He was raised in Henry County and graduated from Henry County High School in 1984. While in high school he served the Future Farmers of America, Paris Chapter as Secretary. STATE AID TO FAIRS

From the funds appropriated by the General Assembly of the State of Tennessee for the purpose of aiding agricultural fairs in the payment of agricultural premiums, the Henry County Fair Association will be allotted its appropriate share by the Tennessee Department of Agriculture.

GENERAL RULES

Of The Henry County Fair

1. Everything possible will be done to prevent accidents; however, if any should occur, neither the Henry County Fair Association, nor the members of the board of directors of the Fair Association, nor University of Tennessee Extensive Service personnel, nor other person, nor any organization connected with the show assume any liability, either legal or otherwise, to persons or property.
2. The list of premiums and prizes in this catalog is subject to alterations, revisions or withdrawal with notice.
3. The Youth Products Division will be judged on the Danish System. All entries will receive a blue, red or white ribbon with prize money for blue and red only.
4. Exhibits in the products building must remain on display until the specified time listed under the respective departmental rules. All entries must have been made or produced since the previous fair.
5. All products and livestock must be entered and removed as indicated in each department.
6. All livestock entries must comply with health rules herein provided by the Tennessee Department of Agriculture.
7. The fair management reserves the right to remove from the grounds any entry which in its opinion poses a danger of spreading disease or doing other harm.
8. Tampering with any animal is prohibited. A list of tampering practices is on file in the County UT Extension Office. These will serve as the basis for arriving at a decision regarding any question in this area. Any disputes arising during any event of the Fair will be decided by the chairperson of the event or show and the executive committee of the Fair Board.
9. A 5% variance rule in scale weight will be enforced in regard to allowing underweight animals to show.
10. Junior Livestock entries must be exhibited and sold by the owner unless prior permission is granted by the fair board. All animals sold become the property of the buyer.
11. Junior Market Grand Champion and Reserve Champion of all 4 species must/will sell with no exceptions- exhibitor has no choice. Henry County Bred and Born Grand Champion and Reserve Champion will sell third and fourth in sale order with no guarantee of automatic selling because of showing multiple species. If showing more than one species, the exhibitor may choose which species is sold; if you show two lambs or two goats the highest placing animal must be the one sold...

Community Building

During the week of the Henry County Fair, this building is used for the Exhibit Hall. All Youth, Adult, and Horticulture Department entries can be found on display here. Exhibits are entered on Sunday from 3:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m. and Monday from 12:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m. Flower basket entries are Wednesday from 9 a.m. to 11 a.m.

*These rules apply to the entire Youth Division.
Note the exceptions which may apply to the specific departments.*

Rules

1. Youth include any individual attending any grade or high school in Paris or Henry County or who has finished high school in the spring prior to the fair or in Kindergarten during the previous school year. (Entrants do not necessarily have to be in 4-H).
2. The Youth Division will be taken on Sunday, Aug. 13th from 3:00 p.m. - 5:00 p.m. and Monday, Aug. 14th from 12:00 p.m. - 6:00 p.m. must be removed 12:30 p.m. - 1:30 P.M. on Sunday, Aug. 20th. No entry may be removed before that time. Baking entries will be judged on Monday evening at 6:00 p.m.
3. Items or articles which are entered for competition in any department of the Division must have been made by the person in whose name it is entered or exhibited.
4. All articles must have been made since the last Fair. Any items that have been entered previously may not be entered again.
5. Only one entry per person will be accepted in each lot.
6. If there is no competition in a lot, the exhibitor will receive a premium at the discretion of the judges. The judges shall be instructed not to award premiums to articles not worthy of merit.
7. The Youth Department will be judged on the Danish system. All entries will receive a blue, red, or white ribbon with prize money for blue and red. White ribbons denote participation. The X value listing below will represent premium paid for blue and red placings in each exhibit.
8. Entries will be taken in three age categories. Junior includes youth in grade K-5; junior high included youth in grades 6-8; and senior grades 9-12. Judging will be done in three groups as stated. A special category in youth hobbies will be held for only pre-school and K-3 students.
9. A best of show will be selected by judges in each of the six classes. A \$20.00 award and rosette will be awarded to these winners.
10. All articles are exhibited at owner's risk, but all reasonable precaution will be taken for protection of all exhibits.
11. Building will be closed during judging on Tuesday, Aug. 15th, from 9:00 a.m. to 12 noon to allow judges more time and to eliminate distractions.
12. The Henry County Extension is an advisor to this department and is not responsible for loss, damage or security of items entered.
13. Baked goods should be plated and placed in a zip top plastic bag.

SERVICES ANIMAL HEALTH

SUMMARY: LIVESTOCK HEALTH REQUIREMENTS FOR FAIRS AND EXHIBITIONS

I GENERAL:

- A. All stalls, pens, chutes, etc. located on the grounds of fairs and exhibitions shall be thoroughly cleaned and disinfected with a disinfectant approved by USDA, APHIS between each scheduled fair or exhibition.
- B. All livestock (except poultry and equine) which enter fairs and exhibitions shall be accompanied by an official veterinary health certificate with individual permanent identification. Certificates for this purpose shall be valid for ninety (90) days from date of issue. (Tennessee livestock only – out-of-state certificates are valid for thirty (30) days from the date of issue)
- C. No animal showing clinical signs of infectious or communicable disease shall be allowed to enter or remain on premises of fairs or exhibitions. It shall be the responsibility of the manager of each event to assure prompt removal of such animals.

