





## STATE AID TO FAIRS

From the funds appropriated by the General Assembly of the State of Tennessee for the purpose of aiding agricultural fairs in the payment of agricultural premiums, the Henry County Fair Association will be allotted its appropriate share by the Tennessee Department of Agriculture.

## GENERAL RULES OF THE HENRY COUNTY FAIR

1. Everything possible will be done to prevent accidents; however, if any should occur, neither the Henry County Fair Association, nor the members of the board of directors of the Fair Association, nor University of Tennessee Extensive Service personnel, nor other person, nor any organization connected with the show assume any liability, either legal or otherwise, to persons or property.
2. The list of premiums and prizes in this catalog is subject to alterations, revisions or withdrawal with notice.
3. The Youth Products Division will be judged on the Danish System. All entries will receive a blue, red or white ribbon with prize money for blue and red only.
4. Exhibits in the products building must remain on display until the specified time listed under the respective departmental rules. All entries must have been made or produced since the previous fair.
5. All products and livestock must be entered and removed as indicated in each department.
6. All livestock entries must comply with health rules herein provided by the Tennessee Department of Agriculture.
7. The fair management reserves the right to remove from the grounds any entry which in its opinion poses a danger of spreading disease or doing other harm.
8. Tampering with any animal is prohibited. A list of tampering practices is on file in the County UT Extension Office. These will serve as the basis for arriving at a decision regarding any question in this area. Any disputes arising during any event of the Fair will be decided by the chairperson of the event or show and the executive committee of the Fair Board.
9. A 5% variance rule in scale weight will be enforced in regard to allowing underweight animals to show.
10. Junior Livestock entries must be exhibited and sold by the owner unless prior permission is granted by the fair board. All animals sold become the property of the buyer.
11. Junior Market Grand Champion and Reserve Champion of all 4 species must/will sell with no exceptions- exhibitor has no choice. Henry County Bred and Born Grand Champion and Reserve Champion will sell third and fourth in sale order with no guarantee of automatic selling because of showing multiple species. If showing more than one species, the exhibitor may choose which species is sold; if you show two lambs or two goats the highest placing animal must be the one sold.







- The Youth Division will be taken on Sunday, Aug. 11th from 3:00 p.m. - 5:00 p.m. and Monday, Aug. 12th from 3:00 p.m. - 6:00 p.m. must be removed 12:30 p.m. - 1:30 P.M. on Sunday, Aug. 18th. No entry may be removed before that time. Baking entries will be judged on Monday evening at 6:00 p.m.
- Items or articles which are entered for competition in any department of the Division must have been made by the person in whose name it is entered or exhibited.
- All articles must have been made since the last Fair. Any items that have been entered previously may not be entered again.
- Only one entry per person will be accepted in each lot.
- If there is no competition in a lot, the exhibitor will receive a premium at the discretion of the judges. The judges shall be instructed not to award premiums to articles not worthy of merit.
- The Youth Department will be judged on the Danish system. All entries will receive a blue, red, or white ribbon with prize money for blue and red. White ribbons denote participation. The X value listing below will represent premium paid for blue and red placings in each exhibit.
- Entries will be judged in four age categories: Primary - K-3rd grades; Junior - 4-5th grades; Junior High - 6-8th grades; Senior - 9-12th grades.



## TENNESSEE DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE DIVISION OF ANIMAL HEALTH

### SUMMARY: LIVESTOCK HEALTH REQUIREMENTS FOR FAIRS AND EXHIBITIONS

#### I. GENERAL:

- A. All stalls, pens, chutes, etc. located on the grounds of fairs and exhibitions shall be thoroughly cleaned and disinfected with a disinfectant approved by USDA, APHIS between each scheduled fair or exhibition.
- B. All livestock (except poultry and equine) which enter fairs and exhibitions shall be accompanied by an official Certificate of Veterinary Inspection with individual permanent identification. Certificates for this purpose shall be valid for ninety (90) days from date of issue. (Tennessee livestock only – out-of-state certificates are valid for thirty (30) days from the date of issue)
- C. No animal showing clinical signs of infectious or communicable disease shall be allowed to enter or remain on premises of fairs or exhibitions. It shall be the responsibility of the manager of each event to assure prompt removal of such animals.

