- **Credits:** Minimum 24 (English, Spanish, History, Math – 4 each; Science – 3 + Lab; Electives – 2; PE, Health, Liberal Arts – 1 each).
 - **Community Service:** 20 hours annually (Grades 7–11) and 40 hours in Grade 12 (total 100 hours).
