

Pastor's Reflection

This past week's celebration of Yom Kippur, the Jewish Day of Atonement and Repentance, stirred in me some reflections on Jesus the Jew. Pope Pius XI, in 1938, declared that "Christians are spiritual Semites." This was more than a condemnation of the persecution of Jews in Nazi Germany. The pope was reminding the Church that salvation history, culminating in Christ, flows from the Abrahamic covenant, and Christians are grafted on to that covenant through the blood of Christ.

In the next few weeks, I will explore a bit of that salvation history: the covenants God makes with us, then the Exodus event as God's redemption of the divine promises and a resealing of Covenant, and some additional considerations of the Jewishness of Jesus. All three of those—Covenant, Exodus and Jesus' Jewishness—are fundamental to our understanding of Eucharist.

This week: **Covenant**

From the first, God has been in relationship and dialogue with humans. God talks with Adam and Eve face to face and walks with them in the "cool of the evening." God commands them to be good stewards of the garden entrusted to them and forbids them to eat of the fruit of the Tree. When they disobey, they are banished from Eden and can no longer see God "face to face." Only death itself will finally end their exile from the Divine Presence.

The Genesis story depicts the mounting evils people do, and God's initial determination to wipe them out and start over; but God relents, saves Noah and his family and a remnant of the creatures, and vows never again to destroy Creation. The sign of that first Covenant is the rainbow in the sky, after the Great Flood.

Genesis continues with the Covenant God makes with Abraham. God calls Abram out of his own land, Ur, and sets him on a journey of faith. God makes two promises to Abram, whom God now calls Abraham ("the father, i.e. God, is exalted, or is great"): God will give him and his elderly wife a son, from whom Abraham and Sarah will have a vast number of descendants; and they will receive their own land on which to dwell. The God makes a solemn Covenant with Abraham and with his descendants.

Ancient Near Eastern religions had a traditional ritual for making and sealing a covenant. When two parties made a solemn compact, they would slaughter animals and offer them in sacrifice to their gods, then the two would split the carcasses in half and walk between the two halves, pledging to be faithful to the terms of the pact and calling upon God to punish them if they were unfaithful to the pact by visiting upon them the same kind of fate that had befallen the sacrificed animals.

God directs Abraham to do the same ritual, but only God, and not Abraham, goes between the slaughtered animals. God binds himself absolutely to the Covenant, but does not bind humans in the same way, as God knows that humans will not be faithful to it. Indeed the rest of the story of Salvation History will be the story of human sin and failure, and the ever-new mercy of God, finding new ways to rescue us and restore us to right relationship with God. The sign of this Covenant between God and Abraham and his descendants is circumcision of the males of the family.

Next week, the Exodus event as God's redemption of his covenantal promises.
