Dear St Luke's families,

This half term, classroom and school routines have been embedded, and children have become more familiar with *The St Luke's Way* and what this means for them this year. It has been a joy to pop into classes and see children who are focused and engaged, attending to the teacher and persevering with their learning. And perseverance – our school value this half term – has been evident not just in children's attitude to learning, but across the school, with no-one demonstrating this value more than the members of Meadow House (green). Whilst children across the school have embraced the value, just a few weeks ago, Meadow's stack of House Points was distinctly smaller than the other Houses! However, with motivation and excellent modelling from their House Captains, Agnes and Connie, and with support from other Year 6 pupils, the House has worked hard to demonstrate their perseverance, thoughtfulness and care for one another. The points were counted up on Thursday, and whilst it was close across all four Houses, **Meadow House** were crowned the winners for this half term. **Well done, Meadow!** School Council have been working on a list of rewards for half termly winners, and Meadow House will receive their reward next half term. We'll keep a note of the points though and add them up across the year, as well as finding half termly winners.

Keep an eye out for our School Councillors and House Captains who received their badges a few weeks ago – they have been wearing them with pride (and so far, none of them have been lost or been through the washing machine!). We have been so impressed with how well children have taken to their new leadership roles, especially the role of 'Y6 Buddy'. Whilst this role doesn't come with a shiny badge, it is no less important! This half term, Molly, Anna, Serena, Shehara, Leyla and Amelie have dedicated their own time to ensuring our Reception children not only know *The St Luke's Way*, but have been shown excellent examples of 'how we do things' at St Luke's. Their care, support and thoughtfulness towards our youngest pupils has enabled them to settle and quickly become part of our St Luke's family. Having walked with them to the church, it was lovely to see our Y6 pupils sitting alongside Reception children at our recent Harvest Service, where they modelled the expected behaviour and supported the children to engage in the service.

- If your account is in arrears, you will not be able to pre-book a lunch, and will need to provide your child with a packed lunch. If you currently have a debt on your account, please ensure this is cleared before **Monday 3rd November**.




Tuesday afternoon – gymnastics focus

Attendance and absence

At St Luke's, we want **all** pupils to achieve their very best, and the first step to achieving this is to be in school. We recently wrote to the parents of children whose attendance was at 90% or below – classed as 'persistently absent'. After half term, we will follow up on these letters, and also make contact with those whose attendance is at 95%.

Headline Figures (31/08/2025 - 25/10/2025)



8% of this half term has been lost to absence – 3 of the available 37 teaching days. Whilst some children will have had fewer days off, some have already missed much more than 3 days. **Attainment declines as absence increases** – those who miss school regularly are likely to fall behind in lessons, which can ultimately lead to long-term underachievement.

Attendance is, and will continue to be, a big focus for us this year, but we need your support with this. Wherever possible, we ask that medical appointments are booked outside of school hours, and if you are not sure about whether your child is well enough to be in school, consult the NHS website [Is my child too ill for school?](https://www.nhs.uk/conditions/is-my-child-too-ill-for-school/). If you are concerned about other possible barriers to school attendance, please speak with us. Let's work together to ensure the very best for our children.