#### II. LIVESTOCK AND POULTRY ORIGINATING WITHIN THE STATE OF TENNESSEE (Certificates of Veterinary Inspection Valid for a Period of Ninety (90) Days)

##### A. SWINE:

All swine which enter fairs and exhibitions shall be accompanied by an official Certificate of Veterinary Inspection with individual permanent identification or sufficient description to identify each animal.

##### B. CATTLE:

All cattle which enter fairs and exhibitions shall be accompanied by an official Certificate of Veterinary Inspection with individual permanent, official identification.

Lactating Dairy Cattle residing within Tennessee and moving to an exhibition, show, or sale within Tennessee (intrastate movement) do not require pre-movement HSN1 testing.

##### C. POULTRY:

- (1) Sponsors of poultry shows or exhibitions shall notify the Tennessee Department of Agriculture at least thirty (30) days prior to show or

- (2) CWD susceptible species must not move from a CWD affected County to a non-CWD affected County.

#### III. LIVESTOCK AND POULTRY ORIGINATING OUTSIDE THE STATE OF TENNESSEE

Livestock and Poultry entering fairs and exhibitions from areas outside the State of Tennessee shall be subject to current Tennessee import requirements. Please contact the state veterinarian's office regarding questions or recent changes to these rules. These interstate requirements are summarized as follows:

##### A. ALL SPECIES (except poultry):

Official Certificate of Veterinary Inspection valid for thirty (30) days and individual permanent official identification, except for equine. Equine must have sufficient description to identify the animal.

##### B. CATTLE:

Certificate of Veterinary Inspection and additional requirements as follows:

- (1) Tuberculosis: No requirements except for cattle originating from regions not considered free of tuberculosis.
- (2) Brucellosis: No requirements except for cattle originating from regions not considered free of brucellosis. Test eligible cattle - Intact males or female cattle eighteen (18) months or older. (Vaccinate and no-vaccinate)
- (3) Per the USDA Federal Order, all lactating dairy cattle originating outside the State of Tennessee must have a negative HSN1 test within seven (7) days of interstate movement. Lactating dairy cattle can move back to the state of origin within ten (10) days of test.

##### C. SWINE:

No testing requirements for swine unless originating from a region not considered free of Brucellosis and Pseudorabies.

##### D. HORSES AND OTHER EQUINES:

- (1) Brucellosis: Same requirements as for cattle.

##### (2) Tuberculosis:

- (a) All cervidae shall originate in herds which have had a negative herd test for tuberculosis within twelve (12) months with a USDA approved single cervical test and individual imported animals shall be negative to the single cervical test within thirty (30) days of entry; or
- (b) Animals not originating in tested herds as described above must test negative to two (2) single cervical tests at least ninety (90) days apart, the second test conducted not more than thirty (30) days prior to entry.

- (3) Two forms of identification (including official USDA official ID)

##### (4) CWD:

- (a) CWD susceptible species must be from a CWD Certified Herd

NOTE: (Contact an accredited veterinarian for further details of import rules).

IV. Fair association or exhibition or management shall inform exhibitors of the rules of this chapter and shall notify the State Veterinarian or her agent of any violations. Exhibitors shall present evidence of compliance with this chapter to the State Veterinarian or his agent upon request.

These rules constitute a minimum legal standard and in no way restrict the right of fair and exhibition managers to establish additional or more stringent requirements.

- (2) Poultry found not to be in apparent good health shall be removed immediately from any show or exhibition.

#### D. HORSES & OTHER EQUIDAE:

Horses and other Equidae six (6) months of age and older must have a negative Equine Infectious Anemia test within the preceding twelve (12) months.

