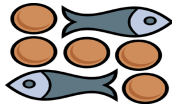

A Message from the Green Bay Diocese Office of Communications

Shortly after we learned of the tornado,
Bishop Ricken called us to respond in
faith and service, saying: *“Let us place
our hearts and hands at the service of
one another in this difficult time ... let us
walk together with Christ who is our
comfort and hope.”*



The **Catholic Charities** team has answered Bishop Ricken’s call and is
leading the diocesan relief effort. At this time, the focus is on
mobilizing resources to assist those impacted with short-term housing
and to meet their immediate, everyday needs. The process of
assessing property damage and estimating repair costs is underway,
but our immediate priority is caring for individuals and families
affected by the disaster.

On Thursday, **the diocese launched a dedicated webpage** where
people can learn how to volunteer, donate, and support the relief
effort. We will also roll out a coordinated communications campaign
– including a special edition of the On Mission e-newsletter and social
media posts. The communications will encourage our fellow
Catholics to pray, volunteer, and donate.

Catholic Charities of the Diocese of Green Bay is leading our relief
efforts and providing immediate help to individuals and families af-
fected by the tornado by addressing short-term housing and essential
needs.

Those who express a desire to contribute to rebuilding damaged
buildings should be encouraged to wait until a full damage assessment
has been completed and financial needs have been determined.

the Rock Church.

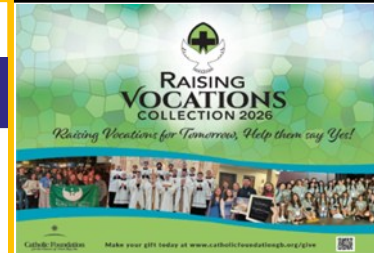

VOLUNTEER COORDINATION, FOOD, AND WATER DROP UP UPDATE

Volunteer Fox Cities has created a sign-up page for community members interested in helping with storm response and re-
covery efforts. At this time, volunteers are being placed on standby while response needs are identified. Please do not report
directly to damaged areas unless you have been assigned through an organized volunteer effort.

Anyone with a food truck, prepared food, or drinking water who would like to support the response should report to the
north parking lot of the former UW–Oshkosh Fox Cities campus.

All bottled water, emergency supplies, and other donations should be dropped off at the campus entrance next to the Barlow
Planetarium. Portable restrooms and handwashing stations are being set up at the site.

Traffic Route

- Use the Highway 441 Oneida Street exit, then:
- Travel south on Oneida Street
- Turn west onto Midway Road
- Enter the campus donation area
- Return east on Midway Road
- Travel north on Oneida Street to return to Highway 441
- Please follow posted signs and staff directions.
