Friends,

This month we will be observing not only the changing of leaves and World Communion Sunday on October 5th, but also we will dedicate the month to reflect upon James Harnish's book Earn. Save. Give. Perhaps you've heard that "the love of money is the root of all evil." It comes from 1 Timothy 6:10, which says "For the love of money is a root of all kinds of evils. It is through this craving that some have wandered away from the faith and pierced themselves with many pangs." It's not the money itself that is evil, but it is our love for it. Jim Harnish's book, Earn. Save. Give., is based upon practical advice given in John Wesley's sermon "The Use of Money," in which he teaches "Having, First, gained all you can, and, Secondly, saved all you can, Then 'give all you can."



These are John Wesley's three simple rules for managing money and how our love for it impacts not only our individual spiritual lives but the wellbeing of the community around us. John Wesley was deeply engaged with various social justice issues during his time and, like Jesus, held a particular commitment to those who were poor.

John Wesley believed that how we use our money serves as a witness to how we live out our Christian faith, not only as a church but also as individuals. To reignite our Wesleyan and Christ-centered understanding of money and financial stewardship, each week in October we will focus on the following themes from Harnish's book, gleaned from the Holy Scriptures, and you are welcome to pick up a book to follow along each week. You can find Earn.Save.Give on most sites such as Amazon, or Cokesbury in both physical and e-book copies.