#### E. SHEEP

(1) All sheep imported into or through Tennessee shall be accompanied by an official Certificate of Veterinary Inspection and be in compliance with 0080-2-1-.02, and Title 9, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 79.1 through 79.4.

(2) All sheep that move within the state, with the exception of wethers under the age of 18 months that are produced for slaughter only, including for change of ownership, shows, fairs, expositions or slaughter shall be permanently, individually identified by a method approved in Title 9, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 79.1 through 79.4.

#### F. GOATS

(1) Goats imported into or through Tennessee shall be accompanied by an official Certificate of Veterinary Inspection and be in compliance with 0080-2-1-.02, and Title 9, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 79.1 through 79.4.

(2) Goats imported into Tennessee for immediate slaughter to an approved slaughter establishment or to an approved livestock market for sale to a slaughter establishment shall only be required to have a transportation document and be in compliance with Title 9, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 79.1 through 79.4.

(3) All registered breeding goats, goats that have been commingled with sheep, goats for exhibition and dairy goats that move within the state, including for change of ownership, shows, fairs, expositions or slaughter shall be permanently, individually identified by a method approved in Title 9, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 79.1 through 79.4.

G. CAMELIDS: Camelids must have an official Certificate of Veterinary Inspection as provided in Rule 0080-2-3-.01 (1).

H. CAPTIVE CERVIDAE: Captive Cervidae must have an official Certificate of Veterinary Inspection as provided in Rule 0080-2-3-.01 (1).

(1) CWD susceptible species must have two forms of identification (including official USDA ID)

Animals six (6) months of age or older - negative equine infectious anemia (Coggins) test within twelve (12) months.

#### E. POULTRY:

Originate directly from a Pullorum-Typhoid Clean Flock and an HS17 Avian Influenza Clean Flock or be accompanied by evidence of a negative Pullorum-Typhoid test within ninety (90) days and a negative Avian Influenza test within twenty-one (21) days.

#### F. SHEEP

(1) All sheep imported into or through Tennessee shall be accompanied by an official Certificate of Veterinary Inspection and be in compliance with 0080-2-1-.02, and Title 9, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 79.1 through 79.4.

(2) All sheep that move within the state, including for change of ownership, shows, fairs, expositions or slaughter shall be permanently, individually identified by a method approved in Title 9, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 79.1 through 79.4.

#### G. GOATS

(1) Goats imported into or through Tennessee shall be accompanied by an official Certificate of Veterinary Inspection and be in compliance with 0080-2-1-.02, and Title 9, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 79.1 through 79.4.

(2) Goats imported into Tennessee for immediate slaughter to an approved slaughter establishment or to an approved livestock market for sale to a slaughter establishment shall only be required to have a transportation document and be in compliance with Title 9, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 79.1 through 79.4.

(3) All registered breeding goats, goats that have been commingled with sheep, goats for exhibition and dairy goats that move within the state, including for change of ownership, shows, fairs, expositions or slaughter shall be permanently, individually identified by a method approved in Title 9, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 79.1 through 79.4.

