FIFTH SUNDAY OF EASTER

Dear community,

On this Sixth Sunday of Easter, the Word of God reminds us that Jesus does not leave us alone. Even more, He promises us the companionship of the Holy Spirit.

In this Sunday's Gospel (John 14:15-21), Jesus, in His dialogue with the disciples, promises that He will ask the Father to give us another Advocate, so that He may remain with us forever, as a response to the love we show Him by keeping His commandments. The Holy Spirit will not abandon us, nor leave us orphaned.

Today, we need to listen carefully to these words and promises. Without a doubt, many times we feel loneliness, weariness, and discouragement. At times we think that God is far away. Or that He does not hear our prayers. Or that our struggles are too heavy. But Jesus, with sincere love, tells us:

"I will not leave you orphaned." He remains with us. He walks by our side. He dwells in our hearts. Today He reminds us that loving Christ means living the way He lived: forgiving without limits, serving with humility, being patient with everyone, helping those in need, seeking the truth, and building peace in the family and in the community. In other words, loving God through concrete and constant actions.

In the first reading (Acts 8:5-8, 14-17), we see how the disciples laid hands upon the new believers so that they might receive the Holy Spirit. The early Church understood that the strength needed to live the Gospel does not depend only on human effort, but comes from God. That is why the Lord teaches us so clearly: "Without Me you can do nothing." Trying to solve everything on our own exposes us to discouragement, frustration, and failure. We need the strength of the Holy Spirit. We need Him to enlighten us, to guide us along the journey, and to console us in the midst of difficulties.

In the second reading (1 Peter 3:15-18), Saint Peter reminds us that Christians must bear witness even in the midst of suffering, always being "ready to give a reason for their hope." The Lord does not want sad Christians, filled with hatred or resentment, but disciples who, even in the midst of trials, continue trusting in God.

Dear brothers and sisters, Christ lives and remains with us. We are not alone.

The Holy Spirit continues to act in the Church and in our hearts.

6TO DOMINGO DE PASCUA

Querida comunidad,

En este sexto domingo de Pascua, la Palabra de Dios nos recuerda que Jesús no nos deja solos. Mas aun, nos promete la compañía también, del Espíritu Santo. En el Evangelio de este Domingo (Juan 14, 15-21), Jesús en este diálogo con sus discípulos, nos promete que pedirá al Padre que nos dé otro Paráclito, para que esté siempre con nosotros, como respuesta al amor que le profesemos, cumpliendo sus mandamientos. Que el Espíritu Santo, no nos abandonará, ni nos dejará huérfanos. Hoy, necesitamos saber escuchar estas palabras y promesas. Sin dudarlo, muchas veces sentimos soledad, cansancio, desánimo.

A veces pensamos que Dios está lejos. O que no escucha nuestras oraciones.

O que nuestras luchas son demasiado pesadas. Pero Jesús con amor sincero, nos dice: "no los dejaré desamparados".

Él permanece con nosotros. Camina a nuestro lado. Habita en nuestro corazón.

Hoy nos recuerda que, amar a Cristo significa vivir de la manera como Él vivió: perdonando sin límites, sirviendo con humildad, siendo paciente con todos, ayudando al necesitado, buscando la verdad, construyendo la paz en la familia y en la comunidad. Es decir, amar a Dios con obras concretas y constantes.

En la primera lectura, (Hech. 8, 5-8. 14-17), vemos cómo los discípulos imponían las manos sobre los nuevos creyentes para que recibieran el Espíritu Santo. La Iglesia naciente comprendió, por tanto, que la fuerza para vivir el Evangelio no depende solamente del esfuerzo humano, que ella viene de Dios. Por eso la enseñanza insigne del Señor: "sin mi nada pueden hacer" pretender resolverlo todo por nuestra cuenta, es exponernos al desanimo, la frustración, al fracaso.

Necesitamos de la fortaleza del Espíritu Santo. Necesitamos que Él nos ilumine, nos guíe, mientras vamos de camino, nos consuele en medio de las dificultades.

La segunda lectura (1Pd. 3, 15-18), san Pedro, nos recuerda que el cristiano debe dar testimonio incluso en medio del sufrimiento. "dispuestos a dar razón de su esperanza". No se quieren cristianos tristes, llenos de odio o resentimiento, sino discípulos que, aun en medio de las pruebas, siguen confiando en Dios. Querida hermanos, Cristo vive y permanece con nosotros. No estamos solos.

El Espíritu Santo sigue actuando en la Iglesia y en nuestros corazones.

VIRTUS

Through the Office of Child and Youth Protection Service, the Diocese of Charleston requires a mandatory educational programming (“Safe Environment Training”) and resources to create and maintain safe environments, along with training on methods of preventing, recognizing, responding to, and the reporting of sexual misconduct or abuse of minors or vulnerable adults. The Safe Environment program includes but is not limited to the following components:

Prevention education for adults and minors
Review of the **Policy Code of Conduct and Ministerial Standards**. Increasing awareness of and ensuring and enforcing compliance with the **Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People**. Creating awareness of and compliance with the **Code of Conduct** at all levels of the diocese

Maintenance at the local level of necessary documentation verifying that all church personnel serving in a parish, school, or other diocesan agency have participated in safe environment training, have been background screened for suitability and are currently approved to have regular access to children and/or vulnerable adults. Education on how to report allegations

The laws and policies regarding the reporting of the abuse of minors

El programa de Entornos Seguros incluye, entre otros, los siguientes componentes: Educación preventiva para adultos y menores. Revisión del Código de Conducta y de las Normas Ministeriales. Fomento de la concienciación, así como la garantía y el cumplimiento de la Carta para la Protección de Niños y Jóvenes. Fomento de la concienciación y el cumplimiento del Código de Conducta en todos los niveles de la diócesis. Mantenimiento, a nivel local, de la documentación necesaria que verifique que todo el personal eclesial que presta servicio en una parroquia, escuela u otra agencia diocesana ha participado en la capacitación sobre entornos seguros, ha sido sometido a una verificación de antecedentes para determinar su idoneidad y cuenta actualmente con la aprobación para tener acceso regular a niños y/o adultos vulnerables. Educación sobre cómo denunciar acusaciones.