II LIVESTOCK AND POULTRY ORIGINATING WITHIN THE STATE OF TENNESSEE

[Certificates of Veterinary Inspection Valid for a Period of Ninety (90) Days]

A. SWINE:

All swine which enter fairs and exhibitions shall be accompanied by an official veterinary health certificate with individual permanent identification or sufficient description to identify each animal.

B. CATTLE:

All cattle which enter fairs and exhibitions shall be accompanied by an official veterinary health certificate with individual permanent, official identification.

C. POULTRY:

(1) Sponsors of poultry shows or exhibitions shall notify the Tennessee Department of Agriculture at least **thirty (30) days prior to show or exhibition.**

(2) Poultry found not to be in apparent good health shall be removed immediately from any show or exhibition.

D. HORSES & OTHER EQUIDAE:

Horses and other Equidae six (6) months of age and older must have a negative Equine Infectious Anemia test within the preceding twelve (12) months.

E. SHEEP

(1) All sheep imported into or through Tennessee shall be accompanied by an official health certificate and be in compliance with 0080-2-1-.02, and Title 9, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 79.1 through 79.4.

(2) All sheep that move within the state, with the exception of wethers under the age of 18 months that are produced for slaughter only, including for change of ownership shows, fairs, expositions or slaughter shall be permanently, individually identified by a method approved in Title 9, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 79.1 through 79.4.

F. GOATS

(1) Goats imported into or through Tennessee shall be accompanied by an official health certificate and be in compliance with 0080-2-1-.02, and Title 9, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 79.1 through 79.4.

(2) Goats imported into Tennessee for immediate slaughter to an approved slaughter establishment or to an approved livestock market for sale to a slaughter establishment shall only be required to have a transportation document and be in compliance with Title 9, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 79.1 through 79.4.

(3) All registered breeding goats, goats that have been commingled with sheep, goats for exhibition and dairy goats that move within the state, including for change of ownership, shows, fairs, expositions or slaughter shall be permanently, individually identified by a method approved in Title 9, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 79.1 through 79.4.

G. CAMELIDS: Camelids must have an official veterinary health certificate as provided in Rule 0080-2-3-.01 (1).

H. CAPTIVE CERVIDAE: Captive Cervidae must have an official veterinary health certificate as provided in Rule 0080-2-3-.01 (1).

III LIVESTOCK AND POULTRY ORIGINATING OUTSIDE THE STATE OF TENNESSEE

Livestock and Poultry entering fairs and exhibitions from areas outside the State of Tennessee shall be subject to current Tennessee import requirements. Please contact the state veterinarian's office regarding questions or recent changes to these rules. These interstate requirements are summarized as follows:

A. ALL SPECIES (except poultry):

Official Certificate of Veterinary Inspection valid for thirty (30) days and individual permanent official identification, except for equine. Equine must have sufficient description to identify the animal.

B. CATTLE:

Certificate of Veterinary Inspection and additional requirements as follows:

- (1) Tuberculosis: No requirements except for cattle originating from regions not considered free of tuberculosis.
- (2) Brucellosis: No requirements except for cattle originating from regions not considered free of brucellosis. Test eligible cattle – Intact male or female cattle eighteen (18) months or older. (Vaccinates and non-vaccinates)

C. SWINE:

No testing requirements for swine unless originating from a region not considered free of Brucellosis and Pseudorabies.

D. HORSES AND OTHER EQUINES:

Animals six (6) months of age or older - negative equine infectious anemia (Swamp Fever) test within twelve (12) months.

E. POULTRY:

Originate directly from a Pullorum-Typhoid Clean Flock and an H5/H7 Avian Influenza Clean Flock or be accompanied by evidence of a negative Pullorum-Typhoid test within ninety (90) days and a negative Avian Influenza test within twenty-one (21) days.

F. SHEEP

- (1) All sheep imported into or through Tennessee shall be accompanied by an official health certificate and be in compliance with 0080-2-1-.02, and Title 9, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 79.1 through 79.4.
- (2) All sheep that move within the state, including for change of ownership, shows, fairs, expositions or slaughter shall be permanently, individually identified by a method approved in Title 9, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 79.1 through 79.4.

G. GOATS

- (1) Goats imported into or through Tennessee shall be accompanied by an official health certificate and be in compliance with 0080-2-1-.02, and Title 9, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 79.1 through 79.4.
- (2) Goats imported into Tennessee for immediate slaughter to an approved slaughter establishment or to an approved livestock market for sale to a slaughter establishment shall only be required to have a transportation document and be in compliance with Title 9, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 79.1 through 79.4.
- (3) All registered breeding goats, goats that have been commingled with sheep, goats for exhibition and dairy goats that move within the state, including for change of ownership, shows, fairs, expositions or slaughter shall be permanently, individually identified by a method approved in Title 9, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 79.1 through 79.4.