H. CAMELIDAE: Same requirements as for cattle.



## RULES

1. Competition is open to Henry County Youth ("Exhibitor") in grades 4-12 (as of January 1st) who are enrolled in 4-H or FFA. Hogs must be owned by the Exhibitor.
2. Exhibitors and hogs must be present at the official spring weigh-in and final weigh-in. Animals will be ear tagged for visual identification at spring weigh-in. Each Exhibitor may weigh two (2) hogs at spring weigh-in, but may only weigh one (1) hog at final weigh-in. Any "spare" hog must be assigned to a specific Exhibitor and may not be shown by any other Exhibitor. A "spare" hog may be shown in the Pre-4H Hog Show.
3. A registration tie fee of \$30 will be collected at spring weigh-in.
4. If an Exhibitor's hog dies 52 days or more before August 14, 2025, the Exhibitor may replace it with a new hog. The new hog may compete in the Livestock Show, but will not qualify for Average Daily Gain award. The new hog may be sold in the Auction.
5. Exhibitors must be certified for the Tennessee Youth Quality Assurance.
6. 1st and 2nd year Exhibitors must attend spring workshop.
7. All Exhibitors must attend all required meetings. Failure to attend required meetings may result in disqualification to participate in Livestock Show and Auction.
8. Hogs will be accepted at the Fair on Wednesday, August 13, 2024 at between 6:00 AM and 7:30 AM. Hogs will be weighed immediately, and must weigh 220 pounds minimum to qualify. Any hog deemed unruly or unsafe may be disqualified by the show chairman at any time before or during the show.
9. Hogs are to be groomed by the Exhibitor with assistance from (1) family members/legal guardians, (2) Henry County Extension Agents, (3) Henry County Ag Teachers, or (4) Alumni of the Henry County 4-H or FFA Livestock programs. No hog shall enter the Arena that has not been washed and groomed.
10. Classes will be determined by the Show Chairman based on weight. The Exhibitor must personally show and sell their hog. Any hog not participating in the show will not be permitted to participate in the Auction. Hogs will sell in an order determined by their place in the show, alternating by classes. Show awards will include Class Winner, Grand and

- Reserve Champion, and Bred and Born Grand and Reserve Champions.
11. Appropriate dress attire for the show and sale is professional show attire. Required items are boots, shirts with collars, and jeans without holes. Absolutely no t-shirts, sandals, overalls, hats or ball caps are allowed while in the ring. Showmanship will be judged in separate Showmanship classes following the Livestock Show. Exhibitors are responsible for having their photo taken with their hog, picking up the photo after the Fair, delivering the photo to their buyer, and arranging for delivery or delivering their hog to the appropriate location chosen by the buyer.
  12. Each exhibitor must complete a record book to qualify to show and sell their hog. Record books should reflect the exhibitor's work and experience during the project. All record books must be signed off on by the committee chair at the time of weigh-in for the HC Fair. This will serve as your way of "registering" your animal for the HC Show and Sale. Final record book will be due to the Extension Office on Monday immediately after the fair.
  13. Discourteous conduct by an Exhibitor or any person representing the exhibitor towards the Judges, show management, Fair staff, another exhibitor, or any other person may result in disqualification from showing and selling the animal. Any disputes arising before, during, or after the Fair will be resolved by the event chairperson and executive committee of the Fair Association.





All goats must have a Federally approved permanent scrappie tag in its ear.
2. Exhibitors and goats must be present at the official weigh-in. The scrapie tag will be the official identification. You may weigh-in two goats and show both but only sell one. A registration fee of \$30 will be collected at weigh-in. If an exhibitor's goat dies 52 days or more prior to the date of the Livestock Show, the goat may be replaced with a new goat. The new goat may only compete in the Livestock Show, but does not qualify for Average Daily Gain award. The new goat may be sold as normal.
3. Exhibitors must be certified for the Tennessee Youth Quality Assurance through the Extension Office.
4. Before the Fair, the exhibitor must attend all required meetings.
5. Goats will be accepted at the Fair on Wednesday between 4:00 – 5:00 PM. Goats will be weighed as they come off the trailer. Goats must weigh 60 pounds minimum to qualify to show.
6. Any goat deemed unruly or unsafe may be disqualified by the show chairman at any time before or during the show.
7. Goats are to be groomed by the Exhibitor with assistance from (1) family members/legal guardians, (2) Henry County Extension Agents, (3) Henry County Ag Teachers, or (4) Alumni of the Henry County 4-H or FFA Livestock programs.
8. Classes will be determined by the show chairman based on weight. The exhibitor must show and sell their goat personally. Any goat not participating in the show will not be permitted to participate in the sale. Goats will sell in an order determined by their place in the show, alternating by classes.
9. Show awards will include Class Winner, Grand and Reserve Champions, and Bred and Born Grand and Reserve Champions.
10. Appropriate dress attire for the show and sale is professional show attire. Required items are boots, shirts with collars and jeans without

holes. Absolutely no t-shirts, sandals, overalls, hats or ball caps are allowed while in the ring.

