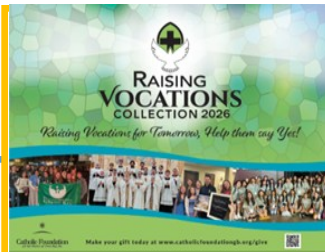

you!

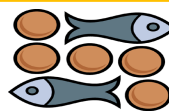

Parish Picnic 2026 and Car Show update:

You may bring them that Sunday. Are you crafty and would like to make something for the Silent Auction, Bucket Raffle or Live Auction? There is room in the basement of the church to bring your items early so we have an idea of what we all have. There are sheets to fill out when you bring them to the church so we know who, what, & value of the item that is left in the basement.

The Core Vision committee met on Wednesday and here is the update on the planning of our picnic and the first Car Show.

Set up tables for silent auction and bucket raffle and carry the baskets and items up from the basement, contact Lori Mack or Carol Weyenberg. Clean up after the picnic is needed also. This is our first show so lets work together to enjoy the cars and meet the owners. They have interesting stories on their cars.

August 30—We sill start selling the tickets for the “Meat/Ham Raffle” after Mass, and every Sunday in September until the day of the picnic. 10 hams, with 2 Gift cards from Charlie’s Market in Shawano, plus a 13th draw.

This is the start , every week we will let you know more. Remember to sell tickets and let people know!!

Next meeting is September 02— Schedule of events will be determined. Remember we are having a car show and it’s the first one and we don’t know what to expect.

A Message from the Green Bay Diocese Office of Communications

Shortly after we learned of the tornado, Bishop Ricken called us to respond in faith and service, saying: *“Let us place our hearts and hands at the service of one another in this difficult time ... let us walk together with Christ who is our comfort and hope.”*

The **Catholic Charities** team has answered Bishop Ricken’s call and is leading the diocesan relief effort. At this time, the focus is on mobilizing resources to assist those impacted with short-term housing and to meet their immediate, everyday needs. The process of assessing property damage and estimating repair costs is underway, but our immediate priority is caring for individuals and families affected by the disaster.

The diocese has launched a dedicated webpage where people can learn how to volunteer, donate, and support the relief effort. We will also roll out a coordinated communications campaign – including a special edition of the On Mission e-newsletter and social media posts. The communications will encourage our fellow Catholics to pray, volunteer, and donate.

Catholic Charities of the Diocese of Green Bay is leading our relief efforts and providing immediate help to individuals and families affected by the tornado by addressing short-term housing and essential personal needs.

Those who express a desire to contribute to rebuilding damaged buildings should be encouraged to wait until a full damage assessment has been completed and financial needs have been determined. Please direct those in need of assistance to Catholic Charities at 920-272-8234.