H. CAMELIDAE: Same requirements as for cattle.

I. CERVIDAE:

Certificate of Veterinary Inspection and additional requirements as follows:

(1) Brucellosis: Same requirements as for cattle.

(2) Tuberculosis:

(a) All cervidae shall originate in herds which have had a negative herd test for tuberculosis within twelve (12) months with a USDA approved single cervical test and individual imported animals shall be negative to the single cervical test within thirty (30) days of entry; or

(b) Animals not originating in tested herds as described above must test negative to two (2) single cervical tests at least ninety (90) days apart, the second test conducted not more than thirty (30) days prior to entry.

NOTE: (Contact an accredited veterinarian for further details of import rules).

IV Fair association or exhibition or management shall inform exhibitors of the rules of this chapter and shall notify the State Veterinarian or his agent of any violations. Exhibitors shall present evidence of compliance with this chapter to the State Veterinarian or his agent upon request.

These rules constitute a minimum legal standard and in no way restrict the right of fair and exhibition managers to establish additional or more stringent requirements.

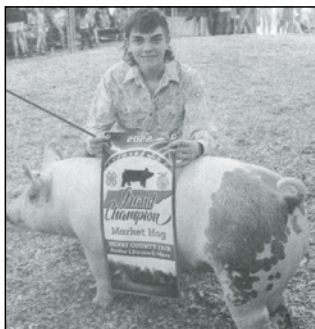

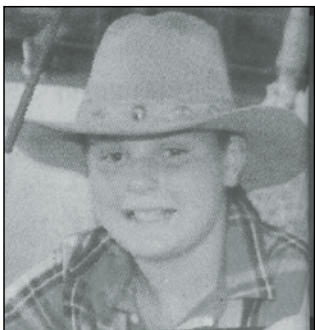

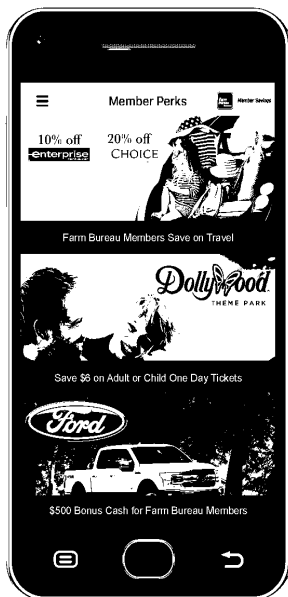

Rules

1. Competition is open to Henry County youth in grades 4-12, who are enrolled in 4-H or FFA. Contact the Henry County Extension Office to register.
2. The steer must be owned by the youth exhibitor and have no horns.
3. Participants and steers must be present at the official weigh-in. Animals will be ear tagged for identification. You may weigh-in one steer. A registration fee of \$50 will be collected at weigh-in. If an exhibitor's steer dies 120 days before the show it may be replaced but can only compete in the show and sale.
4. Participants must be certified for the Tennessee Youth Quality Assurance through the Extension Office.
5. Before the Fair the exhibitor must attend all required meetings.
6. Steers will be accepted on Wednesday afternoon of the Fair between 4:00 p.m. and 7:00 p.m. Exhibitor must provide bedding of either shavings or sawdust. All steers must have an ultrasound done after arrival to show. Steers must be in place, clean and presentable; by 9:00 p.m. Steers will be weighed on Thursday morning. Steer must weigh a minimum of 1050 pounds on show day to participate.
7. Unruly animals will be disqualified by the show chairperson.
8. For Jr. Livestock competition animals are to be groomed by the exhibitor with assistance from family members or guardian, extension agent, Ag teachers, 4-H or FFA members (local or former) and volunteer leaders.
9. Grooming of steer must be done in the barn or in immediate area surrounding the barn.
10. Classes will be determined by weight. The exhibitor must show and sell their steer. Any steer not shown will not be sold. Animals will sell in order of their placing, alternating from each class.
11. Show Awards: Class Winner, Grand and Reserve Champions, and Henry County Bred & Born Grand and Reserve Champions.
12. Dress for the show and sale is professional attire. Boots, shirts with collars, and nice jeans are appropriate. NO t-shirts, sandals, overalls, ball caps, etc.
13. Showmanship class will be immediately following the completion of the show.
14. Exhibitor responsibility: a) to have their picture taken, get the picture after the fair, and deliver it to their buyer b) delivery of their steer to appropriate location.
15. The exhibitor is required to complete a record book to show and sell their steer. The record books should reflect the work and experience of the project. These are now electronic. You will be required to submit (by email) a partial record book to your chairperson by July 31. The completed record book will be due to the Extension Office the Monday following the fair.
16. Discourteous conduct by exhibitor, parents or other persons representing the exhibitor towards the judge, show management, or other exhibitor could result in disqualification.
17. Any disputes arising during any event of the Fair will be decided by the event Chairperson affected and the executive committee of the Fair Board.

*** A mandatory workshop for beginning steer exhibitors (years 1 & 2) will be held after weigh-in.***
