Pastor's Reflection

Last week we noted that our procession to the altar to receive Eucharist is a witness to, a manifestation of, the pilgrim Church. When we move in procession, particularly the procession to receive the Body and Blood of Christ in Communion, we are a sign, a symbol of that pilgrim Church "on the way" to our heavenly home and the eternal Supper of the Lamb. Ponder that for a moment! "Going to communion" isn't just a stroll up to place an order at a fast-food counter.

This action by Christ's body, the Church assembled for the Eucharist, is manifested and supported by the Communion Chant, a hymn in praise of Christ sung by the united voices of those who believe in him and share his life. **The General Instruction of the Roman Missal** takes this hymn very seriously, mandating that it should begin at the Communion of the priest and extend until the last person has received Communion.

For some, however, the singing of this hymn is perceived as an intrusion on their own prayer, their private thanksgiving after Communion. In fact, however, **this hymn is prayer**, the corporate thanksgiving prayer of the members of Christ's Body, united with one another.

Over and over again the prayers of the liturgy and the norms of the *General Instruction* emphasize this fundamental concept of the unity of the baptized, stressing that **when we come together to participate in the Eucharistic celebration we come, not as individuals, but as united members of Christ's Body.**

In each Eucharistic Prayer we ask God send his Holy Spirit to make us one body, one spirit in Christ; the faithful "are to form one body, whether in hearing the Word of God, or in taking part in the prayers and in the singing..." (*General Instruction* no. 96). One of the purposes of the opening song of the Mass as to "foster the unity of those who have been gathered" (no. 47), and says of the Communion Chant that "its purpose [is] to express the spiritual union of the communicants by means of the unity of their voices, to show gladness of heart, and to bring out more clearly the 'communitarian' character of the procession to receive the Eucharist" (no. 86).

It is difficult for some of us to embrace this emphasis on Mass as the action of a community rather than an individual act of my own faith and piety, but it is important that we make every effort to do so. Christ himself at the Last Supper pleaded with his Father: "Holy Father, keep them in your name that you have given me, so that they may be one just as we are... as you, Father, are in me and I in you, that they also may be in us..." (John 17:11, 21). Baptism has joined us to Christ and to one another as the vine and its branches. The life of Christ, the Holy Spirit, animates each of us individually, and all of us corporately and guides us together in our efforts to become one in Christ.

Next week: a final consideration on the communion procession, and our gestures in receiving Eucharist.

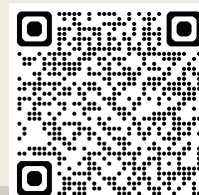


This weekend kicks off the 2026 Annual Bishop's Appeal

Pope Francis has designated this **Third Sunday of Ordinary Time as the Sunday of the Word of God** “to appreciate the inexhaustible riches contained in that constant dialogue between the Lord and his people.” The proximity of this weekend to the Octave of Christian Unity (January 18 to 25) and the annual International Holocaust Remembrance Day (January 27) encourages us to strengthen our bonds with those with whom we share Sacred Scripture, our brothers and sisters of Judaism and those of other Christian communions.

The Word of God is not simply an external utterance nor does it convey merely intellectual content. God’s Word expresses God creative work: God said, ‘Let there be light, and there was light!’ Those who hear and proclaim God’s Word undergo a dynamic encounter with the creating, redeeming and sanctifying Holy One.

Jesus announces God’s Word “with authority” so completely that the Church comes to understand him as the Word of God Become Flesh, “pitching his tent in our midst.” The Church’s proclamation of His Gospel renders Him present in our midst, continuing God’s work of creating, redeeming and sanctifying His Covenant People.

Even after the separation of the Church from the Synagogue, the Church continued to use the Hebrew Scriptures, especially the psalms and the prophets, for personal and liturgical prayer. St. Jerome, the Church’s first great biblical scholar, declared that “ignorance of Scripture is ignorance of Christ.”

The theological disputes of the Reformation polarized Protestants against Catholics along the lines of “Scripture alone” as the source of the word of God, versus sacramental theology and magisterial tradition. Vatican II ecumenical Council (1962-65) recovered the Church’s deeper understanding of the word of God as God’s self-disclosure, fully revealed in Jesus the Christ. Its Dogmatic Constitution Dei Verbum invited Catholics into rediscovering our scriptural heritage and its importance for the life of the Church. The best proclamation of the word of God is found in liturgy, and thus a new emphasis since the Second Vatican Council on the ministries of lectors and preachers.

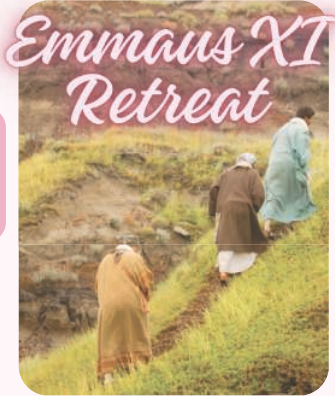
Once the form is submitted, you will hear from one of our bereavement ministers regarding the next steps.

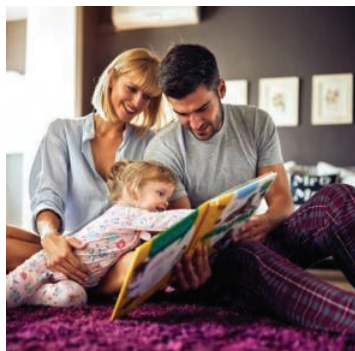

Literature can help parents teach their children about God's presence and the way God reveals Himself in the world.

Look for interactive books that include activities, questions, and prayers designed to help children notice God's presence, listen for His gentle call in everyday moments, and reflect on how they can share God's love with others.

Each of us has unique God-given gifts that we are called to share with others. Here are some tips for helping your children find and follow God's plan for their lives, and in doing, achieve true success:



1. With our young, tell them that God has a plan for their lives, & pray with them that they will discover this plan & live it.
2. Nurture a love for & knowledge of Sacred Scripture. Applying God's revelation in Scripture to our own personal circumstances can be one starting point for discerning His will in our lives.
3. Help your children stay connected with the Christian community (parish family events, religious education, youth groups), so there will be other people in their lives who will encourage & point the way to God's plan.
4. Invest in talents & interests shown by your child. Make sure he or she has the resources to bring a talent to its full potential. But be careful about pushing too far.
5. While you are nurturing your child's interest in a particular area, be sure to encourage them to engage in other activities & explore new things as well.
6. Brainstorm with your children about ways to use their talents & interests to "give back" to others. Talents are meant to be shared. Where there is strength, there is also an opportunity for giving.

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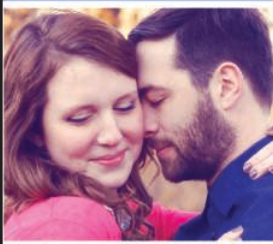
