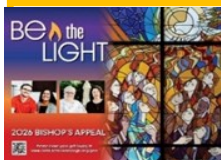

This year the position of Secretary Trustee is up for election/re-election. Below is the “official” description of the position from the diocesan document “Parish Trustee Instructions.” If anyone is interested in running for the position, or if you would like to nominate someone for the position (*after talking with the person first*), please fill out one of the nomination forms and place it in the box. The forms and box are located on the countertop at the west entrance of the church.

We are also accepting nominations for the Parish Council and Finance Council.

Please consider helping your parish by nominating yourself or someone else for one of these important positions. Thank you and God bless you.

Secretary Trustee

The secretary works with the Pastor/Administrator/Pastoral Leader to oversee corporate, non-financial record-keeping at the parish, such as corporate minutes from the Annual Meeting as well as other documents, notices and correspondence.

All parish records are to be kept in an easily accessible and orderly fashion at the parish in a locked fire-proof safe or cabinet. The secretary trustee is a full member of the parish Pastoral Council and receives minutes from the Finance Council.

Responsibilities of Secretary Trustee:

1. Serves as a full member of the parish Pastoral Council and receives Finance Council minutes
2. Assists the Pastor/Administrator/Pastoral Leader in taking and keeping minutes of all meetings of the corporate board of directors; and is responsible for the corporate book of minutes, i.e., annual meeting
3. Attends to corporate notices and correspondence
4. With the Pastoral Council and Finance Council, assists the Pastor/Administrator/Pastoral Leader to ensure that proxy documents are recorded and filed. Ensures that all corporate reports as prescribed by federal, state, local and diocesan authorities are prepared and filed. (Section X, Federal, State and Local i.e.: W-2, 941, Gambling permits)
5. With the Pastoral Council assists the Pastor/Administrator/Pastoral Leader in the development of parish policies and strategies to address the needs and mission of the parish.

Thoughts on Father's Day

Here is an excerpt from an article titled: *“Embrace Your Role as a Father: A Biblical Call to Action,”* written by Bob Bunn, updated: 23 March 2026, and found on the “Manhood Journey” website: *manhoodjourney.org*:

Fatherhood is the starting line for a race that will take you to any number of mountain tops and through any number of valleys. And at every step along the way, your son or daughter will need you. The call to embrace your role as a father is not seasonal—it's lifelong.

Fatherhood Through Every Season

From your own life experiences, you know that our existence on this planet includes seasons. Some writers compare them to actual seasons: winter, spring, summer, and fall. Others classify them by life stage: childhood, adolescence, and adulthood.

For Children, Be a Protector and Provider

For many younger children, dad is the hero of the family. He provides security and protection. He offers stability and makes things safe. Without that protection and provision, children will feel unsettled—and they will look for it elsewhere. The scriptural model is for a good father to embrace the role of protector and provider for those living under his roof.

For Teens and Young Adults, Be an Example

As kids grow older, they move toward a different season. While provision and protection are still important, teenagers and young adults are starting to think about making their own way in the world. That's when they need a consistent example of a good father to follow...

Now that doesn't mean that they have to do everything the way you did it. Leave some room for grace and individuality. Let them become the people God created. But live a consistent life that points them to the perfect heavenly Father and shows them what it's like to make godly choices every chance they get.

For Adults, Be an Advisor

I've been through the first two stages, and I'm now living in this third season of fatherhood. All three of my kids are grown and married. They are starting families of their own. I provided and protected as best as I could, and I sought to give them an example that made their transition to “adulthood” a little easier.

Now, I'm the advisor. I'm the guy they call when they have a question or a problem about something they've never faced before. I'm a sounding board. I get to hear their dreams and their desires—without judgment. And I get to share what God has taught me over the years.

One Role That Never Changes

So, embracing the role of a godly father will look different over time. Things change, and that's OK. You just need to remember that in every season, one thing remains consistent. You will always be the primary spiritual mentor for your children.

To truly embrace your role as a father, you must lead spiritually. No matter what stage or season you're sharing with your children, you never grow out of the responsibility to teach them God's ways. Of course, this means you have to keep learning more about Him each day. You need to nurture your relationship with God and seek the wisdom of His Spirit in your life.

And, as you lean into your own relationship with your heavenly Father, you'll know how to continue mentoring your children. You'll be choosing, day after day, to embrace your role as a father in a way that honors God and builds a generational legacy.
