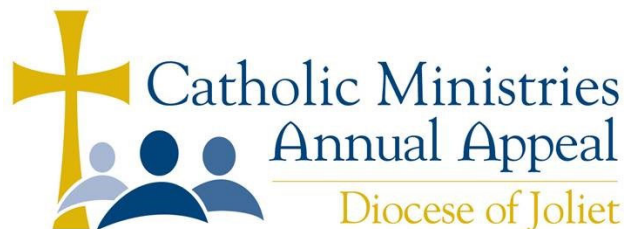

Seminarian Matthew Bernhard

Matthew Bernhard was born on August 4, 1999, to his loving parents Greg and Colleen.

He is the oldest of three boys, my younger brothers being Nathan and David.

He grew up going to Catholic school at St. Joseph's in Manhattan from kindergarten to eighth grade. Going to Catholic school for nine years fostered his love of God and Catholicism, providing him with a sturdy foundation as he entered public high school.

Beginning in high school, Matthew immediately became very active in the local youth group.

Through his constant involvement, he made many of my closest friends. He started going on retreats and mission trips which deepened his relationship with God. Through mission trips Matthew began to realize his passion for serv-

ing others.

"I started looking for opportunities to serve with in my parish, which I found in teaching religious education," he said. "I taught Confirmation prep for seventh and eighth graders, as well as First Reconciliation and First Communion prep for second graders. During high-school I went on multiple retreats and helped lead some as well. On one specific retreat called Steubenville, I had a profound experience while in adoration. During adoration I felt God's love in a way I had never experienced before.

"That experience showed me something that I already knew, that God's love was endless, and I started to experience it in



my heart."

Experiencing this truth in such a profound way motivated Matthew to strive for a deeper relationship with God, and through this he started to become more open to what He is calling him to.

As his heart became more open to what God was calling his to, he realized that God was calling him to seminary.

"I thought this desire would go away, but it only continued to grow. I decided to meet with my cousin Fr. Mark Bernhard to figure out how I could go about becoming a seminarian, and to see just what I would be getting myself into," Matthew said. "While I had many doubts about going to seminary, I had a burning desire to study for the priesthood. My cousin helped me reach out to the vocation director at that time, Fr. Burke Masters. It was not long

after meeting with him that I started filling out the application to seminary."

At the time he was beginning his first year at Joliet Junior College and pushed off the application to focus on school, but over the summer before his second year at JJC, Matthew still strongly desired seminary.

"Fr. Borello, the new Vocations Director, greatly supported me during my discernment and gave me the motivation to finally finish my," Matthew said. "I was accepted that summer during my time as a Totus Tuus team member and since entering seminary, I have never been happier. Looking back, I would never have imagined the personal growth that would have taken place in the first two years of my formation."

How to Support Your Priests

Parishioners can encourage the priesthood by praying daily for vocations

and for priests, by encouraging men they know to consider the priesthood, and by actively supporting the church's vocation ministry. Encouraging a priestly vocation includes

recognizing spiritual commitment, such as regular participation in prayer and spiritual events, and speaking to potential candidates to offer support and invite them to explore the

possibility of a vocation. A supportive community that fosters openness to God's call is crucial for men and women to discern and respond to a vocation to the priesthood or religious life.

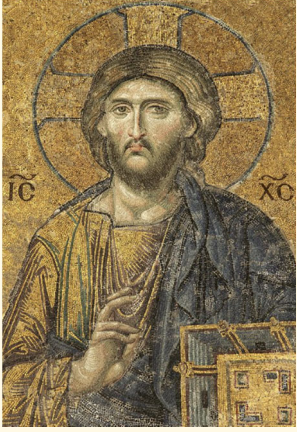

The Most Powerful Prayer

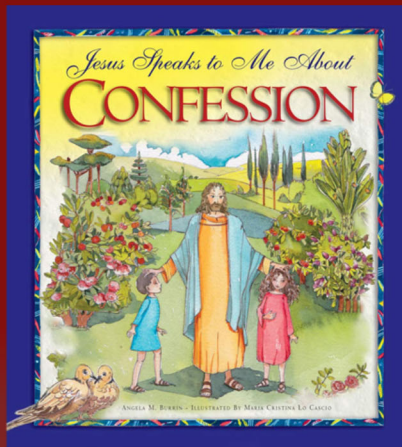
The shortest, simplest, and most powerful prayer in the world is called the “**Jesus Prayer**” also known as the prayer of the heart. “**Lord Jesus Christ, Son of God, have mercy on me, a sinner**” can be prayed at any time, in any situation, aloud or silently. As the Catechism says, “The invocation of the holy name of Jesus is the simplest way of praying always...”

The reason this prayer is so powerful is that the name of Jesus is not just a set of letters or sounds. It is not a passive word but a creative word, like the word by which God created the universe. **(He is the Word by which God created the universe!)** Every time we receive Christ in the Eucharist, we are instructed by the liturgy to pray, “Lord, I am not worthy to receive you, but only say the word and I shall be healed.” All our energy and effort is not strong enough to heal our own souls, but God’s word of power is. **That word is so powerful that by it God made the universe out of nothing, and by it He is doing the even greater deed of making saints out of sinners.**

That word is Jesus Christ.

The Jesus Prayer is simple to say but can be difficult to practice. You have to make time for it in your day. **Make room for it in your daily life and it will give life to your day.** Start by setting aside time to pray. Setting aside time allows the debris of daily life to dissipate in the repetition. After you are comfortable with the prayer, you can extend it throughout your day.
