Nehemiah 1:1-11 (AMPC)

## What Do YOU Care?

1. THE WORDS or story of Nehemiah son of Hacaliah: Now in the month of Chislev in the twentieth year [of the Persian king], as I was in the castle of Shushan,

2. Hanani, one of my kinsmen, came with certain men from Judah, and I asked them about the surviving Jews who had escaped exile, and about Jerusalem.

3. And they said to me, The remnant there in the province who escaped exile are in great trouble and reproach; the wall of Jerusalem is broken down, and its [fortified] gates are destroyed by fire. 4. When I heard this, I sat down and wept and mourned for days and fasted and prayed [constantly] before the God of heaven,

5. And I said, O Lord God of heaven, the great and terrible God, Who keeps covenant, loving-kindness, and mercy for those who love Him and keep His commandments, 6. Let Your ear now be attentive and Your eyes open to listen to the prayer of Your servant which I pray before You day and night for the Israelites, Your servants, confessing the sins of the Israelites which we have sinned against You.

- 6. Yes, I and my father's house have sinned.
- 7. We have acted very corruptly against You and have not kept the commandments, statutes, and ordinances which You commanded Your servant Moses. [Deut. 6:1-9.]

8. Remember [earnestly] what You commanded Your servant Moses: If you transgress and are unfaithful, I will scatter you abroad among the nations; [Lev. 26:33.]

9. But if you return to Me and keep My commandments and do them, though your outcasts were in the farthest part of the heavens [the expanse of outer space],

- 9. yet will I gather them from there and will bring them to the place in which I have chosen to set My Name. [Deut. 30:1-5.]
- 10. Now these are Your servants and Your people, whom You have redeemed by Your great power and by Your strong hand.

#### Nehemiah 1:1-11

11.0 Lord, let Your ear be attentive to the prayer of Your servant and the prayer of Your servants who delight to revere and fear Your name (Your nature and attributes); and prosper, I pray You, Your servant this day and grant him mercy in the sight of this man. For I was cupbearer to the king. The increasingly vitriolic nature of public discourse can lead to the dehumanization of those with differing viewpoints, making it more difficult to extend empathy and care beyond one's own ideological tribe.

This "us versus them" mentality can stifle the generalized compassion necessary for a thriving civil society. The role of social media in this dynamic is complex and contested. While it can be a powerful tool for organizing mutual aid and fostering a sense of community around shared interests or identities,

...it can also amplify division and create echo chambers that reinforce biases and limit exposure to different perspectives. The curated and often idealized presentations of life online can also lead to social comparison and a diminished sense of authentic connection.

#### What He Heard

- 3. Then came the word of the Lord by
- Haggai the prophet, saying,

19. Then the disciples came to Jesus and asked privately, Why could we not drive it out?