11. Showmanship classes will be held immediately following the final show class.
12. Exhibitors are responsible for having their photo taken with their goat, picking up the photo after the Fair, delivering the photo to their buyer, and arranging for delivery or delivering their goat to the appropriate location chosen by the buyer.
13. Each exhibitor must complete a record book to qualify to show and sell their goat. Record books should reflect the exhibitor's work and experience during the project. 





The new steer may only compete in the Livestock Show, but does not qualify for Average Daily Gain award. The new steer may be sold as normal.
3. Exhibitors must be certified for the Tennessee Youth Quality Assurance through the Extension Office.
4. Before the Fair, the exhibitor must attend all required meetings.
5. Steers will be accepted at the Fair on Wednesday, August 13, 2024 between 4:00 PM and 5:00 PM. Steers will be weighed Wednesday evening at a designated time. Steers must weigh 1,050 pounds minimum to qualify to show. Exhibitors must provide their own bedding of either shavings or sawdust. All steers must have an ultrasound performed at the designated place and time. All steers must be in their designated tie location, clean, and presentable by 9:00 PM.
6. Any steer deemed unruly or unsafe may be disqualified by the show chairman at any time before or during the show.
7. Steers are to be groomed by the Exhibitor with assistance from (1) family members/legal guardians, (2) Henry County Extension Agents, (3) Henry County Ag Teachers, or (4) Alumni of the Henry County 4-H or FFA Livestock programs/
8. Grooming of steers must be done in the barn or in the area outside of the barn designated by the show chairman.
9. Classes will be determined by the show chairman based on weight. The exhibitor must show and sell their steer personally. Any steer not participating in the show will not be permitted to participate in the sale. Steers will sell in an order determined by their place in the show, alternating by classes.
10. Show awards will include Class Winner, Grand and Reserve Champions, and Bred and Born Grand and Reserve Champions.
11. Appropriate dress attire for the show and sale is professional show

attire. Required items are boots, shirts with collars and jeans without holes. Absolutely no t-shirts, sandals, overalls, hats or ball caps are allowed while in the ring.

12. Showmanship classes will be held immediately following the final show class.
13. Exhibitors are responsible for having their photo taken with their steer, picking up the photo after the Fair, delivering the photo to their Steer's buyer, and arranging for delivery or delivering their steer to the appropriate location chosen by the buyer.
14. Each exhibitor must complete a record book to qualify to show and sell their steer. Record books should reflect the exhibitor's work and experience during the project. All record books must be signed off on by the committee chair at the time of weigh-in for the HC Fair. This will serve as your way of "registering" your animal for the HC Show and Sale. Final record book will be due to the UT Extension Office the Monday immediately following the show.
15. Discourteous conduct by an Exhibitor, their family, or other persons representing the exhibitor towards the Judges, show management, Fair staff, another exhibitor, or any other person will result in disqualification from showing and selling the animal.
16. Any disputes arising before, during, or after the Fair will be resolved by the event chairperson and executive committee of the Fair Association.
17. All 1st and 2nd year exhibitors are required to attend the Steer Workshop following spring weigh-in.





The Ham Awards will be presented to the Champion and Reserve Champion ham in three divisions: Junior, Junior High and Senior High. A Grand Champion Ham will be chosen from the division champions. Scoring will combine the scores from the ham contest, speech contest, and record book. Each participant's contest ham will be sold at auction at the Fair. Participants will keep the auction dollars raised at the fair.
4. Participants may cure their hams at the Clifty Farm Ham House, or they may home cure their hams.
5. Participants must attend 3 of 5 planned meetings.
6. Participants must present a three to five minute speech.
7. A Country Ham processing record book must be submitted at the speech contest.
8. Meetings will be held at the Clifty Farm Ham House at 1500 Highway 641 South.
9. This program is open to 4-H and FFA members who do not have an animal in the livestock projects (steers, lambs, hogs, goats) at the fair.






