930 to 1950, Father (then Monsignor) Sheen's weekly talks on *The Catholic Hour* presented Catholic teaching in a way that had never been done before. **Drawing from the deep well of his faith and scholarship, Professor Sheen addressed topics ranging from devotion to the Blessed Mother to the dangers of Communism.** Rooted in his thorough knowledge of the philosophical thought of St. Thomas Aquinas, he preached the Gospel and showed how it applies to personal moral decisions and the great social issues of the time.

He was consecrated a bishop on June 11, 1951. **In the Fall of that year, he began his famous television series, *Life is Worth Living*. It was a tremendous success, eventually reaching an estimated 30 million viewers each week, which would make it the most widely-viewed religious series in the history of television.** He was known to have led numerous people to convert to Catholicism. Bishop Sheen is credited with raising millions of dollars to support Catholic missions through the Society for the Propagation of the Faith. For 16 years, he led this effort for 129 dioceses throughout the United States, influencing the lives of tens of millions of people all over the world. He was also a prolific writer, completing 64 books during his life.

The miracle that led to his beatification was the extraordinary healing of a stillborn infant in Illinois in 2010. The child was declared stillborn after delivery and remained without a heartbeat or respiration for over an hour. While medical staff prepared a death certificate, the parents prayed specifically for Fulton Sheen's intercession and the child began to breath and today is a healthy boy.

Archbishop Fulton Sheen, pray for us and fill us with zeal, wisdom and truth to lead others to heaven.
