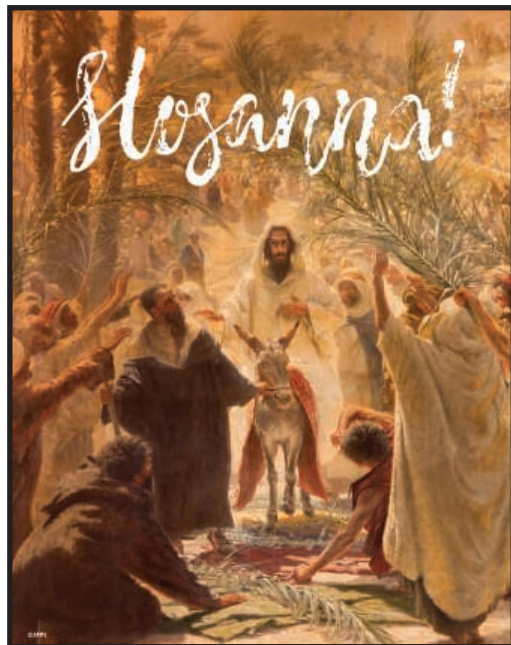

Pastor's Reflection

Palm Sunday

"Lift up, O gates, your lintels; reach up, you ancient portals, that the King of Glory may come in."
(Psalm 24:9)

Holy Week begins with Jesus riding on a colt, with crowds of ordinary people shouting "Hosanna!" It will culminate with the Risen Christ riding on clouds of majesty with the heavenly hosts crying "Alleluia!"

But the rest of Holy Week the journey from Jerusalem to Golgotha, and the Garden, and the Glory of God, the journey from Palm Sunday to Good Friday will be on foot. Jesus will walk the way of the Cross, like the poor do.

Jesus walks from village to village, and down our city blocks, and as he walks, he meets the poor. He meets the beggars, the blind, the sick, those who mourn, those who have lost hope, those who have lost the way.

Jesus is deeply connected to the earth on which he walks, and to the poor whom he companions. The poor who walk on the roads and through the deserts and rough places of this world call us to humility--derived from the Latin word "humus," which means earth or soil. We have to remain close to the soil, to the earth. It is the humble, the lowly, who will inherit that earth.

To walk with the poor, and with Jesus who walks with them allows us to recognize our own poverty, our own deep inner brokenness, our own fatigue, powerlessness, mortality, despair. There we are connected with the earth; there we are truly humble. There we enter into solidarity with all who walk the earth and so discover that each one is loved as a very fragile, precious person.

Before Jesus entered not his Passion, "when he knew that he had come from God and was returning to God," before he served a meal, and became a meal, he took a towel and began to wash his disciples' feet." (John 13:5)

The Word Became Flesh, so as to wash our tired feet.

He touches each of us precisely where we touch the soil, where earth connects with our bodies that reach out to heaven. Jesus, son of God, lord of all the cosmos, kneels and takes our feet in his hands, and washes them. Then he looks up at each of us.

And as his eyes meet ours, he says to each of us, "Do you understand what I have done for you? If I, your Lord and Master, have washed your feet, you must wash your brothers' and sisters' feet." (John 13:13-14)

As we walk the long, painful journey toward the Cross with Christ, not just this Holy Week but every day, we must pause on the way to let Jesus wash us, and then to wash our neighbors' feet.

And amazingly, as we kneel before the brother, the sister and wash their feet, and look into their eyes, we discover that it is because of our brother, Jesus, and each brother, each sister, who walks with us, that we can make the journey at all.

Please join us for all the Holy Week celebrations; both the great liturgies of Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Easter Vigil, and also night prayer on Thursday, at the conclusion of the repose of the Blessed Sacrament (about 9 p.m.), 9:00 a.m. morning prayer on Good Friday and Holy Saturday, and night prayer on Friday at 8:00 p.m. The full schedule, including times for the Sacrament of Reconciliation, is posted elsewhere in the bulletin, in the email blast and on our website.

10 Saints who can bring us close to the Eucharist.



One would guess that most saints would have a devotion to the Eucharist, but there are 10 saints to learn more about and ask to intercede for us during the National Eucharistic Revival.

(Second) Blessed Juliana of Mount Cornillon After her parents died, Juliana was brought up in an Augustinian monastery at Mount Cornillon, Belgium. She joined the community, which ran a hospital for leprosy patients. Elected prioress about 1225, she made known earlier visions in which Jesus told her he desired a special feast for the Blessed Sacrament. This became her mission, despite opposition; even some of her nuns doubted her and accused her of misusing funds. She was forced to leave her monastery in 1246 and died a hermit. Her work led to the feast of the Body and Blood of Christ, also known as Corpus Christi.

Feast day: April 5

Spending moments in silence before during and after Mass

It happens every Sunday. Parishioners scurry into their pews moments before Mass begins. A few sneak in during the opening song or even the first reading, hoping that no one will notice. After Communion, the pews are noticeably emptier than they were only minutes before. Several members of the congregation have slipped out the door to hurry off to their next activity. Many others bolt to their cars after the final blessing.



Taking a few minutes for silent prayer before, during and after Mass can help us focus our attention, prepare our hearts for worship, express our gratitude, and carry our experience of God back into our daily lives.

Remember that Jesus is truly present — body, blood, soul, and divinity — in the Eucharist. Recollect that this Eucharistic Jesus will come in a highly intimate way to each and every person who receives Him in holy Communion during the next hour. Pope Paul VI once called the Mass “the most perfect form of prayer.” Indeed, during holy Mass, God deepens and broadens His intimacy with His people as He speaks His Word to their hearts and nourishes their souls with the Eucharist. Is it not fitting, then, that Catholics should prepare carefully and thoroughly for this tremendous encounter with God? And is it not fitting that Catholics should express their gratitude for such an encounter? By spending time with God in prayer during those critical moments before, during and after Mass, Catholics will better appreciate the great gift of this most perfect prayer and, more importantly, grow ever closer to the Giver.

Wait for the LORD; be strong and take heart and wait for the LORD.

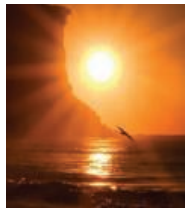
