The Chronicles of Narnia: The Lion, the Witch and the Wardrobe

This summer, we invite your family to journey together through *The Lion, the Witch, and the Wardrobe*. As you read, you'll encounter a story filled with adventure, courage, and hope—one that also points us toward deeper truths about God's love and faithfulness.

Read at your own pace and use these simple prompts to help your family talk, reflect, and grow together. Whether it's at bedtime, around the dinner table, or on the go, these questions are designed to spark meaningful conversation for all ages.

Week 1: Entering Narnia

Chapters 1–4

Verse of the Week:

“When I am afraid, I put my trust in you.” – Psalm 56:3

- What would you feel if you stepped into a place like Narnia?
 - Have you ever been somewhere new or different?
 - Where do you see God when you feel unsure or afraid?

Week 2: The White Witch & Choices

Chapters 5–8

Verse of the Week:

“Choose what is right and good.” – Isaiah 1:17

- What choices did Edmund make? Were they good or bad?
 - Have you ever made a choice you wish you could change?
 - How can we ask God to help us make better choices?

Week 3: Meeting Aslan

Chapters 9–12

Verse of the Week:

“The Lord your God is with you... He will quiet you with his love.” – Zephaniah 3:17

- What kind of character is Aslan? How does he make people feel?
 - Who helps you feel safe and loved?
 - What do you think it means that God loves us like that?

Week 4: Sacrifice & Love

Chapters 13–15

Verse of the Week:

“This is love: not that we loved God, but that he loved us.” – 1 John 4:10

- Why was Aslan willing to help Edmund?
 - What does it mean to love someone even when it’s hard?
 - How does God show love to us?

Week 5: New Life & Hope

Chapters 16–17

Verse of the Week:

“See, I am making everything new!” – Revelation 21:5

- What changed in Narnia at the end of the story?
- When have you seen something change for the better?
- What does hope mean to you?
