
PRESENTATION AND CENSING OF THE ALTAR

And we offer our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving to you, O Lord of all; presenting to you, from your creation, this bread and this wine.





COMMUNION OF THE PEOPLE

All baptized Christians of any age and tradition are invited to receive Holy Communion, and no one who comes to the altar with outstretched hands will be turned away. To receive a blessing instead of the sacrament cross your arms over your chest.

Intinction (dipping) is best reserved for the sick and the very young. To receive via intinction allow the minister to dip the bread into the wine and place it in your hands. Please do not dip the bread into the wine yourself.

AT THE ALTAR RAIL - you are welcome to stand or kneel. You may either drink from the chalice or let the minister intinct (dip) the bread into the wine for you.

AT THE FLOOR STATION - the bread is gluten-free. You may drink from the cup or let the minister intinct (dip) the bread into the wine for you.

If you need the sacrament brought to you, please let an usher know.
