From the Executive Director:



As I complete my first year as Executive Director, I reflect on this year of transition and transformation.

For the first time in our history, we maintained activity at multiple construction sites. We are proud to have completed and sold 808 Jerusalem Road in Cohasset in FY25, with the second unit (810) ready for sale just a couple months later. In Easton, we continue to watch the walls rise at 26 Pocquanticut Ave. and eagerly await its completion in spring 2026.

In addition to new construction, South Shore Habitat continues to explore new avenues towards addressing housing needs. Our Critical Home Repair program provides services to qualified seniors and veterans, keeping them safely in their homes. In Abington, we also purchased 871 Plymouth Street, a rehab that will be completed next spring - our first rehab property in many years!

Efforts at community outreach continue with public engagements, networking, and we welcome ever-increasing numbers of volunteers. There is something for everyone at South Shore Habitat. Whether you want to swing a hammer at a construction site, serve on a committee, or help with community events, we welcome you and your contributions.

At South Shore Habitat, we don't just build homes, we build community. Thank you for your support.

Here's how:

Homebuilding & Rehab Program

South Shore Habitat builds or rehabs energy efficient, affordable homes with volunteer labor and donations of money and materials. We sell the homes to our family partners well below the market value with affordable mortgages. Homeowners put in up to 250 hours of sweat equity by building homes, or volunteering in the community, and attending financial classes.

Critical Home Repair

South Shore Habitat's Critical Home Repair program combines repairs and modifications for low to moderate income seniors and veterans, giving them the opportunity to remain safely and securely in their homes while creating an environment where they can maintain a healthy lifestyle and live independently.


