Money Matters: Building a Money Management Blueprint

How should I begin building my Money Management Blueprint

Start with a budget

If you're not sure how to budget, start by choosing a system that you'll stick with.

The 50/30/20 budget plan, which allocates 50% of your income for needs (Groceries.

Housing. Basic utilities. Transportation. Insurance. Minimum loan payments. Childcare)

, 30% for wants (Typical wants include dinners out, gifts, travel and entertainment). and 20% for savings (something put away for the unexpected, the future and pay off debt) and debt repayment is a good place to start. If the 50/30/20 rules don't work for you, there are plenty of other types of budgets to choose from.

Track your spending

By tracking expenses, you can see exactly where your money is going. It may inspire you to stop spending so much in a certain category or adjust your spending habits so they better align with your goals.

Find ways to save

As you pay more attention to your finances, you'll likely find opportunities to save just by tweaking daily habits (how often you eat out, buy coffee and snacks on the go, etc.), to negotiating bills, to making long-term changes.

Ideally, over time, saving money will become part of your lifestyle. As you start saving money with coupons, freebies and DIY hacks.

Use designated accounts for spending and savings

One way to make money management easier is to keep money designated for bills and budgeted expenses separate from your emergency fund. This will reduce the temptation to dip into it for non-emergencies. Saving for a house, vacation or new car? Stash those funds in separate accounts so you can see progress toward each goal.

Make a plan to pay off debt

A strategic approach to debt repayment will help you reach the debt-free finish line faster. We recommend tackling your most expensive debt — the accounts with the highest interest rates — first, while making minimum payments on the rest. Then, work your way down through any lower-interest rate debt until it is all paid off. Consider using windfalls, such as a tax refund or bonus at work, to make a dent in balances.

Develop good credit habits

Your credit can determine whether you're able to get loans and the rates you pay on them, as well as many other aspects of your financial life. A credit check may be part of getting a cell phone plan, apartment or car insurance.

To stay on top of your score, focus on the two biggest factors that influence it: payment history and credit utilization (how much of your credit limits you're using). Aim to pay everything on time, because just one missed payment can hurt your score, and use less than 30% of your credit limits on each card and overall.

Invest in your financial future

Set money aside now, in a 401(k) or IRA, and let compound interest work its magic. The ultimate goal is long-term financial freedom and stability.


Be persistent

Despite good intentions, many people fall off the financial bandwagon. Sticking to a budget that's too restrictive can be suffocating. Navigating investment jargon can be confusing. But don't get discouraged.

You didn't get in the financial position you're in overnight, and you won't get out of it overnight, either. Give yourself time to learn and grow. With hard work and dedication, you can manage your money with confidence.
