Pastor's Reflection

This is the fourth installment in my series of "what I've learned" as a man, a Jesuit, a priest; this week, what I've learned in ten years as a pastor.

My facetious answer would be that I learned *far more than I ever wanted to*, about GAAP, HVAC, P & Z commissions, ERC's, W-2 and W-4 forms, HR manuals, service contracts, sump pumps, and connectivity issues. I didn't study theology or get ordained to manage checking accounts, buildings and property.

But if I don't attend to those mundane items, then I would not be exercising good stewardship of the resources entrusted to the parish. Those resources are gifts from God and from God's people, to support our mission of proclaiming the Good News of the Kingdom. So, I need to keep an eye on pipes that leak, insects that nest in the rectory walls, gutters that overflow, drains that back up, copy machines and printers that run dry, and bank statements that need to balance.

But managing property is not pastoring people.

A parish community, at its best, creates a sacred space where God illumines and weaves together the stories of each person's life into the great history of God's saving us from self-destruction. Though the experiences of human living may be common to all—grief, gladness, love and loss, sin and forgiveness, suffering, fear, guilt and gratitude, awe and wonder---each one's story is particular and unique.

When I stand at the altar or the ambo and look at the gathered assembly, I am acutely conscious of the many stories the people before me live. Someone there is grieving a loss, or carrying long-time trauma, or struggling with divorce, guilt, addiction, depression or anxiety, while another is full of gratitude for the grace of healing or forgiveness or unconditional love. Some in the congregation are visiting for the first time, perhaps searching for a spiritual home; others perhaps are desperate to give the Catholic Church one last chance to embrace them.

And in each person, under the surface struggles and successes, beyond boredom or distraction, there is a deep and abiding hunger for God, for encountering God's grace and love. That hunger for God has been planted in our hearts, and echoes God's own deepest desire for our friendship. Our liturgical banquet of Word and Eucharist means to fulfill that hunger, at least a bit, in anticipation of the great and eternal Supper of the Lamb.

My bottom line as pastor is to help folks fall in love with the God who has fallen in love with them. And when we allow the Lord to love us, He fills us with joy. Joy doesn't remove the suffering or heal the scars, but it does begin to re-orient the meaning and value of everything; joy begins to offer new words to explain our life stories. Encountering the Lord doesn't make everything easy, but everything becomes new and real, everything becomes gift.

Alas, some can find Christianity only a burden and a task; their offerings are obligatory, their prayer perfunctory, their faith forced. And far too many fear that God doesn't really like them, never mind love them. Frequently I pray the Lord grant each new eyes to see themselves as God sees them, precious and beloved.

That new perspective can yield at least three additional gifts:

First, our parish mission becomes clearer. We "seek first the Kingdom of God," as the in-breaking of Reign of God into our lives becomes more and more the foundation and touchstone of all the activities we engage in, all the programs we sponsor, all our many ministries in service of that one mission.

Second, each can begin to see that, even amidst trauma and loss, the Lord has always been with them on their individual journey.

Third, together we start to grasp how God is making your story and my story into our story, integral to The Story of God's Salvation.

1 Peter 3:15 says, "Always be ready to give an account for the reason for your hope." The reflections of these past four weeks have been part of my answer. Going forward, I would like to give space for many of you to do the same and share with us why you are Catholic.

Holiness at Home

Silent Homilies. How Little Things Can Make a Big Difference



In families where religion is transmitted successfully, sacred objects are powerful. Statues of saints and the Blessed Mother, candles near photos of deceased members of the family, crucifixes on the wall, pictures of Jesus knocking at the door – all these can serve as silent homilies for children. These types of objects send a sacred message and serve as reminders of God's continued presence in your life and home.

Crucifix - Hanging a crucifix in a central place in your home and each bedroom can serve as a constant reminder that Christ has conquered sin and death for our eternal salvation. The crucifix can encourage children to learn about the significance of the Passion and Resurrection, which can lead to a deeper appreciation for their faith. firstwitnesses.org/silent-homilies/

The Church celebrates September as **Care of Creation month**, from September 1 to October 3, the Feast of St. Francis.

On the tenth anniversary of the establishment of this month of prayer, which coincided with the publication of Pope Francis' Encyclical *Laudato Si* we find ourselves celebrating the present Jubilee as "Pilgrims of Hope."

Pope Leo cites "evidence in various parts of the world that our earth is being ravaged. On all sides injustice, violations of international law and the rights of peoples, grave inequalities and the greed that fuels them are spawning deforestation, pollution and loss of biodiversity. Extreme natural phenomena caused by climate changes provoked by human activity are growing in intensity and frequency, to say nothing of the medium and long-term effects of the human and ecological devastation being wrought by armed conflicts...When justice and peace are trampled underfoot, those who are most hurt are the poor, the marginalized and the excluded."

He prays for a new outpouring of the Spirit of God to "caress" the earth and bring to new life seeds of hope and new beginnings.

The pope urges us to follow words with deeds. "Living our vocation to be protectors of God's handiwork is essential to a life of virtue; it is not an optional or a secondary aspect of our Christian experience."
