• St. Thomas Aquinas As the patron saint of students, universities, and scholars, St. Thomas is sought for guidance in learning, understanding complex subjects, and combining faith with reason. - St. Elizabeth Ann Seton As the first American-born saint, St. Elizabeth Ann Seton is the patron saint of Catholic schools. She founded the first free Catholic school for girls in the United States.
- **Blessed Carlo Acutis** (*To be canonized on 7 September*) This modern-day Italian teenager is a patron saint of the internet. A gifted and devout computer programmer, he used his skills to create a website documenting Eucharistic miracles

For encouragement and other purposes--

- St. Philip Neri A sixteenth-century priest and patron of joy, he is a good saint to pray to for keeping a cheerful spirit, a virtue he emphasized as an important part of the spiritual life.
- St. Clare of Assisi A follower of St. Francis of Assisi, she is the patron saint of eye disease and also television. You can pray for her intercession for clarity of vision, both literally and figuratively.
- St. Dymphna She is the patron saint of the mentally ill and those suffering from emotional distress. You can pray for her intercession for help with study-related anxiety and for general emotional well-being.
