What an incredible blessing to see God work!

Our stay was short-lived though, as we were off towards the end of the month to Summersville, West Virginia, where last year we started helping with the foundation of a new fellowship hall. The good people here at Emmanuel Baptist have been working diligently to finish the foundation walls and are now ready for us to help install the plumbing. We will likely be here for the next month, maybe a month and a half. There's just so much to do and so little time to get it done.
