Friends,

I hope you will join me, Pastor Colston, and Pastor Candido at our 11am Combined service on June 8th! Not only will it be Pentecost Sunday (the birthday of the church!) and Graduation Sunday, but it will also be Confirmation Sunday when our youth will be professing their faith in Jesus Christ and becoming members of our church. I hope you will plan to be there in prayer and support of our young people!



I am also writing to share news that our worship schedule will be slightly different in the month of June. Since we will be coming to-

gether for a Combined service on Sunday June 8th, we will have a REGULAR SCHED-ULE on Sunday June 29th (no combined service). An additional change to our schedule: we will be having a hymnsing service during the 9am Traditional service on Sunday June 22nd and there will be NO 10:45am Contemporary service that day. If you usually attend the 10:45am service, please plan to attend our 9am Traditional, 11am African, or 2pm Latino services instead!

Later this month, I will be attending the Western North Carolina UMC Annual Conference at Lake Junaluska. Our lay delegates are: Abraham Karva, Liliana Molina, and Jennifer Stribling. A piece of legislation regarding Regionalization will be discussed and voted on at this session of Annual Conference. Regionalization means that instead of "Jurisdictional" (US only) and "Central" (everyone else) conferences, everyone will become Regional conferences. At this present time what is agreed upon at General Conference is applied in the US, whereas Central Conferences have the option to adapt contextually. If approved, Regionalization will allow for all United Methodist conferences to adapt the Book of Discipline to their local contexts. Lastly, we understand that not all of our participants in worship have checks to write their tithes and offerings and would rather give to the church by card.
