Pastor's Reflection

This is the third in my series of "what I've learned" as a man, a Jesuit and a priest. It will conclude next week with my reflections on what I've learned from being a pastor.

Perhaps the greatest gift I receive from ordained ministry is that I get a front-row seat to watch how the Lord deals directly with His people, individually and personally. To explain that, I need to give a bit of "theological context." Bear with me.

At each Eucharist, the priest says of the consecrated bread and wine, "Mystery of faith" and our acclamation asserts our faith in the Sacrament. "Mystery" can be a misleading word, suggesting that the Eucharist is somehow enigmatic and arcane. But "mystery" in the New Testament refers to the hidden presence of God and Christ, especially in the Sacrament and in the Scriptures, but also in our daily lives. And from that word arise the English words "mysticism," "mystical," and "mystic" which underscore our potential for both mediated and immediate experiences of the Divine. In our Catholic tradition, mysticism is not reserved for an elite. Each of us is by nature mystical, that is, experientially related to the holy, loving Mystery Who is God. Karl Rahner, SJ, noted that there is at the heart of every human being's existence, what he called the "transcendental existential." Lest we stumble over technical terms, let me translate that: in our very existence, we are turned toward, oriented toward, the Transcendent. We are "open outwards" toward the Divine. We are hard-wired for communion with God. We are Hearers of the Word, tuned to God who forever is speaking His words and finally His Word Made Flesh.

This inbuilt capacity for transcendence, for mystical union with God, gets expressed by: resilient hope in the face of death; radical fidelity to one's moral commitments even when one can be dismissed by others as hopelessly naïve or foolish; active forgiveness and the offer of reconciliation, even without the expectation of reciprocity; faithful service and loving self-sacrifice; unreserved agapeic love for another; awe and wonder at the beauty and power of the cosmos. In all these ways, we can live in mystical union with God in our daily lives.

And I've been allowed to witness all that in the lives of those to whom I've ministered for almost half a century. And here's my real point: I most experience the power and grace of ministry, not in preaching or presiding at the Eucharist (as wonderful a gift as that is) as in the Sacraments of Reconciliation and Anointing of the Sick. When I lay hands on someone facing surgery or enduring physical pain, or I pronounce absolution on someone seeking God's mercy, and I see fear subside, burdens lifted, peace enfold the sick or the sinner, I know that I have just witnessed the healing and liberating presence of Christ at work in that person.

It wasn't some brilliant insight of mine, some soothing word of assurance springing from my repertoire of pious phrasings, that brought about that healing and liberation. It was Christ Himself dealing directly with the person, just as really as He healed lepers, cast out evil spirits, pronounced forgiveness and reconciliation on fearful disciples.

St Ignatius says it is the prerogative of God the Creator alone "to enter the soul, depart from it and cause movements in the soul, bringing it all into love of his Divine Majesty." God can move the individual directly, drawing the person toward love of the Divine Majesty, with a unique and privileged access to the person and able directly to infuse the person with love, peace and consolation, independent of external factors or intermediate causes.

That's the miracle I've witnessed countless times over forty-five years, and each time it's a miracle evoking wonder and awe and gratitude.

The Church celebrates September as **Care of Creation month**, from September 1 to October 3, the Feast of St. Francis.

On the tenth anniversary of the establishment of this month of prayer, which coincided with the publication of Pope Francis' Encyclical *Laudato Si* we find ourselves celebrating the present Jubilee as "Pilgrims of Hope."

Pope Leo cites "evidence in various parts of the world that our earth is being ravaged. On all sides injustice, violations of international law and the rights of peoples, grave inequalities and the greed that fuels them are spawning deforestation, pollution and loss of biodiversity. Extreme natural phenomena caused by climate changes provoked by human activity are growing in intensity and frequency, to say nothing of the medium and long-term effects of the human and ecological devastation being wrought by armed conflicts....When justice and peace are trampled underfoot, those who are most hurt are the poor, the marginalized and the excluded."

He prays for a new outpouring of the Spirit of God to "caress" the earth and bring to new life seeds of hope and new beginnings.

The pope urges us to follow words with deeds. "Living our vocation to be protectors of God's handiwork is essential to a life of virtue; it is not an optional or a secondary aspect of our Christian experience."

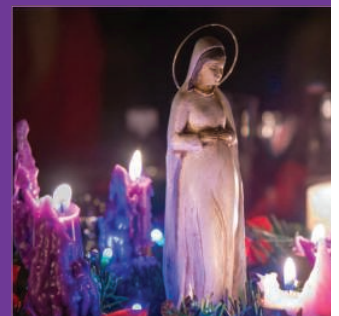

ETIQUETTES FOR ATTENDING HOLY MASS

PREPARATION AND ARRIVAL



Arrive Early
Allow time for prayer and reflection before Mass begins.



Dress Modestly
Choose appropriate attire that reflects the sacredness of the occasion.



Fasting
Catholics are typically required to fast from food and drink (except water) for one hour before receiving Holy Communion.



Silence
Maintain silence in church to allow for prayer and reflection.



Turn off Devices
Ensure all electronic devices are silenced or turned off to avoid distractions.

DURING MASS



Sign of the Cross
Bless yourself with holy water upon entering and leaving the church.



Genuflect
Before sitting in your pew, genuflect (knee) briefly towards the Eucharist (if reserved).



Participate
Engage actively by singing, responding, and praying with the community.



Respectful Silence
Refrain from talking, chewing gum, or engaging in any disruptive behavior.



Receive Holy Communion with Reverence
If receiving, approach with a bow and consume the host immediately.



Do Not Leave Early
Stay until the Mass concludes with the final blessing and recessional.

SPECIFIC POINTS



Holy Water
Bless yourself with holy water upon entering and leaving the church as a reminder of your faith.



Tabernacle
Genuflect towards tabernacle before sitting and after leaving your pew.



Eucharistic Prayer
Maintain silence and reverence.

AFTER MASS



Consider staying
for a few minutes of quiet prayer and thanksgiving after Mass.



Recessional
Remain in your pew until the priest and ministers have processed out.
