Durand-Hedden House is an historic house museum that explores our community's fascinating past through local history, architecture, social history, historic foodways, music, reenactments, exhibits and to spotlight the "treasures" in our own backyards. Owned by the Township of Maplewood and managed by a non-profit association, the 1790 structure sits on 2 acres of land acquired by Ebenezer Hedden before 1740 and was owned by Henry Durand, brother of artist Asher Brown Durand, from 1812-1866. The Maplewood Garden Club maintains an extensive and educational herb garden. The Durand-Hedden House opens its doors one Sunday each month, September to June, to share the heritage and development of Maplewood and the surrounding area. Admission to events is free unless otherwise noted; Membership in the Durand-Hedden House & Garden Association is \$18 for seniors. Please consider joining as a volunteer or docent.

Under Adult Learning Program, the Senior Citizen Tuition Waiver Program serves individuals who are at least 65 years of age, are New Jersey residents and possess a high school degree or its equivalent. The program allows students to enroll at Montclair State University on a space-available basis with costs that include only administrative and student fees.

The Senior Citizen Audit Program was created by the Rutgers University Board of Governors to permit retired New Jersey residents, age 62 or older, to attend courses on a space-available, noncredit basis. There are no tuition costs for auditing courses. Only courses offered during the spring and fall semesters are open to auditors. Online courses and courses offered during other terms are not included. Eligibility

Requirements:

- Must be a NJ resident and provide proof of residency.
- Must be 62 years or older prior to the last day of the semester in which you are interested in auditing.

Seton Hall offers the opportunity for adults age 65+ to audit classes. Students who register to audit a course are expected to attend class regularly but are not obligated to take tests or complete any other course requirements. Classes not available for auditing include: any full/closed course, or classes in computer and computer-based courses, art and design, applied music, photography, graphics, honors courses, studio courses, physical education courses, museum professions courses, writing courses, independent study and research courses, science labs, off-campus courses, online courses and ESL classes.

For senior citizens who take courses, fees are \$100 per course for non-credit, \$500 per credit if you would like to receive credit. Registration must be done in person and with proof of age.

The Shakespeare Theatre of New Jersey is the state's largest professional theatre company dedicated to the presentation of Shakespeare's canon and other classic dramatic entertainments. The main performance space is the F.M. Kirby Shakespeare Theatre at Drew University. It is fully accessible with two entrances to the building. The Theatre's Outdoor Stage is located on the campus of the College of Saint Elizabeth in nearby Florham Park (at the Convent Station train stop). The grass-and-stone amphitheatre accommodates approximately 500 audience members. Seating is general admission; the amphitheater opens 30 minutes before the performance. The large lawn surrounding the amphitheater is open for picnicking before each show. Audience members may bring their own food and beverages, or purchase snacks and soft drinks on-site. Patrons are encouraged to bring low-backed beach chairs into the amphitheater.
